2008/09 WANDRRA ELIGIBLE DISASTER PROCLAMATION NOTIFICATION Tropical Cyclone Dominic and associated flooding – 27 January 2009

The above event has been declared an *eligible disaster* under the Western Australia Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (WANDRRA), and pursuant to Section 4.2 of the Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements Determination 2007, issued by the Australian Government Minister for Local Government, Territories and Roads.

Although Tropical Cyclone Dominic was downgraded to below tropical cyclone intensity shortly after passing over the WA coastline on 27 January 2009, it was directly responsible for heavy rain and the resultant flooding across the Pilbara, Gascoyne, Goldfields and south coast.

Damage reports received to date indicate that the damage/losses sustained appear largely related to the road network infrastructure, with some costs associated with counter disaster operations. The Local Government districts affected by the event are as follows:

Local Governments and MRWA are continuing to investigate and assess the damage caused by this event and are working closely to restore or replace the affected roads.

Consideration will also be given to proposals involving the *betterment* of roads to a more disasterresilient standard than its pre-disaster standard.

Should claims in respect of any other *eligible measures* be identified, these will be dealt with on their merits.
