Pro Career Highlights: Participated in NBA training camp with the Washington Wizards in the fall of 2006. Was listed on the roster of the Wizards during the 2005-06 season, but spent the majority of the year playing with the Roanoke Dazzle in the NBA Developmental League. Averaged 14.9 points, 7.7 rebounds, and 1.8 blocks. Ranked second in the league in field goal percentage (.588). As a rookie with the Wizards in 2004-05, spent the majority of the season on the injured list. Appeared in six games, averaging 1.8 points and 0.7 rebounds in 3.3 minutes a contest.

Played with Criollos de Caguas in Puerto Rico each summer from 2001 to 2004. In 2004, averaged 20.5 points, 9.5 rebounds, and 2.4 blocked shots. In 2003, averaged 12.2 points and 8.6 rebounds. Earned the league's Most Improved Player award. In 2002, averaged 2.4 points and 2.6 rebounds. In 2001, averaged 1.2 points and 1.8 rebounds in five games.

A member of the Puerto Rican National Team. At the 2003 World Championships for Junior Men, averaged 11.0 points and 11.5 rebounds. Tallied 17 points, 21 rebounds, and five blocked shots vs. Turkey and 22 points and 14-rebounds vs. Australia. At the 2003 Global Games in Dallas, averaged 12.8 points and 5.4 rebounds. At the 2003 Pan American Games, helped Puerto Rico capture a bronze medal.
