US 31-E RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT REPORT OF FINDINGS FROM CULTURAL HISTORIC REPORT LISTED AND POTENTIALLY ELIGIBLE PROPERTIES WITHIN THE PROJECT AREA



The fieldwork to document the historic properties within the project area was completed in September of 2002 and a total of 123 sites were evaluated within the Area of Potential Effect. Two sites are listed in the National Register of Historic Place, The Sisters of Charity of Nazareth, (Ne-236) in Nelson County and the Riverview Schoolhouse, (Ne-26) in Spencer County. In addition, 42 other properties appear to meet the National Register Criteria, some as individual sites, and others as part of historic districts. Please note that the two letter designation identifying the sites refer to the counties in which they are located ie: Ne-Nelson, Sp-Spencer and Bu-Bullitt.


