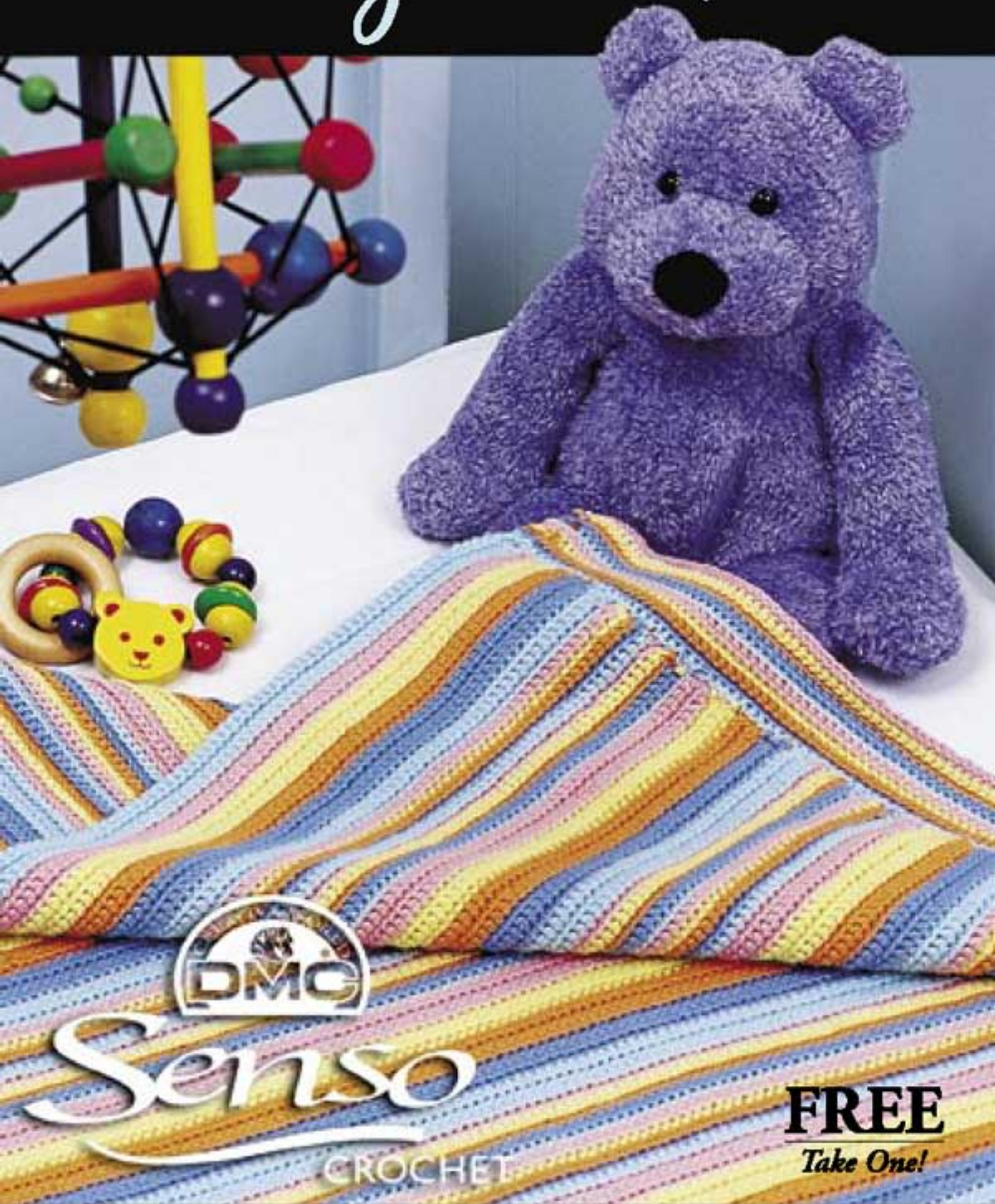

# Baby Blanket

Size: 29½" x 39½"

Level: Easy

Gauge: 24 single crochets x 22 rows = 4" square

## ABBREVIATIONS:

ch = chain

sc = single crochet

st(s) = stitch(es)



## SUPPLIES:

- *Senso Microfiber Cotton (Article 710), size 3, color #s 1102, 1105, 1106; Senso Denim (Article 750), size 3, color #s 1501 & 1502 – 4 balls each (150 yards/ball)*
- *Crochet Hook: 2.5mm, US B/1 or C/2*

Note: All single crochets are worked into the back loop only.

To change color work to the last stitch of the row prior to a new color row.

Insert hook into back loop of last stitch and bring yarn through = 2 loops on hook use the new color to finish the stitch.

## DIRECTIONS:

With color 1501 ch 161

**Row 1:** sc into 2nd ch from hook, across (160 sts), ch 1 & turn

**Row 2 – 26:** sc across, ch 1 & turn while making color changes at the end of the following rows:

3, 16 & 21: change to 1502

6, 17 & 22: change to 1106

9, 18 & 23: change to 1102

12, 19 & 24: change to 1105

15, 20 & 25: change to 1501

Repeat rows 2 through 26 seven times more

Repeat rows 2 - 15 once more (215 rows)

### Side edges:

**Row 1:** using color 1501 sc along side edge, ch 1 & turn

**Rows 2 – 11:** sc across ch 1 & turn while making color changes at the end of the following rows:

2 & 7: change to 1502

3 & 8: change to 1106

4 & 9: change to 1102

5 & 10: change to 1105

6: change to 1501

Repeat on opposite side.
