2008 SEASON PREVIEW

BULLS POISED TO MAKE ANOTHER RUN AT A MAC TITLE

Now embarking on his 20th season as head coach of the men's soccer team at the University at Buffalo, John Astudillo has taken the Bulls to the pinnacle of success in the Mid-American Conference. Two times in the past three seasons, the Bulls have faced nationally-ranked Akron in the championship match, forcing extra time against the Zips in both instances. Unfortunately for the Bulls, they came up short both times, including last season's 1-0 overtime loss. With a core of experienced veterans on the pitch and in goal, this could finally be the year that the Bulls claim the MAC crown.

Of the 12 new faces to the UB roster in 2007, seven saw significant playing time, including the club's top two scorers as UB went 10-7-2 with a 3-2 league record. Now seasoned veterans, they should give the team the experience that Astudillo will count on for success.

GOALKEEPER

The Bulls return last season's top goalkeeper in junior **Bobby Shuttleworth (Tonawanda, NY/Nichols)**. Shuttleworth received the bulk of the time in goal last season, seeing action in 12 contests and logging nearly 1,200 minutes. He was 8-2-2 when given the starting nod and logged a 0.94 goals against average. Shuttleworth also compiled four shutouts. Shuttleworth carried a streak of nearly 340 minutes unscored upon during the regular season where he picked up three of his shutouts. He also earned a spot on the MAC's All-Tournament team.

Backing up Shuttleworth are a pair of freshmen from local high schools. **Robert Taylor (East Amherst, NY/Canisius)** earned All-Western New York honors in both 2006 and 2007, culminating his career with a spot on the first team. Also joining the Bulls is **Nick Fetterman (North Tonawanda, NY/North Tonawanda)**, a veteran of several seasons with the Buffalo Premier club program.

DEFENSE

A key element to the Bulls past success has been their defense. Last year, UB allowed one goal or less in 13 of the 19 matches, claiming nine victories. **Dan Gwyther (London, England/Woodcote)**, a second-team All-MAC selection in 2007 and **Dezi Lara (Fyzabad, Trinidad & Tobago/Naparima)**, both seniors head the unit. Offensively, both players can provide a bit of punch as evidenced by Gwyther's one goal and two assists on just four shots and Lara's one goal among three attempts. Gwyther's goal provided the game-winning margin in a 2-1 overtime victory at St. Bonaventure in the middle of a UB run that saw the Bulls undefeated in six straight contests.

Adding depth to the defense will be returnee **Mike Sobolewski (Webster, NY/Webster Thomas)**, who sat out the 2007 season and freshmen **Anthony Lino (Stillwater, NY/LaSalle Institute)**, **Dan Vitu (Saginaw, MI/Heritage)** and **Tom Beckvermit (Highland, NY/Highland)**. Lino, Vitu and Beckvermit each earned scholastic all-league recognition in 2007.

MIDFIELD

Nine midfielders are on the UB roster for 2008 with four starters heading the list. **Alex Marrello (Burnaby, British Columbia/Alpha Secondary)**, in his first season with the Bulls, tied for the team lead with six assists in 2007 while also adding four goals. Marrello netted a pair of game winners with overtime markers against Siena and Bowling Green.

Eric Johnson (Cleveland, OH/West Geauga) started 18 contests in one of the midfield spots, contributing a pair of assists. **Steffen Thoresen (Trondheim, Norway/Kristen Videregaende Tronderlag)** started 15 contests with a goal and an assist. **Mateo Escobar (Liverpool, NY/Liverpool)** moved into the starting lineup

for the MAC Tournament and contributed a pair of assists on the 2007 campaign.

Other returning midfielders include **Martin John (Ottawa, Ontario/Lisgar CI)**, **Justin Fredsell (New Hartford, NY/New Hartford)**, **Jordan Brouk (Pittsford, NY/Pittsford Mendon)** and **Alex Mihal (Syracuse, NY/Bishop Ludden)**. John started three contests, including the MAC Championship match. He had two goals and two assists in 2007 with an overtime game-winner against Cornell in September. Fredsell started three contests and played in 18 matches, with a goal and an assist. Brouk and Mihal saw little action with Brouk hitting the field in nine contests and Mihal playing in six.

