## **Session A: Traffic | Transportation**

Transportation engineers and related subject matter experts will discuss the Traffic Impact Study underway, coordinated efforts with the State of Maryland to identify potential road improvements, and a possible strategy for implementing recommended improvements.

#### Session B: Noise

Acoustical engineers and related subject matter experts will discuss the site noise assessments currently underway and anticipated noise levels of training operations, and available methods for minimizing or mitigating impacts from noise.

# **Session C: Program and Operations | Infrastructure**

Subject matter experts from DoS Diplomatic Security will be available to answer questions about the purpose and need of the project, as well as technical details related to training activities. Engineers will be available to outline the infrastructure improvements planned for the training center development.

#### Session D: Cultural | Natural Resources

Environmental consultants, cultural historians and related subject matter experts will discuss the planned Cultural Resource Assessment, known information regarding wildlife and wetlands, and possible design methodologies to mitigate impacts that may result from the proposed training center development.

## **Session E: Site Planning**

Architects, engineers and landscape architects will discuss Build Alternatives 1 and 2 and compare their layouts. Subject matter experts will be available to discuss ecological ideas for the proposed training center development. Perimeter fencing, vegetative buffers and landscaping will be discussed and their benefit in mitigating noise and view impacts

#### **Session F: Economic Impacts | Jobs | Miscellaneous**

GSA and DoS representatives will discuss the potential benefits associated with the proposed training center development, including potential economic impacts and employment opportunities. This will also be the venue to discuss topics not covered in any of the other workshop sessions.
