West Virginia started the scoring in the first period as Nick Nardacci slipped through the Bulldog line for a 12-yard touchdown run. Gonzaga threatened in the second period, but Mountaineer captain Russ Meredith intercepted an errant Bulldog pass and rambled 80 yards down the sideline for West Virginia's second score. The Mountaineers added another touchdown in the third quarter on a 16-yard pass from Nardacci to Jack Simons.

Gonzaga staged a furious comeback in the last period, scoring twice, thanks to two 50-yard runs by Matt Bross, following pass completions, but the Mountaineer defense held strong to seal bowl victory No. 1.

However, on fourth down, little Davey Isaac playing the final game of his career started to dart around end, fumbled the ball, but scooped it up, eluded three tacklers and raced into the end zone for the touchdown. Quarterback Kelly Moan then booted the ball through the uprights for the point that eventually decided the outcome.

The Red Raiders scored shortly before halftime, but failed to tie the game when the extra point was blocked. 16-of-26 passes for 195 yards and three touchdowns for the Yellow Jackets.

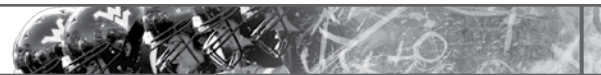

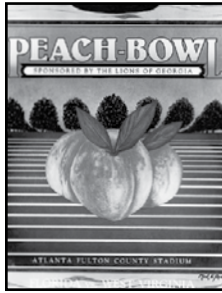

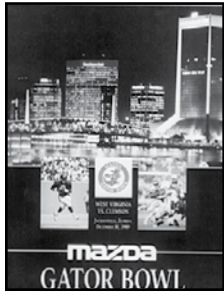

The third quarter saw both team's defenses dominate as neither team was able to sustain a long drive. West Virginia cornerback Preston Waters thwarted a Clemson drive with an interception, while Clemson free safety Robert O'Neal returned the favor on a Harris end zone pass.

At the beginning of the fourth quarter, Clemson put the game on ice when tailback Joe Henderson outran the Mountaineer left side for a four-yard touchdown with 11:43 remaining.

Harris scrambled in the end zone, desperate to make something happen with only eight minutes remaining, but was stripped of the football by Chester McGlockton, who fell on the ball for the final touchdown.

The Tiger defense allowed West Virginia only 237 yards of total offense. Linebackers Doug Brewster, John Johnson and Ed McDaniel made Harris' final collegiate game a disappointing memory. He finished the game with only 119 yards passing and 17 yards rushing.

A bright spot for the Mountaineers was the play of defensive tackle Mike Fox (seven tackles), who was named the game's defensive MVP for his outstanding play along the line of scrimmage.

Linebacker Chris Haering was credited with 14 tackles, while safety Darrell Whitmore had nine.

New Orleans, La. (January 1) -- The 1994 Sugar Bowl was to be the crowning achievement of one of the greatest seasons in Mountaineer football annals. A share of the national title, redemption from a 42-19 shellacking in the 1954 Sugar Bowl, and a chance for a perfect 12-0 season were on the minds of Mountaineer faithful that evening at the Superdome.

The No. 8 Florida Gators, with a 10-2 record, were just an afterthought, until Lawrence Wright's 52-yard interception for a touchdown with 9:12 remaining in the second quarter put the Gators up 14-7 on the way to a runaway 41-7 win.

West Virginia got on the board first with a masterful, nine-play, 80-yard opening drive that culminated with a Jake Kelchner to Jay Kearney 32-yard scoring strike. On that drive, Kelchner was brilliant, mixing short passes with inside runs. A key play in the scoring drive was Robert Walker's three-yard gain on fourth and one at the Gator 35 that kept the drive alive.

After exchanging possessions, Florida answered with an impressive drive of its own. Beginning on their own nine, the Gators churned out 91 yards in 12 plays, culminating with an Errict Rhett three-yard touchdown run. A key play in the Gator drive was a personal foul call on the Mountaineers after they had apparently stopped Rhett a yard short of the first down at the Gator 16.

From that point, it was all downhill for West Virginia. Two possessions later, backup quarterback Darren Studstill was hit while attempting a pass, and Wright snared the errant aerial and zigzagged his way 52 yards through the entire Mountaineer team to score the Gators' second touchdown.

After stalling at the Florida 49, West Virginia punted to Florida with 2:55 remaining in the half.

Engineering the two-minute offense to perfection, Gator QB Terry Dean hit three passes before finding Willie Jackson down the sideline for 39 yards and a touchdown that put the Gators up 21-7 at halftime.

At the start of the second half, West Virginia couldn't generate any offense and punted to Florida on its first possession. The Gators further distanced themselves from the Mountaineers by going 80 yards in nine plays to make the score 28-7. Rhett scored his second touchdown of the game by running wide left for the necessary two yards.

On the ensuing kickoff, things got worse for West Virginia when freshman Mike Logan ran into teammate Lovett Purnell and fumbled the football to Florida at the WVU 14. Five plays later, Sugar Bowl MVP Rhett scored his third TD of the game to put the game out of reach. Florida connected on field goals of 43 and 26 yards to round out the scoring.

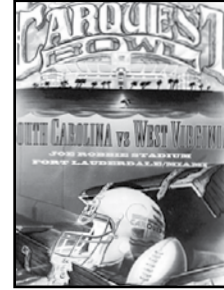

USC answered as Taneyhill, the game's MVP, marched the Gamecocks 66 yards in 13 plays, capping the drive by scrambling up the middle to escape the swarming Mountaineer pass rush and scoring from four yards out. Morton's PAT made it 17-7 at the half.