Newcomer **Rich Wilson (Ocho Rios, Jamaica/Munro College)** brings impressive credentials after playing for the Jamaican U-20 squad and has scored in international play. Wilson played last season at Cincinnati appearing in six contests for the Bearcats.

FORWARD

The heart of the experienced Bulls lineup will be up front as six veteran forwards give UB its scoring punch. Leading scorer **Dan Bulley (Exeter, England/St. Peter's)** will try to duplicate his first season with the Bulls after collecting eight goals and added three assists. Bulley was named to the All-MAC First Team after

leading the conference with his eight markers and 19 total points. He was also the only player to be selected MAC Player of the Week more than once in 2007.

Other returning starters include **Dominic Oppong (Scarborough, Ontario/Cardinal Newman)** and **Marc Stencel (Cheektowaga, NY/Cheektowaga)**. Oppong tied Marrello for the team assist lead with six and contributed a goal. Stencel started 11 of the 14 contests he appeared in and netted a goal in UB's 3-3 tie at nationally-ranked Saint Louis.

After missing the 2007 season with an elbow injury, **Lee Catchpole (Norwich, England/Bungay)** is healthy and will look to

crack the starting lineup once again. Catchpole, currently ninth on UB's all-time goals scored list, tallied a pair of markers in the 2006 campaign.

Part-time starters **Juha Kaartoluoma (Pirkkala, Finland/Pirkkalan Yhteis-lunkio)** and **Jon Martin (Syracuse, NY/Westhill)** will provide depth up front. Kaartoluoma started nine contests and netted the game-winner against Central Connecticut State while Martin registered an assist in 17 games played, starting three.

Freshman **Lucas Bassan (Carrollton, TX/Hebron)** will be a welcome addition to the squad. Bassan, a native of Brazil, scored 41 goals for his high school team in 2007.

SCHEDULE

The 2008 docket includes eight home contests, highlighted by the season-opener against Bucknell on August 29 and the annual Bulls Classic as UB hosts Horizon League members Wright State and Detroit as well as Canisius. The Bulls also welcome MAC newcomer Florida Atlantic and league stalwarts Western Michigan and Northern Illinois to UB Stadium.

The road contests that will test the Bulls include a final stretch of three matches to conclude the regular season that begins October 18 at Akron with likely hosting duties for the MAC Championships on the line. November MAC contests at Bowling Green and Hartwick end the regular season. Additionally, the Bulls also are part of two more tournaments at Michigan and Penn. In the Michigan Tournament, the Bulls will face the Big Ten's Wolverines and Michigan State Spartans while at Penn the squad will tangle with the Quakers and Temple.

COACHING STAFF



John Astudillo

Head Coach • 20th Season
Buffalo State ('68)

One of the most distinguished and successful coaches in Western New York history, John Astudillo enters his 20th season at the helm of the University at Buffalo men's soccer program.

Since joining the Bulls in 1989, Astudillo, who grew up in Ecuador, has compiled a 164-150-29 record. On September 9, 2001, following a 4-0 victory over Siena, Astudillo passed Sal Esposito to become the all-time leader in career victories. In nine years in the highly-competitive Mid-American Conference, Astudillo has coached UB's first-ever MAC Player of the Year in any sport, 10 first-team all-conference players and 14 second-team all-conference players.

Astudillo's 2007 club turned in a 10-7-2 record and made their second appearance in the MAC Championship match in three seasons, falling to Akron in overtime.

In 2006, Astudillo guided the Bulls to a 10-7-2 mark and a third consecutive trip to the MAC Tournament Semifinals. Under Astudillo's guidance, two members of that team, seniors Sola Abolaji and Andrae Clarke, were drafted by professional soccer leagues following their UB careers.

