

DEBORAH LOCKE
MANAGER ELSIE WOMENS REFUGE



Debbie Locke a former Detective is the Manager of Elsie Women's Refuge. She is also the author of the book - "Watching the Detectives" which looks at the Wood Royal Commission into corruption within the NSW Police Force.

Elsie' Refuge was the first Womens Refuge in Australia and the second in the world. They have been in Glebe for 34 years. They give emergency short term accommodation to women and children escaping domestic violence.

Elsie Refuge will be shortly opening a number of houses for young Aboriginal parents. They run outreach programs and give Court Support along with many other projects. CBD Rotary has been supporting Elsie Womens Refuge and members namely Diane and Christine Malcolm have

Below I quote part of Kalinda's letter;

"The refuge and the residents need good quality items. As a guide, think about whether you'd be happy to have the items seen in your home or your children wearing the clothes.

You may be get creative and put together "starter packs", for example: kitchen:-tea towels, glasses, crockery, cutlery, utensils, saucepans, storage containers (staple food such as tea, coffee, salt, pepper etc) bathroom: Face washers, towels, soap shampoo, conditioner, brush, comb, toothbrushes, toothpaste For the bedroom:-doona, doona cover, sheets, pillowcases, pillows, alarm clock, etc"

The tour is from \$5,499.00 per person twin share plus airport and government taxes of \$570.00 per person. The single supplement is \$1,900.00. A business class upgrade is available at an extra cost of \$3,199.00 per person. Rotarians will depart from their nearest capital city with Malaysia Airlines to Kuala Lumpur where they will join John and Susan Wakefield before heading for India
