Statistical Profile of Mäori in Tertiary Education and Engagement in e-learning

New Zealand Council for Educational Research



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1. Mäori participation in tertiary education, and elearning

Key points

- Forty-nine percent of all tertiary students now have some degree of web use in their course, but only 37 percent of Mäori students.
- Students in courses which expect significant amounts of web use are mainly in universities, and students with significant amounts of course-integrated web access make up only 17 percent of all tertiary students.
- Overall, Mäori participation in courses where there is a significant degree of web use is very low. Sixty-three percent of Mäori students have no web access in their course.
- The wänanga report no students with a significant amount of web use in their courses, and the polytechnics only 5 percent of their students.
- In wänanga and polytechnics most of the web use in courses is provided for extramural students.
- In order to increase Mäori involvement in e-learning, the main focus would need to be on increasing e-learning in wänanga and polytechnics which are the main providers of tertiary education to Mäori.

Mäori in tertiary education

The discussion which follows covers students in universities, polytechnics, wänanga, private training establishments, colleges of education, and "other tertiary education providers". The information for 2004 comes from our analysis of the data from the August 2004 Single Data Return made available by the Ministry of Education, Tertiary Information Systems and Liaison Group. The Ministry advises that this gives a snapshot at that date rather than a complete picture of tertiary study in 2004. Information for previous years comes from *Profile and trends: New Zealand's tertiary education sector: 02* (Ministry of Education, 2003, pp. 79–83).

Mäori students at tertiary level in 2004 have a typical profile which differs to some extent from non-Mäori students. A Mäori tertiary student is most likely to be female (68 percent), older than most students, enrolled part-time in a wänanga or polytechnic in a course at Levels 1–4 (75

percent) of the National Qualifications Framework. Her course of study is unlikely to have any web access associated with it.

Participation

There has been a significant growth in the number of Mäori students participating in tertiary education over the past decade (*see* Figure 1 below), and Mäori participation rates are higher than non-Mäori as a percentage of the respective populations. In 2002, Mäori made up 13 percent of the population aged 15 and over, but 20 percent of the tertiary education enrolments.

Much of the growth in numbers of Mäori tertiary students is a result of increased participation in the three wänanga. In 2002, Te Wänanga o Aotearoa grew by over 73 percent and the other two wänanga grew by 29 percent. However, wänanga are not catering solely for Mäori students, and the growth is not only in Mäori student numbers. In 2002, 79 percent of students attending wänanga were Mäori. In 2004, the number of Mäori students at wänanga has more than doubled since 2002, but the number of non-Mäori students at wänanga has also increased. The percentage non-Mäori students account for at wänanga has gone from 21 percent in 2002 to 43 percent in 2004.


Age

There is a difference in the age profile for Mäori students compared to non-Mäori students. Whereas Mäori are younger in the general population they are older in the student population and tend to participate in tertiary education at a later age rather than enrolling directly from school. As a percentage of all Mäori tertiary students, Mäori students in the 20–24 year age group make up 19 percent (34 percent for non-Mäori), but in all subsequent age groups the percentage of Mäori is higher than the comparable percentage for non-Mäori. Mäori tertiary students are relatively evenly spread throughout all age groups (up to 45 years and older), whereas non-Mäori have a large bulge in the 21–24-year age group and are relatively evenly spread throughout the remaining age groups (see Appendix 1, Table 16).

Gender

In 2004, women make up 68 percent of the Mäori tertiary student population, and 57 percent of the non-Mäori student population (*see* Appendix 1, Table 14). The proportion of women to men among Mäori students has been steadily increasing.

The proportions of Mäori women to men are particularly high in wänanga (73 to 27 percent), and in colleges of education (79 to 19 percent) (*see* Appendix 1, Table 26).

Types of institution

Over a third of all Mäori in tertiary education (38 percent) are attending one of the three wänanga—more than twice the number of Mäori enrolled in universities (17 percent)—and more than the 28 percent enrolled in polytechnics (*see* Appendix 1, Table 2). The huge increase in numbers attending wänanga suggests that they cater particularly well for the preferences and needs of Mäori students.

Since 2002, the percentage of Mäori students who attend private training establishments has decreased (21 percent to 14 percent) and the percentage attending polytechnics has increased (23 percent to 28 percent). The share of other institution types has remained the same.

Apart from wänanga, the main institutions catering for Mäori students—where Mäori students are a relatively high proportion of the student population—are private training establishments and polytechnics.

Mäori students are underrepresented in universities and colleges of education in relation to their numbers in the general population and the student population.

The most pronounced disparity is between Mäori and non-Mäori attendance at universities and wänanga. While the percentages attending one or other of these two types of tertiary institutions are similar (54 percent of Mäori tertiary students and 58 percent of non-Mäori), non-Mäori are primarily at universities (52 percent) whereas Mäori students are more likely to be at wänanga (37 percent) than universities (18 percent) (*see* Appendix 1, Table 2).

