Introduction

New apostolic ministry training schools have specific purposes for which God has called them. Traditional accreditation has generally done more to hinder than help these schools achieve their purposes. Many schools have felt the need for more flexibility to be all that God wanted them to be. Most do not want complete independence, but interdependence of some kind. They want to know what others are doing, and they want others to know what they are doing.

Thus, C. Peter Wagner formed the ACEA, not as a new form of accreditation but as a means for schools to receive ongoing peer-level evaluation, mutual accountability, and networking while maintaining the integrity of their individual callings from God.

The descriptions contained in this directory come from ACEA enrollment forms and self-study reports submitted by each of the schools. Some ACEA member schools are not represented here, because ACEA received no information from them.

We hope this networking directory will help many ACEA schools to get to know each other. This directory contains profiles of most ACEA members through April 2007.