Lovett Purnell got the Mountaineers back within three, snaring a six-yard toss from Chad Johnston on WVU's first drive of the second half.

Following a USC punt, WVU drove to the Carolina 29, but Ben Washington picked off an errant Johnston aerial and returned it to midfield. USC bumped the lead back to 10 when Stanley Pritchett dove in from a yard out.

Once again, the Mountaineers answered the Gamecock score by driving 70 yards in seven plays. Johnston hit a diving Purnell from seven yards, and Sauerbrun's PAT closed the gap to 24-21.

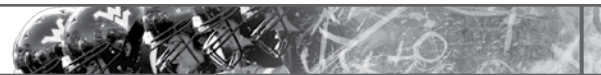
WVU threatened late in the fourth quarter, before being held on downs with 3:52 left. While attempting to run out the clock, Carolina's Pritchett broke free and was heading in for a score when Aaron Beasley came from behind and stripped the ball. Following a mad scramble, WVU took possession at its own three with 1:14 left. However, two incompletions and a sack were all the Mountaineers could muster.

Individually, Johnston was 19-32 through the air for 240 yards and two scores, while Walker had 132 yards on 16 carries. Zach Abraham led the receiving corps with seven catches for 107 yards. Defensive standouts included J.T. Thomas with 11 tackles and a sack and Charles Emanuel and Vann Washington with 10 tackles each.

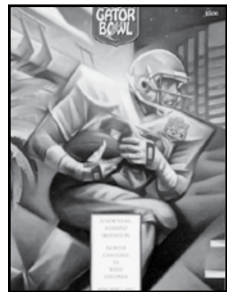

Jacksonville, Fla. (January 1) -- The stage was set for a defensive war, West Virginia with the No. 1 defense in the nation against the No. 2 ranked unit of North Carolina. Nearly 20,000 Mountaineer fans made the trek to Jacksonville with hopes of a WVU bowl victory. But the 73-degree temperatures were not enough to warm West Virginia fans' hearts following

the 20-13 heartbreaker.

Both squads got off to a slow start as neither team was able to score during the first quarter. The Mountaineers showed their defensive mettle early, holding the vaunted Tar Heel ground attack to 13 yards.

The second quarter saw UNC's Oscar Davenport take over as he quickly put the Tar Heels on the board with an 18-yard touchdown pass to Octavus Barnes. North Carolina then converted a WVU turnover into a field goal. Facing a 10-0 deficit, WVU quarterback Chad Johnston and tailback Alvin Swoope led the West Virginia offense to its only score of the half, a 47-yard field goal by Jay Taylor. Davenport capped off the first half with a five-yard option run to give North Carolina a 17-3 lead at the intermission.

The Mountaineers opened the third quarter with a six-play, 74-yard scoring drive, punctuated by a 34-yard touchdown pass from Johnston to David Saunders, who ended the game with nine catches, 130 yards and MVP honors. The Tar Heels could only muster a field goal in the third quarter, and West Virginia was faced with a 20-10 deficit going into the final period.

A stifling WVU defense shut down the Tar Heel offense and gave the ball over to Johnston and the offense early in the quarter, but turnovers and penalties continued to haunt WVU, and the Mountaineers could only manage another 47-yard Taylor field goal to close the scoring.

Amos Zereoue led the ground attack with 63 yards on 21 carries. Johnston passed for 197 yards, but suffered three interceptions for the only time in 1996.

Bernard Russ led the WVU defense with 12 tackles, while consensus All-American Canute Curtis chipped in with six stops, a sack and a pass broken up. Other defensive standouts for the Mountaineers included John Hadley, who posted four tackles, two for loss and a sack, and Elige Longino with six tackles and a sack.

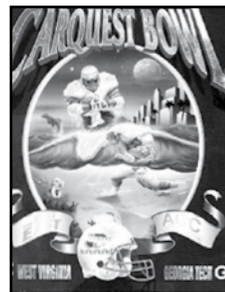

Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. (December 29) -- Led by sophomore quarterback Joe Hamilton, who passed and rushed for 356 yards and three touchdowns, Georgia Tech's offense stung the injury-plagued Mountaineers 35-30 in front of a crowd of 28,262 fans at Pro Player Stadium.

Both teams got on the board early. Yellow Jacket fullback Ed Wilder completed

Georgia Tech's first drive of the game with a touchdown, but the Mountaineers answered quickly on their first possession. Amos Zereoue topped off the 80-yard drive with a 14-yard scamper into the end zone. Georgia Tech scored again at 2:58 on a 30-yard run by Hamilton, bringing the first quarter score to 14-7.

Georgia Tech opened the second quarter with a 94-yard drive that resulted in a three-yard touchdown pass from Hamilton to Mike Lillie. West Virginia struck back when Jerry Porter snagged a 21-yard touchdown pass from Marc Bulger, but the Yellow Jackets' quarterback wasn't through.

Hamilton closed out the second half scoring with a nine-yard touchdown run and a 28-14 Jacket lead. During the third quarter, West Virginia cut Georgia Tech's lead in half with a 19-yard Zereoue touchdown run, and Jay Taylor's 21-yard field goal edged the Mountaineers even closer at 28-24.

