St. Xavier High School, founded in 1831, is a Catholic college preparatory school for young men conducted by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). Admission is selective based upon a qualifying examination and previous academic performance. Approximately $50 \%$ of those who take the entrance examination are offered admission. $99 \%$ of the graduates each year enter a four-year college or university program.
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Students enrolled at Saint Xavier High School reside in all areas of greater Cincinnati, including northern Kentucky and southeastern Indiana. The student body is approximately $80 \%$ Roman Catholic. The remaining $20 \%$ of students includes other Christian denominations and the Jewish, Hindu, Buddhist and Islamic faiths. There is an $11 \%$ minority population in the school. $26 \%$ of the students receive assistance through St. Xavier's financial aid program.

All 1559 young men at St. Xavier High School are enrolled in an authentic college preparatory program. St. Xavier is accredited by the Ohio Catholic School Accrediting Association, the North Central Association, and the Ohio Department of Education.
