The mission of the Alaska Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management is to protect Alaskans and their property from terrorism and all other hazards and to provide rapid recovery from all events.



The history of the Division dates back to 1977 and the Alaska Disaster Act that created the original Division of Emergency Services within the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs. The Alaska Division of Homeland Security was created in March of 2003 and the two separate organizations joined together in early 2004.

When a disaster or terrorist attack occurs, the Division is on the scene quickly to provide individual and/or public assistance to the citizens and local governments. In the event of a major catastrophe, the Division works closely with the Federal Emergency

Management Agency (FEMA) to provide Federal assistance to the victims.