Georgia Tech moved to a two-score lead with a late fourth quarter touchdown by Charles Wiley, but the Mountaineers launched a dramatic comeback effort on their next possession, covering 77 yards in two plays. The 74-yard touchdown pass to Porter from Bulger pulled the Gold and Blue within a touchdown, but time ran out before another score was possible.

Bulger led the Mountaineer offense with 353 yards passing, including two touchdown tosses to Porter, who caught four passes for 124 yards on the day. Shawn Foreman had 110 yards on 12 catches and Zereoue rushed for a game-high 84 yards on 17 attempts.

Senior linebacker Steve Lippe (two TFL) and junior defensive back Dave Lightcap led the defense with 11 and 10 tackles respectively. Gary Stills and John Hadley contributed nine tackles, and Barrett Green added eight.

Tucson, Ariz. (December 26) -- Bad luck and the rushing ability of Missouri quarterback Corby Jones were enough to stave off a furious second-half Mountaineer rally as the Tigers outlasted West Virginia 34-31 in the Insight.com Bowl.

WVU moved the ball at will against a seemingly overmatched Mizzou defense early on in the ball game, but a blocked field goal and an

interception, that went in and out of the normally sure-handed Shawn Foreman's clutches, led to two Tiger scores and a 14-0 lead that stunned the Mountaineers for the entire first half. West Virginia managed to get a 28-yard field goal from Jay Taylor and headed into the locker room trailing the Tigers 24-3.

A re-focused Mountaineer squad took the field in the second half. The defenses traded blows to start the second half with neither team gaining an advantage.

From that point, West Virginia put on an explosive display of offensive football.

While the first half was a showcase for Missouri's Jones, the second half turned out to be the Marc Bulger show. The junior from Pittsburgh, Pa., set bowl and school records for passing yards in a game with 452.

Riding momentum from a Boo Sensabaugh blocked punt, Bulger hooked-up with David Saunders on a nine-yard touchdown strike to get the Mountaineers into the end zone for the first time in the contest.

Following Jones' third touchdown run of the game, Bulger's surgical precision carved up the Tiger defense to the tune of eight completions during the following WVU drive, including an eight-yard score to Khorl Ivy.

As well as West Virginia played in the third quarter, it was merely a sign of things to come. Bulger continued his hot hand during the Mountaineers' first possession of the fourth quarter by connecting with Amos Zereoue out of the backfield for a nine-yard touchdown.

Missouri then took advantage of two costly WVU penalties to get within range for an 18-yard field goal that would be the difference in the game.

Trailing by 10 points, Bulger once again marched West Virginia down the field and cut the Tiger lead to three after hitting Saunders on a one-yard scoring strike with a little more than two minutes remaining in the game.

However, Missouri recovered the attempted onside kick by Taylor and ran out the clock to hold on to a 34-31 decision.

West Virginia was led defensively by junior linebacker Barrett Green, who, despite suffering from injured ribs, registered a team-high 14 tackles. Senior Gary Stills closed out his career with six tackles, including two TFLs and one sack.

Bulger set school bowl records for yards passing (429), passes attempted (50), passes completed (34) and total offense (424). Shawn Foreman set a school bowl record for yards receiving with 189 yards on 11 receptions, while Saunders tied the WVU record for touchdowns in a bowl game with two.

Nashville, Tenn. (December 28) -- Sixteen years of bowl frustration came to an end as West Virginia snapped an eight-game bowl losing streak and sent retiring coach Don Nehlen out in style with a 49-38 win over Mississippi in front of 47,719 chilly fans at Adelphia Coliseum. The 2000 Music City Bowl was one of the greatest ever in the Nehlen era at West Virginia

as the Mountaineers built a 49-9 second half lead over the SEC powerhouse and then coasted to the victory. West Virginia struck quickly on its first possession as quarterback Brad Lewis connected with fullback Wes Ours on a beautifully designed throwback screen. Ours chugged 40 yards down the left sideline and dove into the end zone to give WVU its first lead in a bowl game since 1994.

While Ole Miss managed three Les Binkley field goals, the first half belonged to West Virginia. Senior receiver Khori Ivy made a magnificent one-handed stab on an 11-yard toss from Lewis, followed by two touchdown receptions from fellow receiver Antonio Brown. Brown's first score covered 35 yards and the second went for 60 as the Mountaineers moved out to a 28-9 lead.

With Ole Miss desperately trying to stay in the game, free safety Rick Sherrod intercepted Rebel quarterback Romaro Miller. The interception set up Ours with his second score of the game on a one-yard plunge giving the Mountaineers a 35-9 advantage at the half.

Lewis, healthy for the first time since September, put on a clinic in the first half, completing all seven of his throws for 216 yards and four touchdowns. Of the 19 plays West Virginia ran in the first half, five went for touchdowns.

Second-half action started strong for the Mountaineers as Shawn Terry returned the opening kickoff 99 yards to give the Mountaineers an insurmountable lead. The TD return was the first ever in WVU bowl annals and the longest in Music City Bowl history.

On the next Ole Miss possession, linebacker Corey McIntyre intercepted Miller and returned the ball near midfield.

The quick-striking Mountaineers needed just five plays to find the end zone again as Lewis completed his fifth touchdown pass of the day, hitting Ivy with a 10-yard pass. The five scoring tosses established WVU and Music City Bowl records, while Ivy joined Brown and Ours as the top single-game scorers in Mountaineer bowl history.

Facing a 49-9 deficit, the Rebels mounted a comeback behind backup quarterback Eli Manning's three scoring tosses, but the game was too far out of reach and the Mountaineers had their first bowl victory since 1984.

