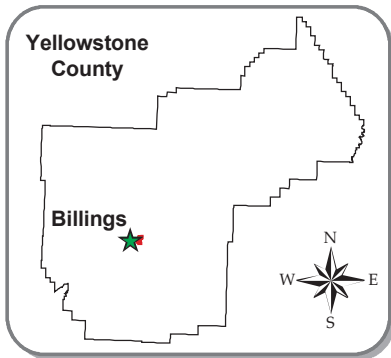
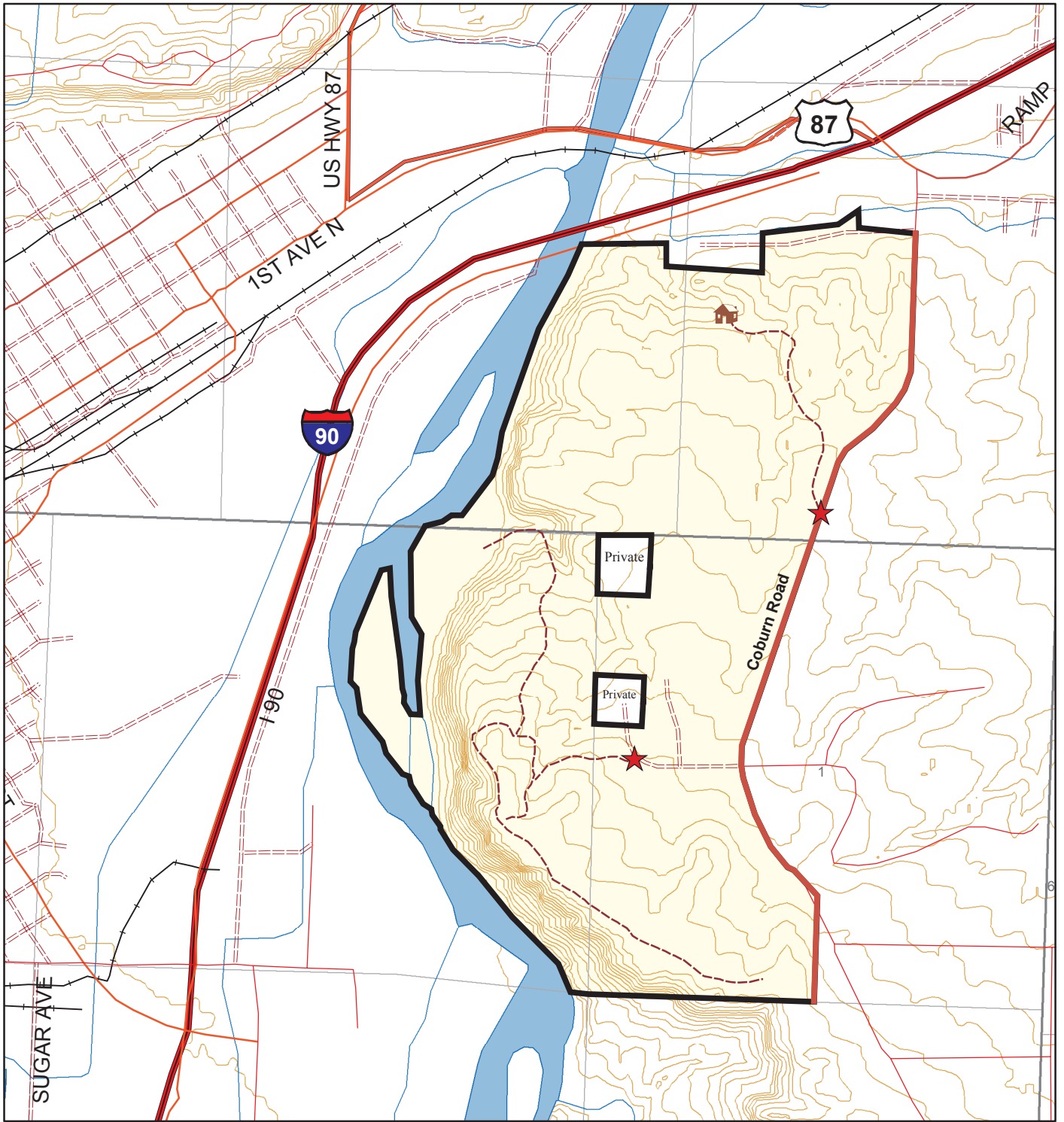


Four Dances Recreation Area

Four Dances Recreation Area

This area was named Four Dances Natural Area after Chief Four Dances, an important religious and military figure in Crow Indian History. The name in the Crow language is *Annishi Shopash*, translated as "Place of Four Dances." The cliff is traditionally recognized as a fasting site used by Four Dances in the 1830s, during the heyday of the Rocky Mountain fur trade and the intertribal plains wars. Four Dances took his name from the vision he received while fasting at this place.

WALK IN AREA ONLY

Open for hiking, picnicking, cross-country skiing, and wildlife viewing.

Dogs must be leashed.

Closed to off highway vehicles and mechanized vehicles, including bicycles.

No horseback riding.

No hang gliding.

No rock climbing.

Discharge of firearms including pellet guns is prohibited.

Fires and firewood cutting are prohibited.

Motorized use for administrative purposes only.
