Senior (2007-08): Averaged 4.5 points and 1.9 rebounds. Started three times. Scored in double figures in five games. Recorded a season-high 14 points on 6-for-9 shooting vs. Texas. Registered 13 points vs. North Carolina A&T. Contributed 11 points at Nebraska. Posted 12 points and a season-high eight rebounds vs. Michigan State.

Junior (2006-07): Averaged 10.1 points, 4.2 rebounds, and 1.5 assists in 21.8 minutes a contest. Started 29 of 30 games. Scored in double figures 14 times. Recorded a career-high 28 points on 9-for-13 shooting, 8-for-8 from the free throw line vs. Kansas State. Tallied 24 points and a season-high nine rebounds at Texas. Recorded 21 points, eight rebounds, and three assists vs. Coppin State. Scored 14 points at Kansas.

Sophomore (2005-06): Averaged 9.6 points and 4.8 rebounds in 27.2 minutes a contest. Started 27 of 28 games. Scored in double figures 14 times. Posted season-high 21 points on 8-for-12 shooting at Oklahoma. Registered first career double-double with 19 points and a career-high 11 rebounds vs. Eastern Illinois. Tallied a team-high 18 points vs. Kansas State. Recorded 20 points in the season opener vs. Sam Houston State.

Freshman (2004-05): Averaged 5.1 points and 1.9 rebounds in 16.8 minutes a contest. Started six times. Scored in double figures five times, with a season-high 12 points vs. Texas Tech. Tallied 11 points and a season-high eight rebounds at Colorado. Scored 11 points at Texas A&M. Registered 11 points on perfect 4-for-4 shooting vs. Indiana.