Lewis, the game's MVP, completed 15-of-21 passes for 308 yards and five touchdowns. Brown had six catches for 156 yards, Ivy had six catches for 99 yards while Avon Cobourne rushed for 125. Defensively, strong safety Shawn Hackett led the way with 14 tackles as the Mountaineers limited Ole Miss's do-it-all running back Deuce McAllister to just 22 yards on the ground.

All-told, the Mountaineers totaled 432 yards of total offense as the ultra-successful Don Nehlen era at West Virginia came to an end.

Charlotte, N.C. (December 28) -- Before a sellout crowd of 73,535 at Charlotte's Ericsson Stadium, Virginia used big and trick plays to its advantage in defeating West Virginia 48-22 in the inaugural Continental Tire Bowl.

In what turned out to be the second biggest attendance in history for a first-time bowl, more than 45,000 Mountaineer fans invaded

Charlotte to see their 13th-ranked team battle the Cavaliers.

Things started in favor of West Virginia in the first quarter but turned sour in the second. Behind a 27-yard Todd James field

goal, and a six-yard Avon Cobourne touchdown run, West Virginia led 10-7 after one quarter and overcame a UVA trick play when backup quarterback Marques Hagans took a lateral from Matt Schaub and completed a 14-yard pass to tailback Wali Lundy for the Cavs' first score.

However, second quarter action saw Virginia take control of the game. Schaub dove in from one-yard out, before Hagans returned a punt 69 yards for another score. Following a UVA interception from a miscued WVU trick reverse, the Mountaineers jumped offside on a missed Virginia field goal attempt, giving Virginia new life and the Cavs converted late in the second quarter with a Lundy four-yard burst to lead 28-10 at the half.

Virginia upped its advantage in the third quarter on a Schaub 48-yard pass to Lundy and a Connor Hughes field goal. West Virginia did get on the board when Rasheed Marshall dove in from one yard to cap a 13-play, 80-yard drive to cut the deficit to 38-16 heading into the final quarter.

Hughes added a 30-yard field goal early in the fourth, before Cobourne scored his second touchdown of the game at the 7:17 mark to pull the Mountaineers to 41-22. Virginia closed out the scoring, when Lundy scored his fourth touchdown with a 31-yard run for a 48-22 Cavalier victory.

Cobourne rushed for 117 yards and two scores to cap off his fabulous WVU career. He left as the ninth-best rusher in NCAA career history. Marshall passed for 215 yards, and Phil Braxton continued his strong play down the stretch with four catches for 108 yards. Cornerback Lance Frazier topped the defensive effort with 12 tackles, while linebacker Ben Collins added six stops.

Lundy received the MVP award with his 127 yards rushing to go along with 76 yards receiving and four total touchdowns. Schaub passed for 182 yards, and Angelo Crowell topped the Cavalier defensive effort with 12 tackles.

West Virginia, with the nation's second-ranked rushing attack, managed 244 yards on the ground and passed for 215 to total 459 yards of total offense. Virginia posted 195 yards rushing and 196 passing for 391 yards of total offense.

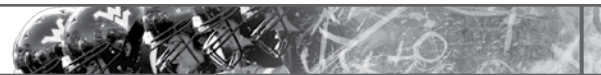

Jacksonville, Fla. (Jan. 1) -- No. 17 Florida State defeated No. 23 West Virginia, 30-18, in the 60th Annual Gator Bowl at Alltel Stadium. FSU and former WVU coach Bobby Bowden collected their second victory all-time over the Mountaineers.

In the first two minutes of the game, it looked like the Seminoles would coast as they took a 10-0 lead with 12:51 to play in the first quarter.

Tailback Leon Washington rushed 69 yards on FSU's second play of the game, before the Seminoles recovered an Adam Jones fumble on the ensuing kickoff and converted a 32-yard field goal.

But the Mountaineers were determined to make a game of it and actually erased the 10-point deficit and took the lead before the end of the first quarter.

Playing with severely bruised ribs, quarterback Rasheed Marshall hit tailback KayJay Harris for a 36-yard touchdown to cut the deficit to 10-6.

West Virginia took the lead late in the first when Harris dove in from a yard out for a 12-10 Mountaineer lead.

Early in the second quarter, Florida State Xavier Beitia converted a 28-yard field goal to give the Seminoles a 13-12 lead at the half.

Third-quarter action saw the Seminoles add a 28-yard Beitia field goal, before the Mountaineers closed the deficit to 16-15 behind a 44-yard field goal from Andy Good. The Seminoles then landed a decisive blow at the 3:05 mark of the quarter when Chris Rix connected with Craphonso Thorpe for a 14-yard touchdown pass.

West Virginia answered early in the fourth quarter when Good connected on a 34-yard field goal to pull the Mountaineers within five at 23-18, but the Seminoles followed with a James Coleman 1-yard touchdown run to close out the scoring.

The game was moved to Atlanta from New Orleans because of the devastation from Hurricane Katrina.

Freshman Steve Slaton earned game MVP honors, running for a Sugar Bowl record 204 yards and three scores.

Behind a quick-striking offense, the Mountaineers raced to a 28-0 lead in just over a quarter behind two scores from Slaton and Darius Reynaud.

However, the Georgia offense came alive and closed the gap to 31-21 at the half.

Third quarter scoring belonged to the Bulldogs when D.J. Shockley connected with A.J. Bryant for a 34-yard touchdown with 1:51 left in the quarter. West Virginia quieted the Dome with a nine-play, 95-yard drive that ended with Slaton's second 52-yard run of the game for a 38-28 Mountaineer led with 8:32 left.

