ANALYSIS REPORT Publication: December 6, 2008

<u>Methodology</u>

This Leger Marketing survey was conducted over the phone with 1,200 Quebeckers between December 2 and December 4, 2008. A sample of this size yields a maximum margin of error of \pm 3.1%, 19 times out of 20.

To be representative of the Québec population, data was weighted by gender, age, language and region according to the latest Statistics Canada information.



1. The Liberals are still ahead

• If provincial elections were held between December 2 and December 4, the Liberal Party of Québec would have obtained 45% of the vote after distribution of the undecided, versus 32% for the Parti Québécois. For its part, the Action démocratique du Québec would have garnered 15% of the vote, the Ouébec solidaire party 4% and the Green Party 3%.



Evolution of Voting Intentions April 2003 to December 2008

2. 71% of voters have made their final choice

- Overall, 71% of voters said they have made their final choice, while 27% mentioned they could still
 change their mind by voting day.
- The proportion of voters who could change their mind by voting day is higher among ADQ sympathizers (33%).

3. 38% consider that Jean Charest would make the best Premier

Overall, 38% of people surveyed believe that Jean Charest is the personality who would make the
best premier. Pauline Marois obtains 29%. Since the last survey conducted prior to the leaders'
debate, the gap between the Liberal leader and the PQ leader, which was 16 points, has tightened
somewhat to settle at 9 points.
