Sharplaninec shepherd dog is a Macedonian dog which was bred in the north-west part of Macedonia (Shar Planina, Bistra, Korab, Stogavo, Mavrovo etc.). This dog was most frequently found in the mountain Shar Planina where it actually got its name. The dogs were registered in FCI in 1939.

Sharplaninec is one of the oldest native dog breeds in the world. It belongs to the group of shepherd dogs which originate from moloses. Today's Sharplaninec is result of natural selection in isolated environment untouched by other dogs for centuries. The harshness of nature made this dog to be tough, rough, aggressive and an excellent guardian, which does not back up in front of wolves or bears.

This dog has got only one master, which in fact is not a real one but is its supporter.

SPORT

The Republic of Macedonia is a landlocked country on the Balkan peninsula in southeastern Europe. It is bordered by Serbia to the north, Albania to the west, Greece to the south, and Bulgaria to the east.

The capital is Skopje, with more than 500,000 inhabitants, and there are a number of smaller cities, notably Bitola, Kumanovo, Prilep, Tetovo, Ohrid, Veles, ?tip, Ko?ani, Gostivar and Strumica. It has more than 50 natural and artificial lakes and sixteen mountains higher than 2,000 meters (6,550 ft) above sea level.

The country is a member of the UN and the Council of Europe and a member of the World Trade Organization (WTO), and the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe. Since December 2005 it is also a candidate for joining the European Union and has applied for NATO membership.

The Republic of Macedonia is a parliamentary democracy with an executive government composed of a coalition of parties from the unicameral legislature and an independent judicial branch with a constitutional court. The Assembly is made up of 120 seats and the members are elected every four years.

Today the Republic of Macedonia is considered a country with an intermediary-developed industry, with continuing growth of the industrial production. The process of transition in the economy was triggered in 1995. The government has signed arrangements with the IMF (International Monetary Fund) and World Bank. It has an open economy that is integrating into international trade, with a total trade-to-GDP ratio of 79.5%. The most important sectors are agriculture and indus-

try. The service sector also grew in the past few years.

The country's economic policy is to attract foreign investments and to increase employment. One of the biggest features of the country's economy is the fiscal discipline which maintained a stable currency for a long period. The country also makes efforts to develop the Small and Medium-Sized Enterprise sector

The largest ethnic group in the country are the



ethnic Macedonians, which are Slavic people. According to the 2002 census, Macedonians, representing more than 64.% of the total population. Albanians representing more than 20.% of the population. Smaller ethnic minorities include Turks, Serbs, Bosnians, Vlachs, and other.

The majority (64.7%) of the population belongs to the Macedonian Orthodox Church which declared autocephaly in 1968. The Macedonian Orthodox Church is the dominant church in the country. It has 10 provinces (seven in the country and three abroad), 10 bishops, and about 350 priests. Macedonians, who are the majority of the population, are Christian Orthodox. A total of 30,000 people are baptized in all the provinces every year.

The first organised forms of sports activities in Macedonia, which coincide with forming of sports societies and clubs, were in the 19th century, during the time of the Ottoman Empire. The first elements of modern sports in Macedonia can be traced to the second half of the 19th century. Within the framework of the reforms brought upon Turkey under the influence of the European bourgeois countries and the Law on National Education (1869), physical education was introduced in schools. Today in the Republic of Macedonia, more than 2,000 different sports facilities have been built in. More than 85,000 active sportsmen are members of 1,400 registered sports clubs; 2,100 sports experts are involved in the work of the sportsmen, which resulted in 160 medals won at the European and World championships, 12 of which are Olympic medals.