Georgia answered with a 90-yard drive of its own to put the score at 38-35 with 5:13 remaining.

The Bulldogs never got the ball back as the Mountaineers ran out the remaining five minutes by gaining four first downs, thanks in part to a fake punt by punter Phil Brady that gained 10 yards on 4th-and-6, giving WVU its first BCS victory in school history.

Pat White passed for 120 yards and one score to go along with 77 yards rushing. Mike Lorello led the defense with eight tackles. Georgia totaled 501 yards of total offense, but the Mountaineers countered with 382 on the ground and 120 passing for 502 yards of total offense.

With the victory, West Virginia finished with its third 11-win season in school history and first since 1993. Final rankings put the Mountaineers at No. 5 in the Associated Press poll and No. 6 in the USA Today coaches poll.

Jacksonville, Fla. (January 1, 2007) -- West Virginia stormed back from an 18-point third quarter deficit to claim the 62nd annual Gator Bowl by a thrilling 38-35 count.

The win showcased the talents of quarterback Patrick White, who fought through numerous injuries and willed the Mountaineers to victory. With All-America tailback Steve

Slaton's play limited by a thigh bruise coming into the game, White stepped up to earn MVP honors with 145 yards rushing and 131 yards passing while accounting for three touchdowns. Owen Schmitt added a career high 109 yards rushing to WVU's totals as the Mountaineers won their first Gator Bowl in six tries.

On their first possession, it looked like the Mountaineers would have no worries as they marched 80 yards in just four plays to take a 7-0 lead on Schmitt's one-yard plunge. The drive was highlighted by runs of 52 yards by Schmitt and 27 from White.

The Yellow Jackets answered quickly by going to All-America receiver Calvin Johnson, who hauled in the first of his two touchdown receptions when he caught a 31-yard strike from quarterback Taylor Bennett.

Tech took a 14-7 at 3:13 in the first quarter when Tashard Choice rushed in from three yards away. Tech then moved out to a 21-7 lead when Bennett connected with Johnson for a 48-yard TD strike early in the second quarter.

The Mountaineers answered with Pat McAfee's 25-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 21-10 with 9:16 left in the half, but Tech upped its advantage when Bennett hit James Johnson on a 27-yard scoring pass to put the score at 28-10.

However, with 1:06 left in the half, West Virginia scored a much-needed touchdown on an 11-yard run from Schmitt to finish off an eight-play, 60-yard drive.

The Mountaineers hoped to cut into the deficit even more with the opening possession of the second half, but Tech surprised everyone by recovering an onside kick.

The Yellow Jackets capitalized as Choice rushed in from five yards out for a commanding 35-17 Georgia Tech lead.

But West Virginia's next 11 plays in 6:34 will go down as one of the most important stretches in Mountaineer football history. White would not let the Old Gold and Blue quit and put the game on his shoulders to lead the greatest comeback in Gator Bowl history.

Two plays after falling behind 35-17, White hit receiver Tito Gonzales on a 57-yard scoring pass. After the WVU defense held on downs, White went back to the air seven plays later and found Brandon Myles in the corner of the end zone to pull the Mountaineers within 35-31.

With the momentum clearly on WVU's side, McAfee bounced the ensuing kickoff off a Tech defender and the ball was recovered by John Holmes for the Mountaineers. Two plays later, White would not be denied the end zone and scored on a 15-yard scamper to give the Mountaineers a 38-35 edge, sending the huge throng of Mountaineer faithful into a frenzy.

After being shredded by the pass in the first half, the WVU defense came alive and held Tech at bay. White engineered a 10-play drive, carrying eight times to run out the clock to give West Virginia its second straight New Year's Day bowl victory to cap off an 11-2 season.

The second straight 11-win season completed a 25-game, two-

year stretch for the Mountaineers with a 22-3 record. West Virginia finished with a 10th-place national ranking in both polls.

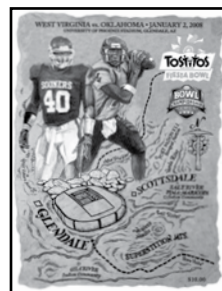

Glendale, Ariz. -- (January 2) - Under interim head coach Bill Stewart, West Virginia pulled off the biggest upset in school history by defeating No. 3 Oklahoma 48-28 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

Behind 150 yards rushing and 176 passing from quarterback and bowl offensive MVP Patrick White, the Mountaineers stunned the heavily

favored Sooners by rushing for 349 yards to key the victory.

Set up by a Vaughn Rivers 51-yard punt return, West Virginia scored the game's first points, when kicker Pat McAfee connected on a 38-yard field goal in the opening quarter and ran its lead to 6-0 as time in the quarter expired, when McAfee connected on a 42-yard field goal.

Oklahoma's Garret Hartley hit a 37-yard field goal at the 7:46 mark of the second quarter to cut the WVU lead in half.

Owen Schmitt rumbled for a 57-yard touchdown run, the longest in WVU bowl history, to give the Mountaineers a 13-3 lead with 6:23 remaining in the half. Oklahoma answered with a 24-yard Hartley field goal to cut the deficit to 13-6. The Mountaineers managed another score to increase their lead to 20-6 at the half.

That drive was sparked by a 34-yard completion to tailback Noel Devine. White marched the Mountaineers 78 yards in seven plays and ended the drive with a pretty 21-yard pass to a wide open Darius Reynaud.