During the 2005 season, the Bulls completed perhaps one off of the largest two-season turnarounds in Division-I soccer history. Just two seasons after going 1-12-3, UB enjoyed the best season in the program's 33-year history by going 14-3-2, including being the first team in Division-I soccer to win 10 games, going 10-1-0 in its first 11 games. As a result of their early success, the Bulls received their first Division-I national ranking in school history, being named 20th according to the *NSCAA/adidas* rankings. As a third-seed in the MAC Tournament, the Bulls handed loses to both sixth-seeded IPFW and second-seeded Northern Illinois before taking top-seeded and nationally third-ranked Akron into double overtime, falling 7-6 in a final shootout.

In the 2004 season, UB finished 8-8-2, including a 6-0-1 start to the year. The Bulls upset third-seeded Northern Illinois in the MAC Tournament quarterfinals before losing in the semifinals to eventual MAC Champion Akron.

UB combined for a 7-21-4 record during the 2002 and 2003 seasons, bowing out in the MAC Tournament quarterfinals both seasons.

In 2001, for the third time since UB joined the MAC in 1998, Astudillo led the Bulls to a winning record. UB finished 8-7-2 overall and placed fourth in the conference. The Bulls qualified for the MAC Tournament but lost, 1-0, in a triple-overtime heartbreaker to Bowling Green in the quarterfinals.

He guided the Bulls to a 6-10-2 record and a sixth-place finish in the MAC during the 2000 campaign. UB hosted the quarterfinal and semifinal rounds of the MAC Tournament where they upset third-seeded Akron, 2-1, in the quarterfinal round before falling to Bowling Green, 1-0, in the semifinals.

Astudillo's Bulls posted a 10-7-1 overall record in 1999 and finished fifth in the MAC. Steve Butcher, who went on to play professionally for both the Buffalo Blizzard and Rochester Rhinos, received the highest individual honor from the conference as he was

named MAC Player of the Year.

In the Bulls' first year competing in the MAC, 1998, UB finished with a 13-8-0 record under Astudillo. As the sixth seed in the MAC Tournament, Astudillo's team made some noise, defeating third-seeded Northern Illinois, 1-0, in overtime in the first round. In the second round of the tournament, the Bulls took regular-season champion and nationally-ranked Akron into three overtimes before falling, 3-2.

The growth for UB soccer began as soon as Astudillo was named the UB head coach in 1989 and the Bulls were competing at the Division II level. Astudillo was named the New York State Region III Coach of the Year after guiding the Bulls to a 9-9 record in his first season. He proceeded to guide the Bulls to a school-record 14 wins in 1990 and a national ranking as high as ninth. Astudillo was recognized by his peers by receiving the 1990 New York State Coach of the Year award after the Bulls finished with a 14-3-1 record.

In 1991, UB made the jump to the Division I level. In the first year playing at the NCAA's highest level, the Bulls again recorded double-digit wins, finishing with a 10-7-2 record, earning Astudillo the 1991 East Coast Conference Coach of the Year award.

UB began its affiliation with the Mid-Continent Conference in 1994 as Astudillo guided the Bulls to an 11-7-1 overall record, and captured the Mid-Continent East Division crown with a 5-0-1 conference mark. Astudillo was recognized for his squad's outstanding season by receiving both UB's Coach of the Year award and the Mid-Con's Coach of the Year award.

A graduate of Buffalo State College with a master's degree in education, Astudillo played at the college level for coach Fred Hartrick before going on to play semi-pro for the Fort Erie Stokers of the Ontario Provincial League. A holder of an NSCAA Advanced National Coaching Diploma, Astudillo began his coaching career in 1978 by building Williamsville North into one of the premier high school soccer programs in the area. The recipient of two High School Coach of the Year awards, Astudillo coached the Williamsville North boys team to five divisional championships, four sectional titles, and a mark of 82-14-4 during his last five years. Additionally, he led Williamsville North on three occasions to the quarterfinals of the New York State Public High School Athletic Association Tournament.

Astudillo has also demonstrated success as coach of the Empire State Games Western Scholastic team, winning two gold, four silver, and three bronze medals.

