



Oregon Legislature Creates the State Land Use Program



- Senate Bill 10
- Senate Bills 100, 101
- Other Early Laws:
 - Farm Tax Deferral (1961)
 - EFU Zoning (1963)
 - The Beach Bill (1967)
 - Willamette River
 Greenway (1967)
 - OCCDC (1971)



- Creates Land Conservation and Development Commission (LCDC)
- Creates Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD)
- Directs LCDC to adopt Statewide Planning Goals
- Requires all cities and counties to adopt comprehensive land use plans consistent with the statewide Goals
- Requires state agencies to comply with Goals and coordinate with local land use plans

LCDC Adopts the Goals

- Interim Goals Established by Statute
- LCDC Holds Hearings around the state
- Goal Adoption 1974 1977
 - Goals 1-14 (December 1974)
 - Greenway Goal 15 (December 1975)
 - Coastal Goals 16-19 (Dec. 1977)

- LUBA Created (1979)
- Post Acknowledgement (1981)
- Periodic Review (1981)
- Needed Housing (1983)
- PAPA and PR Reform (1991)
- HB 3661(1993)
- Regional Problem Solving (1995)
- Economic Development (2001,03)



LCDC Refines Policies

- Administrative Rules and Amended Goals
 - Farm and Forest dwellings and land divisions
 - Needed Housing
 - Destination Resorts
 - Transportation Planning Rules (TPR)
 - Rural Communities
 - Rural Residential Lot Sizes
 - Riparian, Wetlands, other Resources
 - Aggregate

The Courts Shape Oregon Land Use Planning

- Early Landmark Rulings
 - Fasano, Baker
 - primarily based on constitution rather than statutes
- Review of LCDC Acknowledgement Decisions
- Later Landmark Cases:
 - Curry County
 - Lane County
 - Macpherson


LUBA

- 1973 1979 (Pre-LUBA)
 - Writ of Review to Circuit Court
 - Goal Issues Appealed to LCDC
- Established 1979
 - Instead of Circuit Courts and LCDC
 - Goal decisions reviewed by LCDC
- Statutes Revised 1985, 1987
- Today: Reviews all local land use decisions
 - Except Periodic Review and M37
- Decisions appealed to Court of Appeals

Citizen Ballot Initiatives

- Initial Measures Fail to Overturn the Program
 - Measure 11 (1970) Failed 44% 56%
 - Measure 10 (1976) Failed 39% 61%
 - Measure 10 (1978) Failed 39% 61%
 - Measure 6 (1982) Failed 45% 55%
- Property Rights Measures
 - Measure 56 (1999) Passed 80% 20%
 - Measure 2 (2000) Failed 47% 53%
 - Measure 7 (2000) Passed (unconstitutional)
 - Measure 37 (2004) Passed 61% 39%

Overview: Changing Focus of Oregon Land Use Program Through the Decades

- 1970s: SB 100, The Goals, New Plans
- 1980s: Acknowledgement, Periodic Review
- 1990s: Clarity and detail, Focus on Urban, Conflict Resolution, Revised PR
- 2000s: Economic Development, BM 37, Strengthened Partnerships