The Sooners scored the first nine points of the second half, with a field goal from Hartley at the 9:33 mark and then added a Chris Brown one-yard touchdown run. The Sooners went for the two-point conversion, but quarterback Sam Bradford's pass was incomplete, giving WVU a 20-15 lead.

The Sooners tried an onside kick on the ensuing kickoff, that was recovered by WVU's Ridwan Malik.

Taking over at the Oklahoma 39-yard line, it took just six plays to capitalize on the field position as Devine's 17-yard scoring run gave the Mountaineers a 27-15 lead.

West Virginia struck again behind a White 42-yard run and a 30-yard Reynaud reverse for a score, giving WVU a 34-15 lead heading into the final quarter.

The scoring was furious in the final stanza. The Sooners closed the deficit to 34-21, when Bradford hit Quentin Chaney for a 19-yard score, but WVU responded in just one play when White hit receiver Tito Gonzales for a 79-yard scoring strike, raising the Mountaineer lead to 41-21. Bradford then connected with Juaquin Iglesias for a 15-yard touchdown strike to pull the Sooners to 41-28 with 10:14 left, but Devine scored on a 65-yard run at the 9:14 mark, giving the Mountaineers the 48-28 victory.

Devine finished with 108 yards rushing, while linebacker Reed Williams won the defensive MVP honors with nine tackles, two TFL and a forced fumble. For Oklahoma, Bradford passed for 242 yards, Chaney led all receivers with 129 yards, while Curtis Lofton led the defense with 15 tackles.

Final totals showed West Virginia with an impressive 525 yards of total offense, while Oklahoma finished with 419 yards.

The win gave West Virginia its third straight bowl victory and second BCS victory in three years.

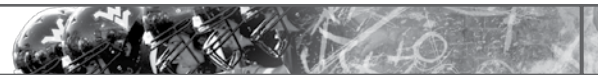

CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICANS

WVU's Consensus All-Americans



Aaron Beasley Cornerback, 1995

This Pottstown, Pa., native captured first team All-America honors from five different sources during a 1995 season in which he nabbed five interceptions. The year prior as a junior, Beasley led the nation with 10 picks. Of his 19 career interceptions (second all-time at WVU), three went for TDs. A Jim Thorpe and Football News defensive player of the year semifinalist as a senior, Beasley was a third-round selection of the Jacksonville Jaguars and he's now a member of the Atlanta Falcons.



Bruce Bosley Tackle, 1955

This Green Bank, W.Va., resident earned consensus All-America honors as a tackle in 1955, ending a 36-year West Virginia consensus drought. A terrific all-around player, Bosley played on the 1954 Sugar Bowl team and helped WVU to a three-year 31-7 mark. A second-round selection by the San Francisco 49ers in 1956, the 1953 Academic All-American was a four-time all-pro as a member of the 49ers during his 13-year NFL career. Bosley was a member of the College Football Hall of Fame.



Mike Compton Center, 1992

West Virginia's fifth consensus All-American used equal amounts of brains and muscle to gain national acclaim. A native of Richlands, Va., Compton was cited by seven different sources for his consensus tag at center. One of four Rotary Lombardi Award finalists, he was a NCAA Today's Top Six winner and was selected to speak on behalf of all NCAA student-athletes at the 1993 NCAA Convention in Dallas. A third-round pick by the Detroit Lions in 1993, the Academic All-American was a fixture at guard and center for the Lions for eight seasons before moving on to New England, where he won two Super Bowl rings with the Patriots. He is now a member of the Jacksonville Jaguars.



Canute Curtis Linebacker, 1996

One of West Virginia's most decorated defenders, linebacker Canute Curtis was the anchor of the nation's No. 1-rated defense in 1996. The BIG EAST defensive player of the year and the school's all-time sack leader with 342, the Amityville, N.Y., native was a finalist for the Butkus Award, the Football Writers Association Bronko Nagurski Award and the Football News defensive player of the year. He was a sixth-round draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals.



Brian Jozwiak Offensive Tackle, 1985

Mammoth offensive tackle Brian Jozwiak became Coach Don Nehlen's second consensus All-American in 1985. Jozwiak gained consensus status at offensive tackle by earning first team All-America honors from five different sources. The seventh player taken in the 1986 NFL draft by the Kansas City Chiefs, the Catonsville, Md., resident was just the fifth Mountaineer to be taken in the first round of the NFL draft. Jozwiak played three NFL seasons before injury forced him into early retirement.



Dan Mozes Center, 2006

Dan Mozes was named the Rimington Award winner, signifying the top center in the nation. He helped lead the Mountaineers to two 11-win seasons, two Top 10 final rankings and set the best four-year record in the school's history. Mozes finished with a complete sweep, earning both unanimous and consensus All-America honors. He was a leader on one of the most explosive offenses in college football, ranking No. 2 nationally in rushing, No. 3 in scoring, No. 5 in total offense and No. 6 in fewest sacks allowed. West Virginia averaged 303 yards per game rushing, 38.9 points a game and 461.4 yards per game of total offense. He signed a free agent contract with the Minnesota Vikings.