A successful coach on all levels, Astudillo has led teams to postseason tournaments at various levels, while also coaching regional, national, and professional players throughout his illustrious coaching career.

COACHING STAFF



David Hesch

Associate Head Coach • 8th Season
St. Bonaventure ('97)

David Hesch is in his eighth season on the Bulls coaching staff. After serving as the program's assistant for four years, Hesch was promoted to associate men's soccer coach in September 2005.

In his role, Hesch is the program's recruiting coordinator as well as the primary assistant to coach Astudillo in the day-to-day operations of the program. In that capacity, he helps oversee the scouting of opponents, assists in all training sessions and is responsible for the video analysis used by the Bulls in their match preparation.

Prior to UB, Hesch was the head coach of Lake Erie College in 2000 where he guided the team to a third-place finish in the National Small College Tournament. Hesch also spent a season as the assistant men's soccer coach at Cazenovia and has coached the Premier Club Syracuse Blitz to four New York State West Championships.

Hesch is involved in the Western New York soccer scene at numerous levels. Since moving to Buffalo, Hesch is the Director of Coaching for Buffalo Blackwatch, a new soccer club in WNY where he oversees all player and coach development and progress. In addition, Hesch is the founder/manager of Raise Your Level LLC - a company set up to develop children of all ages into quality soccer players. This past summer, Hesch guided the Western New York Open Men's Soccer Team to its third straight medal in the Empire State Games.

As a player, Hesch was the 1997 first overall selection in the National Professional Soccer League (NPSL) after attending St. Bonaventure. In 1998, he was a member of the United States Indoor Soccer League (USISL) Delaware Wizards when they

won the Metro Division Championship.

Hesch is a native of Liverpool, NY and graduated from Liverpool High School. He currently lives in Grand Island, NY with his wife, Kate, and daughters, Natalie and Addison. David's brother, Jim Hesch, is the Head Men's Soccer Coach at crosstown rival Canisius College. He holds a USSF "B" Coaching License.

2007 SEASON IN REVIEW

BULLS REACH MAC FINALS FOR SECOND TIME IN THREE SEASONS

After having reached the Mid-American Conference Tournament finals in 2005, the Bulls made it for the second time in three seasons as they faced rival Akron with the league title on the line. And like the 2005 final, the 2007 championship went to extra play. Unfortunately for the Bulls the result remained the same as the Zips gained a 1-0 overtime victory in the 102nd minute to claim the league crown and the MAC's automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament. Three Bulls, Dan Gwyther, Dan Stevens and Bobby Shuttleworth attained All-MAC Tournament honors for their stellar play in the finals and UB's 1-0 semifinal victory against Hartwick, a team that defeated UB in the regular season.

As the season came to a conclusion the Bulls finished with a 10-7-2 record, the same mark as in

the 2006 campaign. Dan Bulley, in his first season with the squad, led UB and the MAC in scoring with eight goals and 19 points. Three newcomers to the program led the UB scoring punch. Alex Marrello was second on the team with four goals and he shared top assist honors with Dominic Oppong with six apiece.

Bobby Shuttleworth and Daniel Bell split duties in goal for the Bulls. Shuttleworth led the team with 12 appearances in net, stopping 48 shots and compiling a 0.94 goals against average and four shutouts. Bell, limited by injuries, played in seven contests and amassed a 1.42 goals against average.



2007 BULLS SET OVERTIME RECORD

The 2007 Bulls established a new school record for overtime matches as a total of eight contests went to extra time. The eight overtime contests obliterated the previous high of five set five times between 1993 and 2004. In 2007, the extended play proved to be a valuable ally for UB as the team went 5-1-2 in overtime contests.

During UB's six-match unbeaten string between September 5 and 21, the team played in four overtime contests, defeating Siena in double overtime in the first round of the UB Fall Classic to begin the string with Alex Marrello breaking a scoreless tie in the 101st minute.

