

### **PORT MODERNIZATION**

- ◆ The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) dedicated \$720 million to improve land ports of entry (LPOE), while promoting economic growth and job creation. Of this amount, \$420 million was appropriated to address modernization needs within the CBP-owned LPOE inventory.
- In order to best support the aggressive schedule set forth by ARRA, Design/Build contractors will perform the Los Ebanos LPOE modernization.
- A design/build contract is a process in which the government contracts directly with one entity that is to provide both design and construction services. CBP has chosen to use design/build contracts for the port modernization efforts because it better supports the aggressive project schedule required by ARRA.
- The Los Ebanos LPOE was constructed in 1979 to the specifications of legacy agencies. The inspection facility is located in Hidalgo County on Flores Street, across the international border from Diaz Ordaz, Tamaulipas, Mexico.



## **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

- ♦ All current facilities will be replaced by newly constructed modern facilities.
- Modernized facilities will improve security, officer safety and efficacy, and will support the latest inspection technologies, in addition to facilitating legitimate trade and travel.
- ♦ New port layouts will be based on prototype designs that support CBP's current operational mission and will be adaptable to future needs.
- Port area and structures will be expanded to support current operations and to enhance traffic safety and circulation configuration.
- The port will remain open and operational during construction.
- In the spirit of national and local economic stimulus, CBP will infuse capital into the marketplace quickly while also effectively addressing operational deficiencies at the ports.
- Emphasis placed on small business engagement through communications and contracting activities. Subcontracting plans were included in the source selection process and all business opportunities are posted to <a href="https://www.fedbizopps.gov">www.fedbizopps.gov</a>.
