A GUIDE TO INK

With so many different types of ink available, choosing the right one can be tricky—let this guide help you!

DYE -

- Available in a wide array of colors and shows up best on white or light-colored papers
- Dries quickly and is less likely to smearmaking it great for using with markers
- Cannot be used for embossing

PIGMENT

- Dries more slowly—making it ideal for heat embossing
- Can be heat set to speed up drying process and avoid smearing
- Available in more vibrant colors and can be used on colored papers

STAZON -

- Solvent-based, allowing it to be used on slick, non-porous surfaces (like plastic, glass, acetate, and more)
 Permanent and fast-drying
- Will not work with Copic markers

DISTRESS -

- Dye-based, so it dries quickly
- Gives an antique look
- Designed for inking paper edges, accents, etc.

VERSAMARK

- Gives a tone-on-tone, watermark look
- Works best on darker papers
- Dries slowly, making it ideal for heat embossing

CHALK-

- Shorter drying time than pigment ink
- Gives a softer, more opaque look