SPORTS HALL "BORIS TRAJKOVSKI"

Boris Trajkovski Sports Hall is multifunctional sports and cultural centre. It is named after the former President of the Republic of Macedonia Boris Trajkovski, who died in 2004. It consists smaller basketball and volleyball halls, bowling alley, fitness centre, press
The larger hall is suitable for music concerts with a capacity of 10.000 spectators with four restaurants and sports bar. The hall will also have VIP bar and special VIP seats intended for sports events.
The parking lot is for 800 cars, 32 buses and three reportage vehicles. The Sports Hall has a capacity 6000 fixed seats (for handball matches). There are also 2.000 telescopic automatic seats, which are movable.

SPORT HALL "KALE"

With a capacity of nearly 2,000 seats the sports and recreational centre "Kale" presents one of the most representative sports complexes in Skopje. Hall is also known as "Macedonian handball fortress".
Former European handball champion Kometal Gyorche Petrov from Skopje, and two best men's handball teams at the moment (Vardar and Metalurg) play their Champions league matches at this hall.
Group matches of two Junior World Championships (2003, 2005) were also held in this sport hall.

SKOPJE

Skopje is the capital and largest city in the Republic of Macedonia, with more than a quarter of the population of the country, as well as the political, cultural, economic, and academic centre of the country. It was known from the Roman period under the name Scupi. The city developed rapidly after World War II, but this trend was interrupted in 1963 when it was hit by a disastrous earthquake. Today Skopje is a modern city with a wide range of cultural monuments. Skopje is located on the upper course of the Vardar River and is located on a major north-south Balkan route between Belgrade and Athens. It has more than 600 000 inhabitant and is a major centre for metal-processing, chemical, textile, leather and other industries..

The largest ethnic group in the region is the ethnic Macedonians. Albanians are second. Roma, Serbs, Turks, and Bosnians also make up a small population. The most common religion in the region is Eastern Orthodoxy.

Transport

Buses

Skopje has two bus networks, both serving the City and the surrounding villages. Probably the best way to recognise the bus network is by its colour - the red busses are part of the state-owned "JSP" and all other buses are privately owned. Most of the bus lines are frequent.

Taxi

The taxi service has been regulated by the City to provide fair service and equal fares. There are at least 20 taxi companies that offer their services in Skopje. Minimum fee is 50 den (0,8 euro) for 3 km. of ride.

Tourist attractions

Kale Fortress

Kale fortress is situated on a hill in the middle of Skopje and dominates this whole portion of the Vardar valley. An archaeological excavation has revealed traces of habitation from the late neolithic and early bronze ages.

Exactly when the first fortifications were built on this site has not yet been established, though it is believed that reconstruction was undertaken during Justinian's reign (527-565), i.e. after the great earthquake in 518



Stone Bridge



Famous Stone Bridge in the city square built between 1451 and 1469. The Stone Bridge is the most prominent landmark of Skopje; the bridge connects the old and the new parts of the city. Although the guardhouse on the highest point of the bridge was damaged on several occasions, modern restoration is underway to bring the bridge closer to its original condition.

Old town

Skopje's Old Town is located on the eastern bank of the River Vardar, opposite the modern city center. Today it is a vibrant quarter filled with winding streets of cobblestone and narrow archways, of centuries-old mosques and a Turkish bath.

GEVGELIJA

The town of Gevgelija is located in the southern part of Republic of Macedonia, on the right-hand bank of the river Vardar. Many roads lead to Gevgelija, and the Bogorodica border crossing towards Greece is only 3 kilometers outside of the town. Skopje Airport is 150 kilometers away, and the one in Thessaloniki (Greece) is 70 kilometers away.

The mild Mediterranean climate which is almost permanent throughout the year allows for development of tourism, which is particularly apparent in Negorci mineral spas. They have excellent accommodation and sports grounds available, suitable for simultaneous preparations of a number of teams. The closeness of the town of Dojran and the Dojran Lake allows preparation of sport teams. The town of Gevgelija is characterized by its cultural and artistic life, with numerous restaurants and tourist objects, a casino and night clubs which offer exciting entertainment. Gevgelija has its sultry climate to thank for its leading position as a Macedonian agricultural center. The area enjoys 240 days a year without frost, with an average yearly temperature of 22 degrees Celsius (72 degrees Fahrenheit). Mt. Kozuf provides a natural and very visible border between the Mediterranean climate, marked by arid, rocky hills, and the continental climate, marked by grassy fields and deciduous and pine forests.

