Overview:

Pfizer created the Diflucan® Partnership in 2000 to improve the quality of life for people living with HIV and AIDS. Pfizer and its partners distribute millions of Diflucan® (fluconazole) treatments for two AIDS-related fungal infections free of charge to governmental and nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) in developing countries. Pfizer also provides materials to support patient education and health care worker training.

Goal:

To provide treatment for two AIDS-related fungal infections – *cryptococcal meningitis* and *esophageal candidiasis* – in the developing countries.

The Need:

By end of 2007, only 3 million of the estimated 9.7 million people in need of AIDS treatment in developing countries were receiving the drugs"(UN MDG Report, 2008).

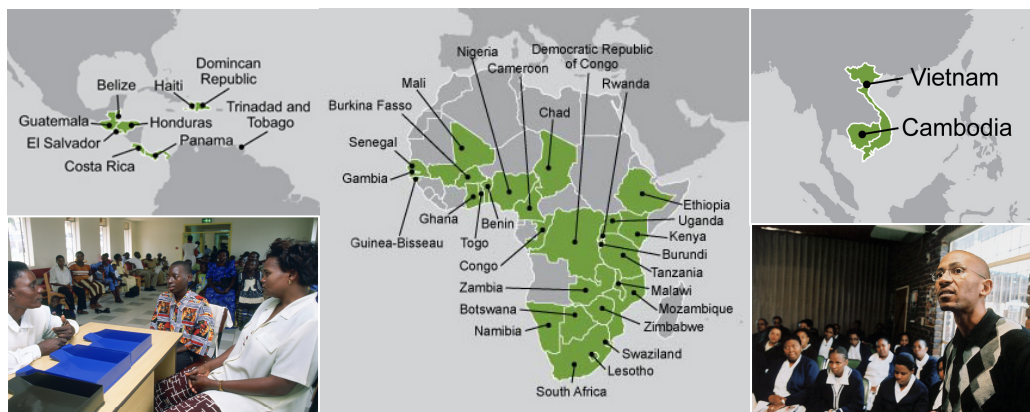
Partners:
