Jetstar further grows services to Bali via expansion of Darwin international hub

Daily <u>Brisbane-Darwin-Denpasar*</u> route to commence 3 December 2008 One way web fare specials from \$199 AUD

Australia's low fares airline Jetstar will introduce a daily <u>Brisbane-Darwin-Denpasar*</u> service from 3 December 2008, significantly boosting its international operations between Australia and the popular Indonesian holiday destination. (*Subject to regulatory approval).

Jetstar's new daily A320 service, to operate through the carrier's expanding international and domestic hub in Darwin, will provide one stop and highly competitive access to Bali from Brisbane, Sydney and Melbourne.

The services will complement Jetstar's existing direct long haul services to Bali from Sydney (4 times weekly) and Melbourne (2 times weekly) with its fleet of two class A330-200 aircraft.

Jetstar is now offering special JetSaver Light one way sale fares at <u>Jetstar.com</u> for <u>Darwin-Denpasar*</u> from \$199, <u>Brisbane-Darwin-Denpasar*</u> from \$249, <u>Melbourne-Darwin-Denpasar</u> from \$383 and <u>Sydney-Darwin-Denpasar</u> from \$388. (JetSaver Light Fares, terms & conditions apply).

The special web fares are now available between 2000hrs (8pm) and 2300hrs (11pm) AEST on Wednesday 10 September 2008 unless seats sell out prior. The special offer is for travel between two periods: 3 – 11 December 2008* and 10 February – 28 March 2009* and conditions apply (fares subject to availability, selected days and flights only, excluding travel on public holiday and school holidays). Fares paid by credit or charge card attract an additional \$3 per passenger per domestic flight plus \$5 per passenger per international flight.

Jetstar's every day one way web fares (JetSaver Light) between <u>Darwin-Denpasar*</u> start from \$239 and from \$399 on the Brisbane-Darwin-Denpasar* route at Jetstar.com.

Jetstar will also expand <u>Brisbane-Darwin*</u> domestic frequencies from 6 to 13 times weekly, adding a new daylight service between both cities.

The new services will expand Jetstar's Darwin hub operations to 69 weekly domestic and international services out of Darwin with its single class fleet of 177 seat A320s.

Jetstar Group General Manager Commercial Bruce Buchanan said as the largest Australian airline serving the Bali market, the new low fare services were a response to the island's recovery of its tourism industry.

"Australians holidaying in Bali has been growing strongly with ABS statistics showing a 63 per cent jump in visitors in 2007. This year alone Australians traveling to Bali has risen by 60 per cent," Mr Buchanan said.

"Future Jetstar services to Bali from Darwin* and commencing from Perth* on 27 October will enable us to further grow our Australian services into South East Asia including Bali, whilst also building on Jetstar's expanding pan Asian network.

"Jetstar passengers departing Brisbane on our new daily service can now travel through Darwin to Bali on our low fares to other international destinations on the Jetstar network such as Singapore and Ho Chi Minh City. "From Darwin our through international services to Singapore and Vietnam opens up a further 22 South East Asian markets and destinations such as Bangkok and Hong Kong at affordable fares, underlining the strategic thinking behind our Darwin expansion plans."

Mr Buchanan said the new Jetstar services will offer a Qantas code share in line with existing Jetstar international and domestic flights.

The Qantas Group has today lodged an application to the International Air Services Commission (IASC) for Jetstar's newly proposed international services.

Jetstar's daily <u>Brisbane-Darwin-Denpasar*</u> service will operate as a domestic to international connecting flight through Darwin with passengers departing from Jetstar's domestic facility at Brisbane Airport, checking in only once for the flight through to Denpasar. The same applies southbound from Denpasar International Airport.

Jetstar passengers on its new international services to Bali will be offered pre-flight seat allocation, with meals, comfort packs and video on demand also available for purchase on board.

Mr Buchanan said Jetstar was committed to offering the lowest fares in the market, by providing our customers with choice in how they travel, with initiatives such as JetSaver Light and Extra Leg Room Seating.

Jetstar's <u>Darwin-Adelaide</u> services will offer a revised schedule from 3 December 2008 operating 4 times weekly. Jetstar's Darwin services from 3 December 2008 are:
