Graduation Requirements and Curriculum

Students complete 27 credits to meet graduation requirements. Of these credits, 23.5 are required, while 3.5 are taken as elective courses. Athletes and other extra curricular activities are not part of the school day. Many students take additional courses from the core subject areas to fulfill their 27 credit requirement. In addition to their required credits, every student completes 90 Christian service hours before graduating. In May 2008, a total of 295 Advanced Placement examinations were written by 208 students in English Language, English Literature, Biology, Physics, Calculus, U.S. History, World History, Government and Spanish Language, AP Art History, and Economics. Seventy-three percent of participants scored 3 or above in this expanded curriculum program to earn college credit.
