ANNUAL REPORT 2007-08

The Hon'ble Chief Guest Ms. Jayshree Raghuraman; Guests of Honour Prof. B. P. It is a matter of great privilege for me to welcome you all on the occasion of 17th Annual Day and Prize Distribution Function of Bhim Rao Ambedkar College, University of Delhi.

We are indeed honoured to have amongst us **Ms. Jayshree Raghuraman**, Director, Social Welfare and Director cum Secretary, Women & Child Development, Government of NCT of Delhi. Professor Sahu is a widely travelled and an acclaimed scholar. He was a short-term visiting fellow at South Asia Institute, Heidelberg (2000); Charles Wallace India Trust Fellow, London (2003); and Short-term visiting fellow at the University of Kiel (2003). Prof. Sahu's contribution in shaping the Indian History Congress is well recognized. He has also been Member, Academic Council, University of Delhi and University Representative on different College Governing Bodies since 2001 including our own college for the last two years.

We welcome **Mr. Jaspal Singh,** the Deputy Commissioner of Police, North East District of Delhi. He exhibits a very rich and versatile range of knowledge as reflected in his education – A topper in Economics (Hons.), MBA, LLB and Diploma in German from the University of Delhi. Before joining Indian Police Service, he had worked as a Lecturer in Management. While holding different positions like-Assistant Superintendent of Police in Traffic, Anti-Narcotics, and Superintendent of Police and so on, he earned great appreciation for his professional excellence in the areas of crime, law and order etc. He was awarded commendation by the Lt. Governor on Independence Day for his social commitment and exceptional work in Tsunami.

We are grateful to our Chairman, Mr. Ganesh Seth for being with us. I have closely interacted with him during the last eleven and half months, when I Joined this college. I found him a brilliant combination of academics, extra-curricular activities, political understanding, vision, management and decent values. A Modernite, graduate from St. Stephens College, Mr. Seth represented University of Delhi in athletics and basketball. ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Bhim Rao Ambedkar College (BRAC) is a constituent co-educational college of the University of Delhi established in 1991 by Delhi Government to cater to the needs of higher education in trans-Yamuna area. The college has its own building spread over green area of 9 acres situated at Wazirabad Road, near Yamuna Vihar, North-East District of Delhi.

With student strength of over 1600, around 88 faculty members (68 permanent) including 8 new appointments made through duly constituted selection committees, and nearly 60 members of administrative staff, the college offers a number of professional and Honours courses, such as — Business Economics, Hindi Journalism and Mass Communication, Commerce, Geography, Applied Psychology and Social Work, in addition to B. A. (Programme) and B. Com. The college is also an important study centre both for School of Open Learning (University of Delhi) and IGNOU. In order to look after the health needs of teaching and non-teaching staff, the college feels privileged to have WUS Health Centre in its premises.

Let me take this opportunity to welcome all the newly appointed teachers on behalf of the Governing Body and college family.

CROSSING FRONTIERS

In order to acknowledge the contribution of Baba Saheb towards improving the
lot of socially disadvantaged sections of the population and building up a new
India based on the principles of justice, liberty, equality and fraternity, the college
for the first time organized Baba Saheb Bhim Rao Ambedkar Memorial
Lecture on the occasion of his birth anniversary of Baba Saheb.

The first lecture of the series "Ambedkar-Gandhi Samvaad" was delivered on 14th April 2007 by Prof. Namvar Singh, a great critic of Hindi literature and the Chancellor of Mahatma Gandhi Antarashtriya Hindi Vishwavidyalaya, Wardha. The same day, Dr. Dharam Kirti, a renowned scholar of Buddhist Literature and Philosophy also delivered a lecture on "Bharat Ke Vikas Mein Baba Saheb Bhim Rao Ambedkar Ka Yogdaan". Thanks for efforts made by Dr. Anula Maurya.

