*The following revisions should be noted in the “1 In 31” report, effective March 24, 2009. Accurate figures are in **bold**. Originally published numbers appear in brackets.*

Report

- p. 1: “**seven** [eight] times as many new dollars went to prisons”
- p. 8: “**278,805** [278,808] adults who are behind bars” (also appears p. 33 and p. 42)
- p. 11: “an increase of **336** [330] percent”
- p. 11: “just **\$2.52** [\$2.53] billion on probation” (also appears in figure, along with “**\$21.17** [\$21.18] billion”)
- p. 12: “our **33** [34] surveyed states”
