Extremely Close Race in Missouri

Raleigh, N.C. – The race for President in Missouri is so close we have to give the results of our final poll in decimal points. Barack Obama leads John McCain 49.4 to 48.6 in the state, an outcome that needless to say is within the poll's margin of error.

Obama continues to struggle with keeping his deficit among white voters in the state within single digits. He trails 55-43 with them but makes up for it with a 93-7 lead among black voters. The ultimate winner in Missouri could well be determined by the relative proportions of white and black voters within the electorate.

In a result that underscores just how truly competitive the state is, the candidates are dead even among independent voters, 48-48.

"We're finding in our polling that a lot of battleground states are really close but there's nowhere we've found a closer race than in Missouri," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "There's no doubt the outcome there will hinge on turnout and which candidate can do a better job of getting his voters out to the polls."

One race that's not headed for a close finish is that for Governor. Jay Nixon leads Kenny Hulshof 58-38, by far his largest advantage yet in a Public Policy Polling survey.


In Missouri down ballot races Lieutenant Governor Peter Kinder and Secretary of State Robin Carnahan have clear leads. The races for Treasurer and Attorney General are going right down to the wire with the Democratic nominee having a small advantage in each. The winners of those races will probably have more to do with Barack Obama and John McCain than they do with Brad Lager or Chris Koster.

PPP surveyed 1,343 likely voters from October 31st to November 2nd. The survey's margin of error is +/-2.7%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
