# ENGLAND CRICKET STAR ALASTAIR COOK SETS THE PACE FOR THE 2008 STANDARD CHARTERED GREAT CITY RACE

England batsman Alastair Cook set a blistering time of 3 minutes and 50 seconds as part of The Standard Chartered Great City Race 'Treadmill Challenge' which was set up to kick-start this year's event and encourage city workers to get in shape ahead of the run on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> July. Cook appeared at Standard Chartered's new global head office in the City along with their European Chief Executive Brendon Hopkins and Mr Motivator, supporter of the race's official charity partner, Breakthrough Breast Cancer. The 5k run, now in its fourth year, passes by some of London's most important landmarks including the London Stock Exchange and St Paul's Cathedral.

Cook's time however was only good enough to tie with Standard Chartered employee and keen runner Jenny Lundgren as they both came in at an impressive 3 minutes and 50 seconds. **Cook** commented, "It is a great pleasure to be here today in the heart of London's financial hub to launch The Standard Chartered Great City Race. Although cricketers are now fitter than they have ever been I wasn't able to beat Jenny but I am still delighted to be able to match her time. She is obviously an excellent runner and I hope our times will give city workers the encouragement they need to get up from behind their desks and get involved."

Brendon Hopkins, CEO Europe, Standard Chartered Bank, added, "I am delighted to welcome both Alastair and Mr Motivator here today to our new office to launch what will certainly be a bigger and better race than ever before.
