Where is it? Mundaring Weir Road, Mundaring.

Traveling time: 1hr from Perth. Take Great Eastern Highway from Midland,

or Mundaring Weir Road from Kalamunda

Fees: None

What to do: Bushwalking, picnicking, wildlife observation, photography. Facilities: Wood barbecues (BYO wood), toilets, shaded picnic areas.

Best Seasons: Late Autumn, winter, spring.

Situated to the west of Mundaring Weir Road in the Shires of Mundaring and Kalamunda, this 3000 hectare park includes the popular recreation sites of Fred Jacoby Park, South Ledge, North Ledge, Farrell Grove, The Dell, Gungin Gully, Pimelia Mycumbene and Grevillea Mycumbene.

Mundaring National Park was created under the State Government's *Protecting Our Old Growth Forests* Policy and was gazetted in 1995 as a National Park. The current name (Mundaring National Park) may change at some point in the future as a result of public consultation and management planning processes.



Facilities



The many recreation sites listed above have shaded picnic areas, wood barbecues, toilets, and a variety of walk trails are located at some sites.

Fred Jacoby Park contains one of the largest living English Oak trees in Western Australia. A boardwalk enables visitors to get in under the canopy of this 140 year old heritage listed tree, whilst protecting the tree roots from compaction.

The Golden View Lookout at South Ledge provides panoramic views over Lake CY O'Connor, Mundaring Weir and the Helena River Valley.

The Dell is a great location to access the area's mountain bike and walking trails from, whilst North Ledge and Farrell Grove are quiet picnic areas.


Be Careful: Your safety in natural environments is our concern, but your responsibility.

Be Clean: There are no bins provided, so please take your rubbish home with you.


Be Cool: Please use the fire rings provided and only light small fires. No fires are permitted on days of High, Very High or Extreme Fire Danger.
