 eRepublik is a mirror version of the real world in which you can interact with other citizens, create original content, get a job, start a company, a political party or get your friends together and invade another country, all in just 15 minutes daily.

- eRepublik leverages the use of the Internet:
 - Free to play
 - User-friendly and browser based
 - No download or installation of any programs or files
 - Not time consuming (15 min./day average)
 - Playable anywhere from any device with an Internet connection
 - No Artificial Intelligence, only human interaction







eRepublik is built around the concept of a daily social experience. One
of its advantages over other strategy games is that it demands a small
fraction of users' free time (15 minutes), while providing them a much
deeper experience for that time.





- eRepublik takes a reverse approach to game and virtual world development by starting only with what is really necessary for user enjoyment, and building from there based on user input. This means that the existing game really only represents 25% of what the final product will be. You can watch a <u>video</u> that explains this approach.
- As a result, by using the Internet start up model, development tools, and the growing power of user generated content (UGC), Alexis and George created eRepublik faster and for less money than could have been done with the traditional development studio approach that is still used for most online games and virtual worlds.

INVESTMENTS

- The initial investment for production of the beta version of eRepublik was €200,000 during 2007. In 2008, the French venture capital firm AGF Private Equity, and several Business Angels with broad Internet experience, invested an additional €550,000 for the development of Version 1.
- In June of 2009, a further €2m was raised in a series A round from AGF Private Equity.

- Alexis and George's project received the Special Jury prize for the best European Start-up at the LeWeb3 2007 awards.
 - LeWeb is the #1 Internet event and conference in Europe. The 07 Edition gathered in Paris and had 1,800 participants from 40 countries, including names such as Shimon Peres and Philippe Starck.

• How does my citizen eat?

Once a day the highest quality food unit from your inventory is automatically consumed. Food can be purchased from the marketplace. Remember that in order to survive in eRepublik, you need to eat, and that you should always have food units in your inventory as it will influence your wellness level.

• What is wellness and what is it good for?

■ Wellness represents your citizen's health and happiness indicator. It helps you reach a higher productivity when you work and also increases your level of damage in a fight. If your wellness is zero, soon your citizen will die.



FAQ

• What are the experience points and how can I earn them?

■ Experience points (EP) represent the knowledge level a citizen reaches in eRepublik. One experience point is received each time you train, work or eat. So a regular user can receive three experience points per day with minimal effort. As a citizen gains experience points he/she will be able to unlock new features and things to do.

• What is Gold and why do I need it?

- Regardless of the terminology used, eRepublik Gold represents a limited license right and is not redeemable for any sum of money or monetary value at any time.
- eRepublik Gold is required for:
 - Create a newspaper (cost: 2 Gold)
 - Create a party (cost: 40 Gold)
 - Create a company (cost: 20 Gold)
 - Buy export licenses for your company (cost: 20 Gold)
 - Upgrade your company production quality (cost: minimum 20 Gold)
 - Create an organization (cost: 5 Gold)
 - Improve your wellness (cost: 2 Gold)
 - Start an official war or a resistance war (cost: from 200 or 50 Gold, respectively)
 - Obtain local currency from the monetary market (cost: depends on the exchange rate)

• How do I get a job?

■ The first step is to visit the Jobs market. Here you will be able to browse through all the job offers posted by companies in eRepublik and pick the one that fits you best. Be careful as there is a minimum skill requirement for each offer.

• How can I join and lead a political party?

■ You can start your own party if you have enough Gold. If not you can join one of the existing parties. Taking part in the internal debates, giving ideas and helping to organize things might eventually allow you to be among the candidates to lead your party.



• How can I become president of a country?

- Upon reaching experience level 14, you will need to gain support from one of the top 5 parties in your countries in order to run for presidency.
- On the 5th of each month, in every country, the winner of the general elections becomes the country president.



• What are the shouts in eRepublik?

■ Shouts are used in eRepublik as a way to communicate with the community. You can see the shoutbox on the homepage with three types of tabs: friends, official and everyone. Keep in touch with your friends and update them about any recent events in eRepublik that you are involved in (e.g.: "I've created a new company" or "I am now a member of the Yellow party in Argentina").



• How can I fight in eRepublik?

- You can see if your country is involved in a war (a resistance war too) by viewing the war list in the Military stats section, accessible from the Info menu. After you decide which battle you should fight in, you simply click the 'Fight' button on that page.
- By taking part in battles, your strength and fighting ability will increase and you'll earn a higher rank in the army.





How can I quickly learn the basics of the game?

- All the information can be found on the eRepublik official Wiki. You can also access and use our forums, specifically the Help board. It is there that you can contact the administration team, as well as other citizens, in order to solve any doubts you may have. The basics can be learned in this Official Tutorial Video

 Only 28 days after the launch of the beta version of the game, there were already more than 100,000 visits to the site and more than 2 million page views.

• The record number of visits to eRepublik in one day is 320,599. Since the beta launch there have been over 1.5 billion page views (as of December 31st, 2009).

• Over 35,000 active citizens joined eRepublik during beta without any promotional effort or campaigns.

• Over 39,000 companies, over 59,000 newspapers and over 900 political parties exist in eRepublik.

• After six months, the eRepublik official Wiki reached over 1,000 articles (more than 90% of them being written by eRepublik citizens). It currently contains more than 8,900 articles.

• There is at least one external community site (most of them are forums) for each country in eRepublik. These <u>websites</u> are created and administrated by the citizens.

• eRepublik in-person community meetings have been held in different countries such as Spain, France, Iran, Indonesia and Sweden. Such events are also held monthly in Romania and Hungary.

• Last November's community meeting in Bucharest, Romania gathered more than 50 eRepublik citizens from different cities.

- In the middle of war, the presidents of Hungary and Romania decided to meet at the border for a beer.
- The Spanish community sent an eRepublik t-shirt, with the logo of a major party in Spain, to the headquarters in Bucharest.

- User generated videos are continually uploaded to YouTube.


eRepublik World Map as of August 21st, 2009

- eRepublik had a theocracy (Pakistan) and several state-controlled "communist-like" economies.
- We had two New World Wars (more than 20 countries involved), with zero casualties, and instead thousands of wounded citizens.
- The most powerful countries of today's eRepublik were almost inexistent one year ago, while the former super-powers lost most of their influence. This shows the dynamism of the New World, and how dreams can come to reality, no matter how impossible it might seem.
- A former president of the US accepted a bribe to cancel a military treaty with Greece.
- Some citizens have found love in eRepublik and several marriages have taken place.
- In eRepublik the International Community is reacting incredible fast and altruistic. For example, when there was a sudden 400 % increase in Poland's population, almost all the new citizens would have been condemned to death by starvation, had the allied friends failed to provide Poland with tens of thousands of food products as a humanitarian aid.
- The pets seen everywhere in eRepublik are the Hungarian "Sun" (hedgehog) and the Romanian "Matza" (kitty), which are some sort of national symbols and even have their own parties in eRepublik, like the Matza Party.
- One of the most important regions of eRepublik, Heilongjiang (China) is widely called "HelloKitty".