This biodiversity has made the Gevgelija region one of Macedonia's ecological rarities. Aside from wild flora and fauna, Gevgelija's mixed climate and modern farming methods have blessed the area with a cornucopia of different fruits and vegetables: tomatoes, red peppers, cherries, watermelons, sunflowers, grapes, strawberries, peaches, pomegranates, onions and apples- you name it, they grow it.

**SPORTS AND RECREATIONAL
CENTRE "26th OF APRIL" -
GEVGELIJA**

The sports and recreational centre "26th Of April" is located in the centre of the town, near the hotel "Jugo". The complex was built in 1983 and it includes a large sports hall with capacity of 1.800 seats, and one auxiliary hall. The large hall is used for matches and training in handball, basketball, volleyball and futsal, while the smaller one is used for training and educational purposes for the nearby school center. The hall is also suitable for matches in others sports, such as gymnastics, wrestling, judo, karate, table tennis and others. On the ground floor of the object there is also a supermarket and a fast-food restaurant.

OHRID

Ohrid is located on the eastern shore of Lake Ohrid, southwest of Skopje and east of Tirana, Albania. It has about 42,000 inhabitants, making it the seventh largest city in the country. The city is the seat of Ohrid municipality and it is rich with picturesque houses and monuments. There is a legend supported by Ottoman traveller from 15th century, Evlia Celebia, that there were 365 chapels within the town boundaries, one for every day of the year. That's why Ohrid was called Slavic Jerusalem during the medieval times.

The contemporary city of Ohrid is a descendant of the antique town of Lychnidos which was confirmed by several Byzantine sources. The name Ohrid first appeared in the year of 879. Ohrid is credited as being the likely birthplace of the Cyrillic alphabet, most probably created by St. Clement of Ohrid.

During the Byzantine period, Ohrid became an episcopal center of the Orthodox Church and the site of the first Slavic university.

Tourism is predominant today.

In 1980, Ohrid and Lake Ohrid were accepted as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO.

SPORTS HALL "BILJANINI IZVORI"

The hall, one of the most versatile sports objects in Macedonian, is a part of the sports centre called "Biljanini Izvori" and is located at the exit of the town near the legendary springs with the same name. Its capacity is 3,500 seats for handball and 4,500 for basketball matches.

The hall was opened in August 1998 with the women's handball tournament "Trophy of Macedonia", which was won by Russia. Local handball team "Kliment Ohridski" plays in the second division now and the only first division club in the city is its basketball team.

Women's Junior World Championship 2008 will be the third major handball event which will be played here.

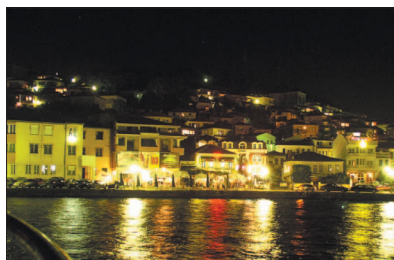
Transport

Transport in Ohrid is inexpensive and covers all areas of the city. There are frequent minibus lines from the city centre to the more distant beaches. The taxi service has been regulated by the City. Typical fare from the city centre to a more distant urban district is about 150-200 denars (3-5 euros).

