Chambliss widens lead

Raleigh, N.C. – A new Public Policy Polling survey for Georgia's Senate runoff finds Saxby Chambliss has widened his lead since the general election. He now leads Democratic challenger Jim Martin 52-46.

Compared to PPP's final pre election poll of the race, Chambliss' main gains have come with independent voters. Where he had a 44-41 lead with them before, with Libertarian Allen Buckley pulling 12%, Chambliss is now leading 53-41.

One important factor that could be helping Chambliss is that while PPP finds that black turnout is likely to be similar to what it was earlier in the month, it appears that there will be a decline in young voters relative to when the Presidential race was on the ballot. That means the percentage of voters over 65 in the electorate is likely to be a lot higher, and given Chambliss' 69-31 lead with those voters compared to Martin's 50-42 advantage with voters under 30 the age shifts could work to the Republican's favor.

"This runoff is going to be all about turnout," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "It looks like a lot of the young people Barack Obama got engaged in the process came out mostly for him earlier this month. They may have voted for Jim Martin as long as they were at the polls, but for now anyway it doesn't look like they're planning to come out *just* for Martin. That puts Saxby Chambliss in good shape headed to the final week of the campaign."


Martin leads 52-46 among respondents who said they had already voted, while Chambliss is up 54-44 with those still planning to vote. There is a significant gender gap in the numbers, with Martin leading among women but trailing by 15 with men.

PPP surveyed 871 likely voters on November 22^{nd} and 23rd. The survey's margin of error is $\pm -3.3\%$. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