- The college is one of the 20 centres in Delhi for earthquake strong ground motion station for recording and monitoring the earthquakes in Delhi under a project jointly handled by Director of Seismology Division (DST) –DU- IIT (Roorkee) (Installation, 5th November 2007).
- The college has been selected as one of the e-learning centers (out of nine chosen by the University of Delhi) under DU-ICICI partnership. It will help students to get the requisite training in the field of banking and finance.
- In this academic year, the college was accorded permission to start three new courses, viz. B. A. (Hons) Applied Psychology, B. Sc. Life Science and Physical science. However, the college could start only B.A. (Hons.) Applied Psychology due to the shortage of space.
- Our college is the East Delhi Centre for DU-NIIT joint programme for the benefit
 of undergraduate SC/ST students. The programme covers: (i) information
 technology; (ii) Oral & Written Communication in English; and (iii) Career
 Guidance and Customer Service Skills. These modules are unique in view of
 their application in the field and their usefulness for the students. The co-ordinator
 for this course was Mr. Anil Kumar.
- Two National Seminars one in Geography with Dr. R. N. Dubey as the Convenor and the other in Hindi Journalism and Mass Communication with Dr. R. P. Dwivedi as the Convenor were organized.

WORKING TOWARDS SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

LIFE SKILLS BUILDING WORKSHOP / ACTIVITIES FOR SC/ST STUDENTS

- It is a great privilege for the college that the Department of Adult, Continuing Education & Extension has selected our college as one of the centers to organize a special 5-day workshop (from 5th February 2008 onwards). It will help about 30 SC/ST students in their academic enrichment, life skills building and empowering them with self-esteem.
- Given the fact that the catchment area of the college still requires socio-economic transformation, it is exploring the possibility with UGC to work out different proposals to empower the socially disadvantaged students to undertake some income-generating activities and get gainfully employed in different spheres of life. The college is also negotiating institutional arrangements with IGNOU for this work.
- The college is working out short-term job-oriented courses for its own students and other youth deprived of opportunities. Special thanks to Dr. Anula Maurya, Dr. Atul Pratap Singh and the IGNOU team.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR GIRLS

The college is also doing a bit for women development through gender justice and economic empowerment. The NSS unit in collaboration with Jan Shiksha Sansthan, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India has restarted the vocational courses on dress-making, embroidery and beauty care etc. to impart free vocational training to the girls of weaker sections of the society free of cost.

FEE CONCESSION AND STUDENTS AID FUND COMMITTEE

The committee (with Dr. Shashi as Convenor) works to promote the education of the poor and needy students. Full freeship to 35 students and financial assistance to 22 students from different Departments were given.

SELF-DEFENCE TRAINING PROGRAMME

Supporting and sustaining the women empowerment programme of Chief Minister of Delhi, a 15-days programme (camp) was organized (with Dr. Sarla Bhardwaj as Convenor) from August 21 to September 4, 2007. 185 girl students participated enthusiastically in this programme. Mr. V. P. Singh, Deputy Commissioner of North-East, Delhi inaugurated the programme, which was carried forward in the leadership of Neeta Malhotra, ACP. A competent team from crime against women cell imparted the training to girl students. Prof. Nayanjot Lahiri, Dean of Colleges, University of Delhi presided over the valedictory function in the presence of Mr. H. P. S. Virak (DCP, Crime Against Women Cell). The girls gave demonstration of various techniques of self-defence very confidently.

WORKING TOWARDS NATION BUILDING

NCC (BOYS WING)

The college has three wings of NCC: Navel, Army and Girls, working under the leadership of Associate NCC officer, Lt. Cdr. (Dr.) R. B. Solanki, Capt. (Dr.) M. S. Vats and Ms.Tushti Bhardwaj from this year, respectively. Every year about 250 students are enrolled in these wings.

48 cadets of the college qualified the 'B' certificate examination. Two of our cadets - S.U.O. Yogesh Kumar and J. U. O. Harsh Chaudhary, secured 'A' grade in this examination and 15 cadets qualified the 'C' certificate examination. Former S. U. O. Vishal Gautam and J. U. O. Mukesh Sharma got 'B' grade. During the year 2007-08, 24 cadets participated in CATC, Nainital.

Our college team obtained the 2nd position in the **Guard of Honour** performance. J.U.O Amit Kumar was selected for the mountaineering basic course. Sgt. Vikas Mehta was selected for the Republic Day Camp. 4 cadets participated in NIC, Dehradun and NIC, Ranchi; 6 cadets participated in Hemkund Trekking; 5 cadets participated in Advance Leadership Camp in West Bengal; 8 cadets were selected for Jammu & Kashmir and 19 cadets participated in Army Attachment Camp at Delhi Cantt. One of our cadets participated in NIC, Delhi Cantt; 5 cadets of the college attended NIC, Bihar; 7 cadets participated in North East Region Trekking Camp and 5 cadets participated in NIC, Tamil Nadu.