UB picked up consecutive 2-1 overtime wins at St. Bonaventure and at home against Cornell on September 14 and 16. Dan Gwyther netted the game-winner against the Bonnies while Martin John sealed the win against the Big Red.

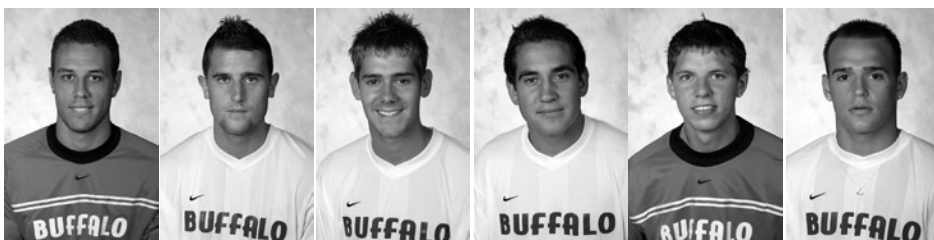
The first of UB's tie finals was in the next match, a 2-2 deadlock at Bucknell. The Bulls and Bison scored all their goals in the second half as Dan Bulley forced the extra session with a marker in the 85th minute.

Going up against nationally-ranked Saint Louis gave the Bulls confidence as they tied the seventh-ranked Billikens, 3-3. UB scored two goals in the final 6:30 of regulation by Marc Stencel and Dan Stevens.

In their final regular-season road contest, Bulley scored his second goal of the match, four minutes into the first overtime as the Bulls downed Northern Illinois, 2-1, on October 20.

The lone blemish of UB's remarkable overtime run came in the championship match of the MAC Tournament. The Bulls and Akron Zips played to a scoreless tie in 2005 before Akron advanced on penalty kicks, 7-6. In 2007, the match was a carbon copy as UB and Akron played to a scoreless draw through 90 minutes and the first overtime period. However, Akron's Anthony Ampaipitakwong netted the clincher in the second extra session closing the book on another stellar season by the Bulls.

The league recognized six Bulls with All-MAC honors. Dan Stevens and Dan Bulley were named to the All-MAC First Team while Daniel Bell, Dan Gwyther and Alex Marrello were named to the second team. In addition, Gwyther, Stevens and Bobby Shuttleworth were named to the MAC All-Tournament team.

Stevens finished 2007 third on the team in points with eight. He was also named the offensive MVP of the 2007 UB Fall Classic. Stevens was also a 2006 All-MAC Second Team selection.

Bulley led the MAC in goals (eight) and points (19) and was twice named Player of the Week, the only player to earn the honor multiple times this season. Bulley ranked in the top 50 nationally in goals per game.

Bell earned All-MAC honors for the second-straight year after being named to the All-MAC First Team in 2006. Bell extended his school-record for career wins with 35 and finished his career with 217 saves, the seventh-best mark in school history.

Gwyther earned second team All-MAC honors for the second-straight season. In 2007, he appeared in 14 matches, making 13 starts with his lone goal an overtime winner at St. Bonaventure. His excellent work in central defense helped the Bulls post the second-fewest number of goals allowed of any team in the MAC.

Marrello tied for the UB lead with six assists while adding four goals, including two overtime game-winners. A transfer from Cincinnati in his first year at UB, Marrello finished the year with 14 points.

Shuttleworth returned from injury to earn All-Tournament honors. The semifinal match against Hartwick was his first appearance in goal in five matches. Shuttleworth finished the season with a .780 save percentage, the best mark in the MAC. He recorded one shutout and made nine saves during the MAC Tournament.

Providing leadership in education and in diversity, the Mid-American Conference moves into its 62nd year of service to the student-athlete.

Since its inception in 1946, the Mid-American Conference has progressively grown and developed into one of the most aggressive Division I conferences in the country. Under the guidance of Commissioner Rick Chryst, the seventh commissioner in the history of the league, the MAC has responded to the ever changing landscape of membership issues and member standards in the fast-paced environment of collegiate athletics.

