- 1955 - MSSSA disbanded.
- 1956 - The Associated Schools (TAS) formed from the private schools remaining.

- At the end of 1998, a group of eight schools resigned from the Association to form a separate body.
- 2000 - The Association expanded to include girls' sport, with the following schools joining from The Independent Schools Association and The Co-Educational Schools: Loreto, Stuartholme, Scots PGC, West Moreton, Cannon Hill, Forest Lake and Rivermount.
- 2004 - Springfield joins.
- During 2007. The Association resolved to become totally Co-Educational from the commencement of the 2009 school year. Subsequently, at the end of 2008, Stuartholme School and Loreto College resigned. This change coincided with the closure of Marist College Rosalie, one of only two original schools remaining.
- 2009 - Faith joins.
