

TEAM USA GAME NOTES

2010 IIHF World Women's U18 Championship

March 27-April 3 ● Seven Bridges Ice Arena ● Woodridge, Ill.

THE IIHF WORLD WOMEN'S U18 CHAMPIONSHIP: The 2010 IIHF World Women's U18 Championship - in its third year - is being held on U.S. soil for the first time. The tournament features eight teams divided into two groups. Group A consists of two-time defending world champion Team USA, the Czech Republic, Finland and Japan. Group B features Canada, Sweden, Germany and Russia. The teams will play round-robin within their groups, with the group winner advancing to the semifinal round. Teams seeded No. 2 and No. 3 in each group will face off in the quarterfinals, while the fourth-place teams will play in the relegation round.

RECAPPING LAST YEAR: At the second-ever IIHF World Women's U18 Championship in Fussen, Germany, Team USA entered the tournament as the defending gold medalist and No. 1 seed. In preliminary-round play, the U.S. defeated Russia, Germany and Sweden by a combined 37-2 margin, including two shutouts. In the semifinal round, Team USA blanked the Czech Republic, 18-0, before facing of against Canada in the gold-medal game. The U.S. won its second straight world championship with a 3-2 overtime victory over the Canadians.

TEAM NOTES:

- The average age of Team USA is 17 years old. Alex Rigsby, who turned 18 on Jan. 3, is the oldest member of Team USA, while 15-year-old Alex Carpenter is the youngest. In total, there are nine 17 year olds, six 18 year olds, four 16 year olds and one 15 year old.
- Three players are making their Team USA debut with the U.S. Women's National Under-18 Team -- goaltender Aubree Moore, defenseman Jordan Slavin and forward Meghan Lorence.
- Seven players on Team USA were members of the gold medal-winning 2009 U.S. Women's National
 Under-18 Team at the IIHF World Women's U18 Championship, including Brittany Ammerman,
 Kendall Coyne, Lyndsey Fry, Meagan Mangene, Amanda Pelkey, Alex Rigsby and Taylor
 Wasylk. Coyne and Mangene were also members of the gold medal-winning 2008 U.S. Women's
 National Under-18 Team.
- Brittany Ammerman is serving as team captain, with Kendall Coyne, Meagan Mangene and Taylor Wasylk as the alternate captains.
- Members of Team USA call 12 different states home. Massachusetts and Minnesota have the most Team USA members with three.
- Nine members of Team USA have already committed to play college hockey beginning in 2010-11.
 Boston College (Melissa Bizzari, Meagan Mangene, Taylor Wasylk) has the most Team USA commitments. Jordan Slavin (University of North Dakota) is the only member of Team USA who is currently in college.
- Many members of Team USA are already teammates on several club teams. The North American
 Hockey Academy (Vt.) has the most Team USA members, including Brittany Ammerman, Melissa
 Bizzari, Marissa Gedman and Amanda Pelkey. Three other teams have two members of Team
 USA, including Little Caesars U19 (Mich.) (Meagan Mangene, Taylor Wasylk), Noble and
 Greenough School (Mass.) (Marissa Gedman, Michelle Picard) and the Washington Pride U19
 team (Md.) (Aubree Moore, Haley Skarupa).
- Two members of Team USA have won USA Hockey Girls' National Championships. **Kendall Coyne** won a Girls' 19 & Under National Championship with the Chicago Mission U19 team, while **Marissa Gedman** is a four-time National Champion with Assabet Valley (Mass.)

PLAYER NOTES:

- Alex Rigsby became the first-ever woman to be selected in the United States Hockey League Entry Draft, when the Chicago Steel selected her with their 16th round pick in 2009.
- **Brittany Ammerman** is the younger sister of Brooke Ammerman, who was a member of the 2008 U.S. Women's National Under-18 Team. Brittany will be joining Brooke next year at the University of Wisconsin.