The league has grown its commitment to championships by expanding to six its number of neutral site post season events – football (Detroit's Ford Field), volleyball (Toledo's SeaGate Centre), men's and women's basketball (Cleveland's Quicken Loans Arena), softball (Akron's Firestone Stadium) and most recently baseball (Chillicothe's VA Memorial Stadium).

MAC football produced three bowl teams in 2007, the giving the MAC 14 bowl berths in the past four years with 10 different league institutions represented during that time. The 2007 season also welcomed the addition of Temple University to the East Division and the Owls responded with a league-leading defense and a 4-4 conference mark in their inaugural MAC season. A total of nine MAC football players were selected in the 2008 NFL draft, making it the second most selectees for the league since the NFL went to seven rounds in 1994.

In its partnership with ESPN, the worldwide leader in sports, an unprecedented 25 football games involving MAC schools will be televised in 2008. That number includes regular season and post season events on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPN Classic and ESPN360. In addition, an eight-game MAC Game of the Week will be syndicated on ESPN Plus and available on over-the-air network affiliates to more than 22 millions homes in the Midwest.

Four Mid-American Conference men's basketball programs went on to postseason play this season as Kent State (NCAA Tournament), Akron (National Invitation Tournament), Miami (College Basketball Invitational) and Ohio (College Basketball Invitational) all made an appearance in postseason tournaments. There were a total of two women's basketball programs that reached the postseason as Miami (NCAA Tournament) and Bowling Green (Women's NIT) represented the MAC in postseason play.

Kent State men's basketball program was ranked in the top 25 in the regular season for the first time in school history. The Golden Flashes were 23rd in the Associated Press poll and 24th in the ESPN/USA Today coaches' poll, both of which were released on February 25th. The Flashes earned their 10th consecutive 20-win season in addition to picking up the 1,000th victory in the 92-year history of the program. The last time the MAC had a team appear in the top 25 during the regular season was in 2001 when Ball State was ranked for four straight weeks (Nov. 26-Dec. 17), with the Cardinals climbing as high as 15th in the AP poll on Dec. 3.

The Golden Flashes also made headlines in men's golf this past season as KSU finished alone in sixth place at the NCAA Championship to earn the highest finish in the program's storied history. MAC wrestlers also continued to shine on the national stage as Central Michigan senior 197-pounder Wynn Michalak finished runner-up at the NCAA Wrestling Championships and the Chippewas finished tied for seventh in the overall team competition.

The conference now has national leadership positions on the following NCAA committees: - Carol Cartwright, interim President, Bowling Green, (Ad Hoc Committee to Review Issues Related to Gender and Ethnicity); Warde Manual, Buffalo (Academic Cabinet); Dell Robinson, MAC (Administrative Cabinet); Tom Collins, Ball State (Amateursim Cabinet); Mack Rhoades, Akron (Championships/Sports Management Cabinet); Brad Bates, Miami (Committee on Academic Performance); Eileen K. Jennings, Central Michigan (Committee on Infractions); Susan Lipnickey, Miami (Infractions Appeals Committee, and Leadership Council); Derrick Gragg, Eastern Michigan (Legislative Council); Stephanie Harvey-Vandenberg, Eastern Michigan (Recruiting Cabinet); Kelly Andrews, Toledo (Student-Athlete Awards, Benefits and Financial Aid Cabinet); Karin Lee, Ball State (Minority Opportunities and Interests); Rick Chryst,

MAC (Playing Rules Oversight Panel); Lee Meserve, Bowling Green (Walter Byers Scholarship Committee).

Furthermore, the MAC has representation on the Division I Sport Committees and related governing groups: - Cathy O'Donnell, Kent State (Field Hockey); Dave Heeke, Central Michigan (Football Issues); Laing Kennedy, Kent State (Men's Basketball); Charlie Coles, Miami (Men's Basketball Issues); Mary Lu Gribschaw, Akron (Men's Soccer); Karin Lee, Ball State (Women's Tennis); Rich Ceronie, Miami (Men's and Women's Track and Field); Anucha Browne-Sanders (Women's Basketball Issues); Greg Christopher, Bowling Green (Women's Basketball); Matt Wolfert, Ball State (Women's Soccer); Derek van der Merwe (Wrestling); Jim Schaus, Ohio (Men's Basketball Rules); Reggie Witherspoon (Men's Basketball Rules); Jerry Reighard, Central Michigan (Women's Gymnastics); Dee Abrahamson, Northern Illinois (Softball Rules Committee).