Tourist attractions

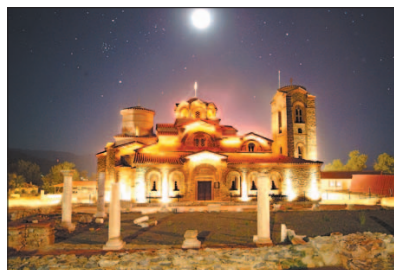
Lake Ohrid

It is probably the oldest lake in Europe and the deepest at the Balkans (288 m), preserving a unique aquatic ecosystem with more than 200 endemic species that is of worldwide importance. It was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1979. It covers an area of 358 m². It is 30.4 km long and 14.8 km wide at its maximum extent with a shoreline length of 87.53 km, shared between the Republic of Macedonia (56.02 km) and Albania (31.51 km). There are three cities on the lake's shores: Ohrid and Struga on the Macedonian side and Podgradec in Albania.



Saint Panteleimon

The most sacred and holiest site among Macedonians. The monastery is situated on a hill now known as Plaosnik. It is attributed to St. Clement of Ohrid, a disciple of St. Cyril and St. Methodius and is believed to be the first university in Europe. It was ruined by Ottomans during the end of the 16th or the beginning of the 17th century, but it has recently undergone extensive reconstruction and excavation and the church was fully reconstructed by August 2002.



Antique Theatre

It was built in the year 200 B.C. and is the only Hellenistic theatre in the country. Only the lower section of the theatre is preserved. It offers a wonderful view of the lake and Mt. Galichica.

Church of St. Sofia

One of the most important monuments in Macedonia, housing architecture and art from the Middle Ages. The main part was built in the 11th century. The interior has been preserved with frescoes from the 11th, 12th and 13th century, which represent some of the most significant achievements in Byzantine painting of the time.



VINICA

Vinica is a small town located in the eastern part of the country, nestled in the Vinica - Kocani plain, at the foothills of the mountains Plackovica and Golak, by the Vinicka and Gradecka rivers. Vinica covers 432 km² from the territory of Macedonia, and it's located on 360m-1754m above sea level.

Scientists have determined that the ancestor to Vinica was an old Byzantine settlement, known as a center where wheat was cultivated and wine was produced. It is presumed that the name Vinica originates from the fact that wine of exceptional quality was produced. Even today, the favorable climate enable the city and its vicinity to remain a region where agricultural plants are cultivated, primarily tobacco and the famous rice of Kocani and Vinica.

Vinica has very natural, historical and archeological treasures, that makes the city attractive to all the tourists. Its site makes Vinica administrative and cultural centre and a regional crossroad for Berovo, Delcevo, Radovis and the Republic of Bulgaria.

What makes Vinica especially important are the archaeological findings that have written exceptional pages in the cultural history of these areas. Besides the two antique statues of women without heads, in full size (found near the village of Kalimanci), in the vicinity of Vinica, at the archaeological site Vinicko Kale (Vinica Fortress), discovered are the famous Vinica terracotta icons from the 5th and 6th century. They are unique and are listed in the series of especially valuable world collections of archaeological findings that open spaces to new and creative scientific theories and researches.

Vinica celebrates the day when their city was freed from the occupation. That's 30th August. They also celebrate Pavlovdan 13th July, which represents the day of the city.

ROMANIA

Romania is the only former world champion in this group and the team with the biggest number of podium finishes. Generation of Amariei, Gogirla and Lecusanu did it in 1995 in Brazil and the trophy went to Romania for the second time four years later in China, with Varzaru and Rotis (now plays for Austria) in the team. Romania has two other medals in its collection: bronze from the first Championship in 1977 and then another third place in 1999. Romania is one of the regulars at the world championships, having appeared eight times by now, but missed the last one in Czech Republic, which came after its worst placement ever, 11th place at the WCh in Macedonia in 2003. New team had no problems to qualify for this tournament, beating Austria, Portugal and Bosnia and Herzegovina.

