We are sure that those qualities have been responsible for the fast recovery of Japan and for its development and position reached in the economy of the world.

Nowadays, the Japanese leadership in advanced technology has put the country forward and may be considered an inspiration to other countries.

In other words I must say Brazil is fortunate to have the biggest Japanese colony in the world once Brazilian people have always something to learn from its examples.

The University of São Paulo has organized a scientific and cultural program to celebrate this centenary this year. Thus, Your Highness visit has become a special mark to the history of our Institution besides strengthening the relationship between our countries.

We would like you to be the messenger of our best wishes to the Imperial Family and all the Japanese nation.