Figure 2 Percentage of Mäori and non-Mäori students within each provider type





Figure 3 Percentage of all Mäori (and non-Mäori) students across provider types



Level of study

In 2002, Mäori were participating at sub-degree (certificate and diploma) level study at twice the rate of non-Mäori.

In 2004, 75 percent of Mäori tertiary students are studying at Levels 1–4 of the National Qualifications Framework. Qualifications at these levels are various certificates, community courses, and single unit standards. Forty-five percent of non-Mäori are studying at this level.

Types of attendance


Sixty percent of Mäori students are studying part-time, and 35 percent of Mäori EFTs are for part-time enrolments. (The comparable figures for non-Mäori are 49 percent and 27 percent.) (*See* Appendix 1, Tables 6 and 7.)

This is of interest because e-learning is one way of providing more flexible learning options for learners who study part-time, or extramurally. However part-time and extramural study for both Mäori and non-Mäori students varies by institution, and the differences between Mäori and non-Mäori part-time enrolments are much less than the differences between types of institution.

University students, both Mäori and non-Mäori, are mostly full-time students (71 percent), whereas polytechnic students are mostly part-time students (65 percent). Mäori wänanga students are mostly part-time (66 percent) and half are extramural, but the non-Mäori students (who make up 43 percent of wänanga enrolments) are nearly all part-time (86 percent) and 65 percent are extramural (*see* Appendix 1, Tables 24, 25, 28 and 29).

Figure 4 below shows the proportions of Mäori and non-Mäori students attending various types of tertiary education providers full- or part-time.

For both extramural and part-time study those most likely to be in these categories are Mäori women, followed (in order) by Mäori men, non-Mäori women, and non-Mäori men. The difference is quite large from one extreme to the other. Forty-two percent of Mäori women are extramural students and 17 percent of non-Mäori men are extramural students. Sixty-two percent of Mäori women are part-time students and 47 percent of non-Mäori men are part-time students (*see* Appendix 1, Tables 32–35).

The picture for Mäori women in tertiary education (who make up 68 percent of Mäori students) is that a relatively small percentage of them are young Mäori women (24 years or under) studying

full-time (15 percent of all Mäori women students) and intramurally (19 percent). Mäori women are much more likely to study at older ages and 37 percent of them study part-time between the ages of 25 and 44.

e-learning in tertiary institutions

Tertiary education organisations provide enrolment information to the Ministry of Education as part of the Single Data Return (SDR). In April 2004, items were added to the SDR in order to collect information on e-learning. Institutions now identify whether courses:

- 1. have **no access** for e-learning ("...no part of the course or paper is accessible online"),
- 2. are web-supported ("...a paper or course provides students access to limited online materials and resources. Access is **optional**, as online participation is likely to be a minor component of study"),
- 3. are web-enhanced ("...expects students to access online materials and resources. Access is **expected**, as online participation is likely to make a major contribution to study"), or
- 4. are web-based ("requires students to access the accompanying online materials and resources. Access is **required**, as online participation is **required**"). ¹






Figure 6 Percentage of students with each level of web access across provider types

Universities are the main providers of tertiary education where web access is at level 3 or 4 and thus integrated into course work and requirements. Universities account for 40 percent of all students, but 86 percent of students who are studying with web access at level 3 or 4 are in universities. However, only 17 percent of all tertiary students are enrolled in courses with web access at this level (*see* Figures 5 and 6, Appendix 1, Tables 18 and 30). There is clearly a long way to go before it is the norm for tertiary study to integrate web use into the learning which takes place. The discussion that follows should be read with this in mind.

Figure 5 Percentage of students with each level of web access within provided types

SDR data show that a little over half (51 percent) of all students in standard tertiary education courses are in courses where no part of the course is made available online. Nearly a third (32 percent) have optional web components, 13 percent of students are in courses where some web access is required, and 4 percent are studying courses where web use is a major, and required, aspect of the course. (*See* Appendix 1, Table 12.)

The comparable figures for EFTS (*see* Appendix 1, Table 13) give a clearer indication of the quantity of tertiary learning (rather than individual students) taking place through the various web access categories. Figure 7 shows student and EFTS percentages for the four categories of web access.

Mäori students are considerably more likely than non-Mäori to be in courses where no web access is involved, and are less likely to be in web-enhanced courses where online access is expected of students and makes a major contribution to study. Nearly all students in web-enhanced courses are in universities (89 percent), where Mäori student participation is lower than in other major tertiary providers. However, Mäori student participation in university web-based, and web-enhanced courses is 8 percent of all students and is very close to their overall representation in the university student population (*see* Appendix 1, Table 24).

The comparatively larger difference between Mäori student percentages and Mäori EFTS reflects the fact that Mäori students are more likely to be enrolled in part-time courses (*see* Appendix 1, Tables 6 and 7).

