Seven new H1N1 cases in Alaska

Current confirmed case count is 21

(Anchorage, AK) — As of June 12, 2009, the Alaska Department of Health and Social Services has confirmed seven new cases of H1N1 in Alaska.

- 1. female in her 60s, Anchorage; mild illness with onset a few days after a family member returned from a trip Outside.
- 2. female in her 30s, Fairbanks, contact with previous confirmed case.
- 3. male in his 40s, Fairbanks, onset June 7. No travel history.
- 4. male in his 50s, Skagway, no further information.
- 5. male in his 30s, Juneau, no recent travel history. No further information.
- 6. female in her 20s, Juneau, recent travel history to Lower 48. No further information.
- 7. male in his 20s, Homer, onset June 3, one day after travel Outside.

No additional information is currently available on these cases.

Alaska's current case count is now 21.

Confirmed numbers may fluctuate on our H1N1 case table on the Epidemiology page as cases are updated with more current information. Such is the nature of epidemiological investigations.
