About the Scottish Funding Council

The Scottish Further and Higher Education Funding Council (The Scottish Funding Council) is the body that distributes funding for teaching and learning, research and other activities in Scotland's colleges and universities. There are 43 colleges and *19 higher education institutions funded by the Scottish Funding Council (SFC).

The SFC is a non-Departmental Public Body (NDPB) of the Scottish Government and was established in 2005. The main activities of the Council and its executive staff are:

*20 after 1 August 2008 when the Scottish Agricultural College became an SFC funded body.

- developing and implementing policies and strategies for learning provision, research and knowledge exchange in support of Scottish government priorities;
- allocating public funding to colleges and universities for the provision of further and higher education, research, and for the costs of staff, buildings and equipment, and for other specific initiatives and strategic developments;
- working with the quality assessment agencies (Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Education in the college sector and the Quality Assurance Agency in the university sector) to assess and enhance the quality of learning programmes;
- supporting colleges and universities in their funding and management of major capital projects to develop their infrastructure for teaching, learning and research;
- collecting, evaluating and publishing relevant statistical data and other evidence to enable Scottish Ministers, the Council, colleges and universities, other interested bodies and the public generally to be better informed about further and higher education;
- holding Scotland's colleges and universities accountable for delivering the quality and relevance of further and higher education and research sought by Scottish Ministers, for achieving best value from public funds, and for managing their financial and other resources in a sustainable way; and
- regulating as necessary the use of public funding by colleges and universities and their activities so as to safeguard the public interest and promote high standards of governance and administration.

The Council also provides resources to colleges to support learners on further education programmes, in accordance with policies determined by the Scottish Government. Funding for learners on higher education programmes is provided by another body, the Students Award Agency for Scotland.


The Council distributed over £1.6 billion in 2007-08 to Scotland's colleges and universities through formula grants for teaching and research.






Number of non-home students at SFC-funded colleges by domicile, 2006-07




Students at SFC-funded universities by headcount, 2006-07

Number of non-home students at SFC-funded universities by domicile, 2006-07



Income of colleges over last three years




