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QUEBEC ELECTION 2008

Liberals Lead, Parti Québécois Close Behind in Quebec Race

Action Démocratique du Québec would see a dramatic drop after serving as the province's official opposition.

[MONTREAL – Dec. 5, 2008] – The governing Liberal Party of Quebec is ahead in the Canadian province's legislative race, a new Angus Reid Strategies poll has found.

The survey also shows that support for the sovereignist Parti Québécois (PQ) is strong following a week of political turmoil in Ottawa, and suggests that the conservative Action Démocratique du Québec (ADQ)—which served as the official opposition in the last legislature—will experience significant losses.

KEY FINDINGS

Voting Intention: Liberal Party 42%, Parti Québécois 36%, Action Démocratique du Québec 13%, Québec Solidaire 5%, Green Party 3%

From December 4 to December 5, 2008 Angus Reid Strategies conducted an online survey among 914 randomly selected Quebec adults who are Angus Reid Forum panelists and are absolutely certain to vote on the Dec. 8 provincial election. The margin of error—which measures sampling variability—is +/-3.2%, 19 times out of 20. The results have been statistically weighted according to the most current education, age, gender language, and region Census data to ensure a sample representative of the entire adult population of Quebec.

In the online survey of a representative

provincial sample of 914 Quebec adults who are absolutely certain to cast a ballot on Monday's provincial election, 42 per cent of respondents would vote for the Liberals, led by current premier Jean Charest, while 36 per cent would back the PQ, commanded by Pauline Marois.

Mario Dumont's ADQ is a distant third with 13 per cent, followed by Québec Solidaire with five per cent, and the Green Party of Quebec with three per cent.
