Attention Jockeys: There will be a mandatory jockeys meeting at 12:45 p.m., in the "jocks room" with the Stewards.

There will be no training on the racecourse or around the perimeter of the racecourse.

Attention Horsemen: Trainers are NO LONGER required to report horses on the grounds, if they are running. All scratches must be made no later than one hour prior to post time for the first race. Foal papers and any other material for horse identification purposes are to be turned in to the Horse Identifier.

As required by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture: "All horses must be accompanied by a report of an official negative test for Equine Infectious Anemia (Coggins Test) conducted within the last 12 months. The certificate must accompany all horses in order to gain access to the grounds." Likewise, a 48 hour Health Certificate must accompany horses shipping. This Health Certificate must state that the horse has not been exposed to the Equine Herpes Virus, and that the horse has not shown signs suggestive of these diseases, nor have exhibited a fever within the previous 3 weeks. Thank you for your attention.

O/T/R's are encouraged to be on the grounds by 10:00 a.m. as heavy traffic is expected.

All participating owners, trainers, riders and grooms must pick up Carolina Cup credentials from the Carolina Cup Racing office PRIOR to 11:00 A.M. Saturday, March 27. See attached notices regarding Carolina Cup credentials.

There will be a pre-race vet check performed by Dr. Ronnie Fulmer beginning at 7:30 a.m. at the perimeter barns of the racecourse and ending at the temporary stalls around 10:00 a.m.

Attention Trainers: SCETV will be broadcasting at the Carolina Cup and they will be taping all races. It is very important that all horsemen adhere to the schedule of 35 minutes between races.

The Carolina Cup Racing Association requires all trainers to instruct their grooms to lead all horses from the paddock, onto the racecourse and past the winners circle in front of the grandstand before turning them loose for taping purposes.

All post race testing will be done in two stalls of the four stall barn between Barn B and the Block Barn. The designated stalls face the Block Barn. Please be advised that horsemen will need to make necessary arrangements for buckets and equipment to cool their horses out in this area if being tested. No horse will be allowed to go back to any outer barns: A, C, D, E until completion of testing.

The Springdale Racecourse was inspected by Jeff Teter on Sunday, March 14, 2010:

Turf: The turf is a dormant Bermuda grass that has been over seeded with wheat. The wheat should be 10 to 12 inches in height on race day. The course was fertilized on March 1st and aerated March 2nd. The course will be mowed starting March 15th one time before the races.

Smoothness: The course is smooth throughout.

Compaction: The compaction is anywhere from 90 to 120. Mainly averages 100 to 110. The course has a good feel under foot.

Moisture: The course had a good amount of rain all winter.

January - 4.65 inches rain

February - 3.65 inches rain

March - 2 inches through the 15th . 1.25 inches over the 11th and 12th of March.

Carolina Cup Racing Association Horsemen's Badges and Luncheon Tent Wrist Bands

- 1. NSA pins are considered a general admission ticket. The NSA pin will allow access to the paddock, but will not allow access to the grandstand or the luncheon tent. NSA parking tags allow access to the Stable or Horsemen gates only.
- 2. Participating horsemen must pick up their credential envelopes in the Carolina Cup office the day prior to the races by 5:00pm. If you will not be arriving until race day, please call Teri Leigh Teed at the office (803) 432-6513 to make other arrangements for picking up credentials.
- 3. Participating horsemen will receive two (2) badges, two (2) luncheon tent wristbands, and one (1) parking credential in an envelope. Participating horsemen may receive up to four (4) badges and four (4) wristbands without charge. If more then two (2) are needed, please call Teri Leigh Teed at the office, in advance, so the proper numbers may be ready upon arrival.
- 4. Every person on the grounds must have an admission credential and every vehicle must have a parking tag. Please make arrangements with Teri Leigh Teed at the office as to how many stable personnel credentials and extra vehicle credentials are needed, in advance, so the proper number may be ready upon arrival.
- 5. Participating horsemen must purchase horsemen badges or wristbands beyond the four (4) provided.
- 6. Non-participating horsemen must purchase badges and or wristbands to be allowed access to the grandstand and luncheon tent.