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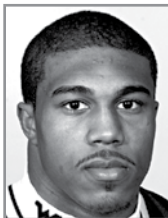
Ira Errett "Rat" Rodgers Fullback, 1919

Hailed as one of the nation's finest pre-World War II football players, Ira Errett Rodgers is considered by several historians to be West Virginia's finest all-round athlete. West Virginia's first consensus pick in 1919 at fullback, the Bethany, W.Va., native amassed the single greatest season of any West Virginia player in 1919, leading the nation in scoring with 147 points. National syndicated columnist Grantland Rice labelled Rodgers "the finest all-round football player in the land" that season. Rodgers was enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame in 1953.



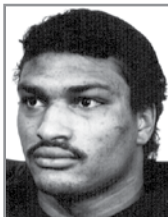
Todd Sauerbrun Punter, 1994

Considered among the top punters in NCAA football history, Todd Sauerbrun established an NCAA standard 48.4 punting average in 1994 on the way to consensus All-America status. Sauerbrun also set NCAA marks in career punting average (46.1) and season punts traveling longer than 50 yards (32). The AT&T national Long Distance Award winner earned a clean sweep of All-America teams in 1994 and had one punt travel 90 yards against Nebraska in the Kickoff Classic. The Setauket, N.Y., native was the 56th player taken in the 1995 NFL draft by the Chicago Bears (second round), the highest specialist taken since 1979. He is currently a member of the Kansas City Chiefs and was named to the Walter Camp Football Foundation All-Century College Football Team for the 1900's.



Steve Slaton Running Back, 2006

This three-year starter was a quick-footed and speedy runner who ran for a school record 1,744 yards and 16 touchdowns in 2006, helping lead the Mountaineers to a second-straight 11-win season. He was second in the nation in all-purpose yards, fourth in rushing yards per game and tied for No. 12 in scoring. Slaton finished with a complete sweep, earning both unanimous and consensus All-America honors. He ran for over 1,000 yards all three years, helping the Mountaineers to three-straight 11-win seasons and Top 10 rankings. While he was at WVU, he finished his career among the Top 10 active players nationally in career rushing yards, career rushing yards per game, career rushing touchdowns, career yards per carry, scoring touchdowns, total points and points per game and all-purpose yards per game. He also was named the most valuable player of the 2006 Sugar Bowl, finishing with a bowl record 204 yards against Georgia.



Darryl Talley Linebacker, 1982

Coach Don Nehlen's first consensus All-America pick in 1982 (third ever at WVU), linebacker Darryl Talley captured first team All-America status on nine teams that season. A vicious hitter who finished his career as the school's all-time leading tackler, Talley was among the first great Nehlen players that elevated West Virginia football nationally. Selected in the second round by the Buffalo Bills in 1983, the Cleveland, Ohio, native became a fixture on four Buffalo Super Bowl teams. Talley was a two-time NFL all-pro with the Bills.



Grant Wiley Linebacker, 2003

Four-year starter who anchored the Mountaineer defense from his linebacker post. Surpassed fellow consensus All-American Darryl Talley to become the school's all-time leading tackler in 2003. Finished his career with 492 total tackles in becoming WVU's ninth consensus All-American. The Trappe, Pa., native displayed the knack for making big plays for the Mountaineer defense and finished his career as WVU's career leader in tackles for loss with 47.5.

Bruce Lee Bosley

College Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 1982 as a player

West Virginia's second-ever consensus All-American in 1955, Bruce Bosley was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1982. A native of Fresno, Calif., who grew up in Green Bank, W.Va., Bosley played on the 1954 Sugar Bowl team for the Mountaineers. That squad finished as the 10th-ranked team in the nation. He went on to a long and prosperous NFL career with the San Francisco 49ers and Atlanta Falcons for 13 seasons. A four-time Pro Bowl pick in 1960, 1965, 1966 and 1967, Bosley is a member of the San Francisco 49ers all-time team. The 6-2, 240-lb., center retired in 1969. He died April 25, 1995, in San Francisco, Calif.

Robert Lee "Sam" Huff

Pro Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 1982 as a player

College Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 1980 as a player

A name synonymous with West Virginia football, Robert Lee "Sam" Huff ranks among the all-time great NFL linebackers. At West Virginia, Huff was a 6-1, 230-lb. tackle before being drafted in the third round by the New York Giants

in 1956. Shortly thereafter, the Farmington, W.Va., native became one of the greatest and most publicized linebackers in pro football history and the first defensive football player to make the cover of Time magazine. CBS produced a half-hour pro football documentary entitled "The Violent World of Sam Huff." A fierce competitor and a great rival of Green Bay Packers linebacker Ray Nitsche, Huff earned Pro Bowl status five times, first as a Giant, and then as a Washington Redskin, where he finished his career in 1969. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1980 and the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1982.



Alfred Earle "Greasy" Neale

Pro Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 1969 as a coach

College Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 1967 as a coach

A noted player and coach, "Greasy" Neale's affiliation with West Virginia lasted three years as head football coach from 1931-34. Prior to his stay in Morgantown, Greasy (a nickname he had carried since childhood), was

a three-sport standout at West Virginia Wesleyan before embarking on an eight-year major league baseball career with the Cincinnati Reds. While a baseball player, Neale also found time to play professional football in the fall. Upon his retirement as an athlete, Neale became a college coaching gypsy, guiding some of the nation's finest football programs before taking the NFL Philadelphia Eagles coaching job in 1941. Introducing the "naked reverse," man-to-man shifting defenses, the stuffer series and a primitive form of the 4-3 defense during his pro football coaching tenure, Neale guided the Eagles to the 1949 NFL title. The Parkersburg native was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1967 and the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1969. He died November 2, 1973, in Lake Worth, Fla.



