- Of the 20 counties with the greatest percentage of speakers of Palau, California is home to seven, Washington, three, with two each in Hawaii and Oregon.
- Honolulu County, Hawaii accounts for 16.5
   percent of the speakers of Palau in the United
   States.
- Palau is the 31st most common language spoken in Hawaii and the 71st (tied) most common language spoken in Oregon.
- Palau is the fifth most common language spoken at home in Navarro County, Texas and the seventh most common language in Union County, Ore.
- In the United States, 1 of every 112,366 people age five and older speaks Palau at home. In Hawaii, this figure is 1 in 2,732 people, while in Oregon, 1 in 14,217 residents is a Palau speaker.
- Within the counties, Union County, Ore. has the greatest rate of Palau speakers (1 in every 913 residents), followed by Navarro County, Texas (1 in every 1,187 residents) and Honolulu County, Hawaii (1 in every 2,128 residents).