Our college team won the 2nd prize in quiz competition and line layout competition. Two of our cadets participated in NIC, Nagpur; one cadet got 2nd prize in mimicry and group dance; 13 cadets participated in NCC day held on 25th November at India Gate and 25 cadets participated in awareness campaign by Delhi Metro on 24th November, 2007 on the occasion of NCC day. The college organized HIV/ AIDS awareness programme, in which around 200 cadets participated.

NCC (GIRLS WING)

The NCC, Girls wing, of the college has 100 cadets. During the year 2007-08, 24 cadets of the college qualified 'B' level certificate; two of them - S.U.O. Vandana Singh and J.U.O. Renu Chaudhary, scored 'A' grade in this examination; and our 13 cadets qualified the highest-level examination of the NCC i.e. 'C' certificate. Our 19 cadets participated in Combined Annual Training Camp (CATC), Dehradun, held during June 2-13, 2007.

One of our cadets, S.U.O. Vandana Singh, selected as the camp leader and camp senior from among 600 cadets from all over India, got the first prize for the best commander in drill competition. She was selected as the only cadet from the two Delhi Girls Battalions for National Integration Camp (NIC), Navlankar, held at Chandigarh during 24th June to 6th July, 2007. Our cadet scored the 2nd position in National Shooting Championship. Four of our cadets were selected in the Pre-Thal Sainik Camp held during 29th August to 9th September, 2007. One of them Sgt. Kalpana Bansal was selected in the final Thal Sainik Camp held during 24th September, to 6th October, 2007.

Our 21 cadets participated in CATC, Bawana (October 9-20, 2007). A few among them S.U.O. Durgesh Nandini, Preeti, Savita and Anjali Goswami excelled in the cultural and sports activities during the camp. Five of our cadets participated in National Integration Camp, Delhi Cantt. (October 8-18, 2007); 5 cadets participated in Basic leadership Camp in Gujrat (October 14-27, 2007). Our 3 cadets participated in NIC, Nagpur (January 3-16, 2008).

Two of our cadets, S.U.O. Vandana Singh and J.U.O. Renu Chaudhary participated in Pre-Republic Day Camp; 25 cadets under the leadership of Sgt. Neha participated in **Prime Minister Rally** (January 18-28, 2008). Two of our cadets, Vandana and Renu, qualified the staff selection Board (Gwalior, M.P.).

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The NSS unit of the college (with Dr. R. N. Dubey as Programme Officer) with 250 volunteers for the environmental improvement, social integration, community development and health and consumer awareness organized the following activities:

- Blood Donation Camp in collaboration with the Rotary Club, New Delhi on 24th September, 2007 to celebrate the NSS Day;
- A 10-day special camp (3-12 October, 2007) to survey 'Environmental Perception and Human Behaviour' in Yamuna Vihar, Ganga Vihar, Ashok Nagar and Harijan Basti of Gokalpur village, Delhi.
- A workshop on 'Global Warming and Role of Youth', chaired by Dr. R. B. Singh, Department of Geography, Delhi School of Economics, University of Delhi.
- One-day seminar on AIDS with an Information Centre in collaboration with VCTC-AIDS Programme of W.U.S. Health Centre, University of Delhi (2nd November, 2007).
- An orientation programme, in which Prof. R. P. Mishra, a prominent Gandhian and former Vice-Chancellor of Allahabad University and Prof. P. B. Singh, Banaras Hindu University, were the main speakers.

Five volunteers of the unit participated in the Inter-College debate organized by the NSS Centre of the University of Delhi on December 28, 2007. The unit participated in the Disaster Management Meet under Bhagidari Scheme, organized by the office of the SDM, Shahadara, Delhi.

The unit is planning to organize a regional seminar on 'Management of Metropolitan Cities and the Role of NSS' in the first week of March, 2008.

SPORTS AND ANNUAL SPORTS DAY

Students with excellent sports background were selected for admission in 2007-08 under the guidance of Dr. K. K. Sharma. Our teams came off with flying colours at University and National levels and carved a niche on the map of University of Delhi.

Cross Country: Our team won the gold medal in Delhi University Inter-College Tournament.

Net Ball: Our men team won the gold medal and the women team participated in the Inter-College Tournament. Net Ball team got 1st place in North East Zonal Tournament held at Pt. R. S. University, Rampur (Chattishgarh) and 3rd place in All India Inter-University Tournament held at Nagarjun University, Vijaywada.