Taken overall, Mäori participation in courses where there is a significant degree of web use (web-based and web-enhanced) is very low. The wänanga report no students with these types of access in their programmes, and the polytechnics only 5 percent over the two categories. Private training establishments account for nearly the same number of Mäori EFTS as universities and the number of students in PTEs in web-based or web-enhanced courses is also extremely low (1 percent) (*see* Appendix 1, Table 24).

In order to increase Mäori involvement in e-learning, the main focus would need to be on increasing e-learning in wänanga and polytechnics, in particular, since these are the main providers of tertiary education to Mäori students.

Attendance

The overwhelming majority of web access provided by polytechnics and wänanga is to extramural students. Thirty-three percent of polytechnic students have web-supported courses (the lowest level of support). However, 80 percent of those involved in this type of course web use are extramural students. In fact, extramural students make up 59 percent of all polytechnic enrolments in courses with web access, although they are only 26 percent of the polytechnic student population. Mäori make up 20 percent of extramural polytechnic students (*see* Appendix 1, Table 28.)

In wänanga, the position is even more marked. Fifty-one percent of Mäori wänanga students are extramural, and they account for 99.9 percent of the web use in courses studied by Mäori students. Similarly, all the non-Mäori students at wänanga (except two students) in courses with web access are extramural students. All of the reported web access is at the lowest level of integration—web-supported (*see* Appendix 1, Table 28).


In other types of institutions there are not marked differences between intramural and extramural students.

In polytechnics and wänanga, part-time students have more web use in their courses than full-time students, but in other institutions there is either little difference or full-time students are in courses with web access (*see* Appendix 1, Table 24).

Level of study

Only 25 percent of Mäori students are studying at or above the level of national diplomas or degrees, compared with 55 percent of non-Mäori students. (See Figure 8.)

Seventy-five percent of Mäori students are therefore studying in various certificate courses, community courses, or individual unit standards. Mäori students studying at Level 5 or above are mainly at universities (60 percent), polytechnics (26 percent), wänanga (6 percent), or colleges of education (5 percent).

Mäori student enrolments in courses at Levels 1–4 make up 64 percent of all Mäori enrolments in courses with web access, and are mainly concentrated in the web-supported category (61 percent of all Mäori student web access).

Mäori student enrolments in courses at Level 5 and above make up 36 percent of all Mäori enrolments in courses with web access, and at these levels of study, the web use is better spread across all types of web use.

Whereas most (76 percent) web-supported Mäori enrolments are at Levels 1–4, most (85 percent) of web-enhanced, and 68 percent of web-based enrolments are at Levels 5–7. In other words Mäori students enrolled in courses with course-integrated web use (web-based and web-enhanced) are mostly studying at Level 5 and above.

Web-based enrolments for Mäori make up 7 percent of Mäori enrolments in courses with web access, and are 68 percent at Levels 5–7 (mostly at universities), and 30 percent at Levels 1–4 (mostly at polytechnics).

Web-enhanced enrolments for Mäori make up 12 percent of Mäori enrolments in courses with web access, and are 85 percent at Levels 5–7 (mostly at universities), 10 percent at Levels 1–4 (mostly at polytechnics, universities, and PTEs), and 5 percent at Level 8 and above (almost entirely at universities).

Web-supported enrolments for Mäori make up 81 percent of Mäori enrolments in courses with web access, and are 23 percent at Levels 5–7 (mostly at universities, and polytechnics), and 76 percent at levels 1–4 (mostly at wänanga and polytechnics). As discussed above, most of the latter category are extramural enrolments (*see* Appendix 1, Table 10).

Age

In nearly all types of institution, students over 45 years have relatively less web access in their courses than younger people. Since Mäori are disproportionately in this age group, this is an important difference for them (*see* Appendix 1, Table 22).

Gender

In most types of institutions there is little or no difference between the course web use for Mäori men and women. (See Figure 9.)

However in polytechnics, where large numbers of Mäori students are enrolled, Mäori women have more web access included in their courses than Mäori men. Forty-eight percent of Mäori women have some web access in their courses—mostly only web-supported access, only 5 percent are in web-enhanced or web-based courses. Only 29 percent of Mäori men have any web access as part of their course (*see* Appendix 1, Table 26). This gender difference is probably related to extramural enrolments since more women are extramural students, and extramural students are more likely to have course web use.

Summary

No web access

Although nearly half of the tertiary students in New Zealand have some degree of web access associated with their courses, only 37 percent of Mäori students have this. In addition the level of integration with courses is very low for most students. Courses which expect significant amounts of

course-integrated web use are mainly in universities, and all such courses account for only 17 percent of all tertiary students.

Mäori students are mainly enrolled in wänanga and polytechnics where most of the web access is provided for extramural students. In addition, in these institutions the level of course-integrated web access is very low.

In order to increase Mäori involvement in e-learning, the main focus would need to be on increasing the quantity and integration of e-learning in wänanga and polytechnics which are the main providers of tertiary education to Mäori.