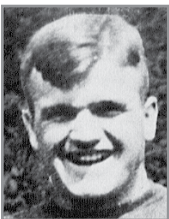
Donald Eugene "Don" Nehlen

College Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 2005 as a coach

The winningest coach in WVU history with a 149-43-4 record, Don Nehlen served as Mountaineer head man from 1980-2000. During his 21 years as head coach in Morgantown, Nehlen guided the Mountaineers to 13 bowl games and two bids for national titles playing Notre Dame in the 1989 Fiesta Bowl and Florida in the 1994 Sugar Bowl. He coached 15 first-team All-Americans, 82 all-conference players and 51 players that

went on to play professional football. His resume included coaching stints in the Blue-Gray, East-West Shrine and Hula Bowl all-star games and he served as president of the 10,000-member American Football Coaches Association in 1997. Nehlen, a twotime national coach of the year in 1988 and 1993, is a member of the Mid-American Conference, Bowling Green, Gator Bowl and WVU Sports Halls of Fame. He also served as head coach of his alma mater, Bowling Green, from 1968-76, posting a 53-35-4 mark. The native of Canton, Ohio, was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2005.



Ira Errett "Rat" Rodgers

College Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 1953 as a player

West Virginia's preeminent all-around athlete, Ira Errett "Rat" Rodgers gained fame as a hard-charging fullback from 1917-19. Called one of "the finest football players in the land" by syndicated columnist Grantland Rice, Rodgers is unanimously considered West Virginia's finest pre-

World War II football player. A consensus All-American in 1919, Rodgers gained national notoriety after a 25-0 whipping of Princeton, against which he passed for 162 yards and two touchdowns. For the season Rodgers accounted for 147 points. Later an amateur state golf champion, the Bethany, W.Va., native remained at West Virginia as football (1920-25, 1943-45), baseball (1921-42) and golf coach (1949). Rodgers was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1953. He died February 22, 1963, in Morgantown.



Floyd "Ben" Schwartzwalder

College Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 1982 as a coach

A two-sport letterman at West Virginia in football and wrestling from 1930-32, he achieved great success as a head coach on the prep and collegiate level. He coached high school football for six seasons in West Virginia and Ohio, winning two state championships at Parkersburg (W.Va.), prior to enlisting in the U.S. Army during World War II. Following his discharge, he was the head coach at Muhlenberg (N.J.) College from 1946-48, compiling a 25-5 record. He left there to become head coach at Syracuse, serving as head man there from 1949-73. His teams were an impressive 153-91-3, went to seven bowls, winning the national championship in 1959, and captured four Lambert Trophies (1952, 1956, 1959 and 1966). He was National Coach of the Year in 1959 and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1982. He died in 1993 at age 83.



Clarence Wiley "Doc" Spears

College Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 1955 as a coach

A coach at West Virginia from 1921-24, Clarence "Doc" Spears was responsible for developing West Virginia's great football fortunes of the early 1920s. During his coaching tenure in Morgantown, the school played in its first bowl game (East-West) in 1922, produced its first unbeaten team (also 1922), defeated Pitt, 9-6 that 1922 season (considered among the greatest wins in school history) and helped build a football stadium. A cordial and delightful man off the field, Spears was the opposite on it, evoking confrontations with sportswriters, alumni and fans alike. After his brief tenure in Morgantown where he also doubled as a practicing medical doctor, thus earning the nickname "Doc," Spears also coached at Minnesota and Oregon among others, until retiring in 1935 to devote his full time to medicine, practicing in Ypsilanti, Mich. Spears was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1955. He died February 1, 1964, in Jupiter, Fla.



Joseph Lee "Jumbo Joe" Stydahar

Pro Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 1967 as a player

College Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 1956 as a player

A brilliant, but under-recognized two-sport athlete at West Virginia until his graduation in 1936, "Jumbo Joe" Stydahar lost that distinction after surprisingly being the first player taken by the Chicago Bears in the 1936 NFL draft -- the first player ever selected by the organization. Born in Kaylor, Pa., and later a standout at Shinnston High (W.Va.), Stydahar was a giant of a man (6-4, 245-lbs.) who became a perennial NFL all-star at tackle. A sixty-minute performer with the "Monsters of the Midway," Stydahar played without a helmet, one of the last performers to do so. He participated on three NFL championship teams with the Bears and was named to the official all-NFL team from 1937-40. He sandwiched a two-year stint in the Navy (1943-44) in the middle of his pro career, which finished in 1946. Following his playing career, Stydahar coached the 1951 Los Angeles Rams to the NFL championship, the organization's first and only title. Stydahar was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1956 and the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1967. He died March 23, 1977, in Beckley, W.Va.



Fielding Harris "Hurry Up" Yost

College Football Hall of Fame

Inducted: 1951 as a coach

Always in a hurry, thus the nickname "Hurry Up," Fielding Harris Yost gained national acclaim as a college football coach at Michigan at the turn of the century. Yost's travels included a stop at West Virginia, where he earned a law degree and played football in 1895-96. After his two years at WVU, the Fairview, W.Va., native took the Michigan coaching job at age 30 in 1900. Four years later, he showed his appreciation for his alma mater at West Virginia by beating the Mountaineers 130-0, a score that didn't endear him to the West Virginia faithful. That 1904 Michigan squad was called the "Point-A-Minute" team. Later the athletic director at Michigan, he was singularly instrumental in building the nation's largest football stadium at Michigan. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1951. He died August 20, 1946, in Ann Arbor, Mich.