Archery: 5th place in Inter-College Tournament. Nisha Tomar, Ayush Sharma and Surender represented All India Inter-Varsity held at Punjab University (Chandigarh). Nisha Tomar also won Silver Medal in All India University. Ayush participated in National Tournament held at Amaravati (Maharastra).

Volley Ball: Our team reached in quarter final. Rajneesh participated in North-East Zone Inter-varsity and won silver medal at Barailly and also at All India Inter-University, Aurangabad (Maharashtra).

Pistol Shooting: The college men team won Silver Medal losing the Gold by just a margin of one point. Vijay Tomar won Gold Medal in individual position and also participated in All India Inter-University Championship.

Soft Ball: Our College team won the Silver Medal in Inter-College Tournament, and also won Silver Medal in Sr. Delhi State Soft Ball Championship. Lalit Gupta, Dilshad, Surlin Kumar and Ramprakash participated in All India Inter-University Tournament held at GNDU, Amritsar. Yogesh, Sumit, Sushil, Pankaj, Dilshad, Santosh, Lalit, Seema, Sonam, Kiran and Shivam participated in Sr. National Tournament held at Cuttack (Orissa). Our women team also participated in Inter-College and Delhi State Softball Championship.

Wrestling: Anuj Chaudhary won silver medal in Inter-College Tournament.

Cricket: Our men team beat Sri Aurobindo College in Inter-College Tournament.

Hockey: Our college men team participated in this game for the first time. Our Chess, Table Tennis, Badminton and Basket Ball teams also participated in different tournaments.

Rifle Shooting: Our men team won 5th position in Inter-College Tournament. Dhruv, Sandeep Kumar and Vipul Chaudhary participated in National Squad.

Base Ball: Santosh got silver medal in All India Inter-varsity Tournament, Sri Nagar University (Kashmir), though our College Base Ball team participated in Inter College Tournament for the first time

Students of all subjects are examined through written exams as per the university guidelines. Teachers observations and remarks are shown to students for further improvement. Both teaching and non-teaching staff deserve compliments for their wonderful work.

PLACEMENT UNIT

The placement unit (with Mr. Navin Kumar as Convenor) undertakes activities to facilitate a platform for various job-providing agencies/companies visiting the college. This year some leading companies including IBM, ICICI, Apex Laboratories visited our campus providing job-opportunities to students. Companies like – Nestle, Wipro and a few others are scheduled to pay a visit to the college in due course.

A large number of students participated and the first prize was bagged by Neetu Sharma, the second by Sakshi and the third by Anubhav. In order to boost creative talent of students, a recitation of self-composed poems was held on September 19, 2007. The humorous poems regaled the listeners with irresistible laughter, whereas love poems evoked tender emotions in them. At the same time, there were several satirical poems echoeing the ever-increasing rampant corruption in India. The first prize for the event was won by Anubhav, the second by Avinash and the third by Chanchal.

In order to hone the student's gift of gab, a 'Vaad –Vivaad Pratiyogita' was organized, in which several teams participated. The first prize for this competition was given to Chanchal, the second to Ashu and the third to Sulekha. The winners for all these competitions were given Rs. 500/-, 400/- and 300/- as first, second and third cash prizes besides the certificates of merit.

The 'Hindi Saptah' was conducted along with the oragnisation of symposium on the topic 'Nij Bhasha Unnati Ahai, Sab Unnati Ko Mool'. The Principal in his inaugural remarks gave a wide perspective of issues highlighting that the progress of language and dynamic economic changes forcing universalisation of language, are taking place simultaneously. As keynote speaker, Prof. Ajay Tiwari, Department of Hindi, University of Delhi overwhelmed Hindi lovers by enlightening them about the progress made by the Hindi Language. Speaking from the presidential chair, Dr. Vishwanath Tripathi, a renowned critic and Hindi poet gave apt illustrations from daily life to establish that the progress of India lay alone in the progress of Hindi.

A week long academic tour (17-22 October, 2007) to Nainital was organized for students of the Department. With the aim of imparting practical knowledge to students of Hindi Journalism and Mass Communication, the specialists as guest speakers were involved to acquaint students with the subtle and technical aspects of the field in a systematic manner. Under the joint aegis of the Hindi Department, University of Delhi and the Institute of Life Long Learning, a media workshop was organized in which all teachers of the Department of Hindi participated.