From Super Bowl quarterback Ben Roethlisberger (Miami University), British Open winner Ben Curtis (Kent State University), World Series winning manager Bob Brenly (Ohio University) and Olympic bobsled team member Brock Kreitzburg (University of Toledo), the Mid-American Conference continues to excel in producing leaders in the world of athletics.

In March of 2006, Chryst and Cleveland Cavaliers President Len Komoroski announced that the Mid-American Conference Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments would remain in Cleveland at Quicken Loans Arena through 2011. The MAC also announced a format change for both tournaments, bringing all 12 men's and women's teams to Cleveland beginning in 2007. The MAC also co-hosted the 2007 Women's Final Four at Quicken Loans Arena, after successfully hosting a 2006 NCAA Women's Basketball Regional at Quicken Loans Arena.

In 2006, Chryst also announced a five-year partnership with ISP Sports, Inc. to oversee and coordinate the league's marketing and sponsorship rights. ISP, which currently manages more than 40 college properties nationwide, is considered the leader in the collegiate sports marketing industry. The MAC was ISP's first conference property.

ISP is responsible for managing and growing the MAC's stable of corporate partners, which currently includes FirstEnergy, Kraft, Marathon Oil, GMAC Financial Services, Gatorade, Automart.com and Sirius Satellite Radio. FirstEnergy has been the title sponsor for the men's basketball tournament since its first year in Cleveland in March 2000, Kraft has been associated with the women's basketball tournament since 2001, and Marathon Oil will be sponsoring the football championship for the fourth time in 2008.

Based in Cleveland since July 1999 following a 15-year stay in Toledo, Ohio, the MAC has established historic measurements in both football and men's and women's basketball since its move to Northeast Ohio.

The Mid-American Conference was founded as a five-school league on February 24, 1946 in Columbus, Ohio with Ohio, Butler, Cincinnati, Wayne State and Western Reserve admitted as charter members. The Mid-American Conference has 12 full-time schools and a 13th, Temple, for football only. Comprising the East Division is the University of Akron (joined in 1992), Bowling Green State University (1952), University at Buffalo (1998), Kent State University (1951), Miami University (1947), Ohio University (1946) and Temple University (2007). The West Division members are Ball State University (1973), Central Michigan University (1971), Eastern Michigan University (1971), Northern Illinois University (1975-86, 1997), University of Toledo (1950) and Western Michigan University (1947).

In 1946 men's basketball was the first competitive sport in the MAC, which now sponsors a total of 23 sports. Women's sports were brought into the conference's structure in 1980.

For men, championships (11) are sponsored in football, basketball, baseball, cross country, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, wrestling, golf and tennis.

For women, championships (12) are sponsored in basketball, softball, volleyball, cross country, field hockey, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, gymnastics, indoor track and field, outdoor track and tennis.

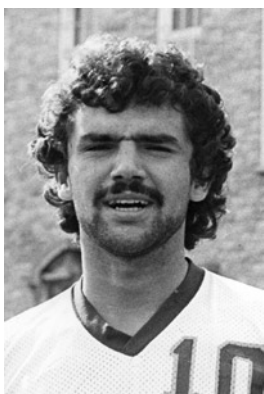

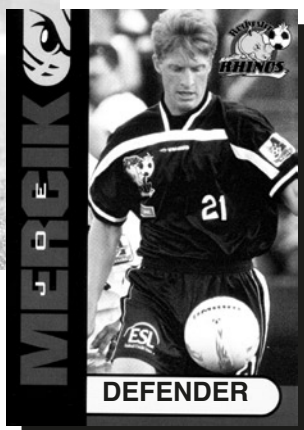