SLOVENIA

Looking solely at the number of appearances at the world championships, Slovenia is the most inexperienced team in this group. Slovenia comes to Macedonia with only one tournament behind it, debuting in 1997 at the 13th place. But the country has much richer handball history as its players were winning medals wearing Yugoslavia's shirt 'till the nineties. Although only for the second time at the world championships, Slovenia sent a strong warning to its opponents with the elimination of Norway in the qualifications. In one of the biggest upsets in the qualifications, Slovenia won the deciding match with 28:27 and, along with the victories over Czech Republic and Switzerland, verified its first participation in 11 years.

HUNGARY

Hungary is among the most constant participants at the world championships last years and this one will be its sixth in a row. Two times it came so close to the title, but at the end had to settle with the silver medal. Hungary played its first final in 2001, but Russia took the crown. This feat was repeated two years later in Macedonia but Hungary was left emptyhanded once again as Russia defended the title. This rivalry will be missed now because Russia didn't qualify, while Hungary is coming after the victories over Iceland, Ireland, Serbia and Bulgaria. Hungary was a part of the first world championship in Romania in 1977, then narrowly missed a medal two years later in Yugoslavia, finishing at the fourth place and then simply disappeared from the scene. Absence was almost 20 years long, but after the comeback in 1997, Hungary played in the semi-finals at the last four championships (two second and two fourth places).

GERMANY

Germany was a real force at the world championships in the eighties, winning medals with its both national teams, GDR and FRG. The first one played in two finals, losing them both to Soviet Union (1979 and 1983), while the second one took the bronze in 1981. Then came the reunification, but the results lacked. After the GDR's bronze in 1987, Germany had to wait for 14 years next medal to come. The now unified national team was third in 2001, increasing its medal collection to five, which makes Germany the team with most trophies in this group.

Germany missed the Championship in Czech Republic three years ago and it was the first tournament in history without German team. Now they are back after beating Lithuania, Ukraine and Italy in the qualifications.

DENMARK

The main success that the Denmark women handball representation achieved was in 1997 when they became world champions. Denmark won two silver medals in 1995 and 1987 and won the bronze in 1991 and 1999. The weakest Denmark achievement on the mundials is the 11th place in 1985 in S. Korea. On the last World Championship three years ago in Czech, Denmark won the fifth place. Also Denmark is the actual European Champion.

REGULATIONS

MATCH EVALUATION

The preliminary round is played in groups. Matches shall be evaluated as follows:

- Each match won = 2 points
- Each match drawn = 1 point for each team
- Each match lost = no points

Teams are ranked according to the total number of points gained.

If two or more teams have gained the same number of points after the group matches have been completed, placing is decided as follows

- Results in points between the teams concerned
- Goal differences in the matches between the teams concerned
- Greater number of plus goals in the matches between the teams concerned.

If the teams are still equal a decision is made between those teams with an equal number of points as follows

- Goal difference is subtracted in all matches
- Greater number of plus goals in all matches

If classification is still not possible a draw shall decide. The official IHF representative engaged at the location shall make the draw, if possible in the presence of those responsible for the teams.

If those responsible for the teams cannot be present, other co-workers selected by the IHF shall take the part.

The top three teams from each of groups A/B and C/D are put together in groups 1 and 2 (1-M/2-M) of the main round respectively. The teams ranked 4th and 5th are put together in groups 1 and 2 (1-P/2-P) of the placement round. The results of the teams from the respective preliminary round groups shall be taken into account.

PLACEMENT MATCHES, SEMI FINALS AND FINALS

After completion of the preliminary main and placement rounds, the placement matches, quarter finals, semi finals, and finals shall be played in accordance with the knock out system.

In case of a draw after regular playing time, after a break of five (5) minutes there is a first overtime period of 2x5 minutes, changing sides half way through with a one minute break in-between. Provisions to the contrary set for individual tournaments shall be primary.

If the match should still not be decided after this overtime, after a break of 5 minutes there is a second overtime period of 2x5 minutes, changing sides half way through with a one minute break in-between

Should the match still not be decided after the second overtime period, it is decided with 7-meter throws in accordance with 2.2 of the rules of the game.
