#### ENGINEERING WORK AT THE BLACKHILL TRANSMITTER

The Blackhill transmitter mast which provides television and FM radio signals for the bulk of Central Scotland is to have its supporting wires greased to prevent corrosion. The work is being carried out by transmission contractor NTL.

To ensure the safety of the workers carrying out this task, both analogue and digital television transmissions, along with all FM radio services, will require to operate at reduced power from time to time. These services will also be completely shut down on a number of occasions for periods of up to two hours. Viewers are advised not to make any alterations to their sets or aerials.

The work is scheduled to begin on Wednesday 1st September but is very dependent on weather conditions and it is not possible to give exact times when these interruptions will take place. Every effort will be made however to minimise inconvenience to BBC viewers and listeners.

Along with its relay stations, Blackhill serves around three million analogue television viewers in an area extending across Scotland from beyond Edinburgh in the East to as far as the Isle of Barra in the West including much of the Borders and Ayrshire.

Listeners who experience problems with reception of Radio Scotland FM should re-tune to 810 medium wave.

Radio Scotland, and all other BBC radio services, are also available via digital satellite, Freeview, DAB digital radio and on-line.

The BBC would like to take this opportunity to apologise for any inconvenience this work may cause.

ADOPTION STORIES 10.35pm – 11.05pm

Adoption Stories is a compassionate and sympathetic series reflecting the different aspects of adoption as seen through the eyes of individuals involved in the adoption process.

In filming with prospective adopters, children awaiting adoption, birth parents, foster parents, adopters, people who have been adopted, adoption agencies and social workers, over a year, this series observes how their individual stories and circumstances develop.

The series looks at where children awaiting adoption come from and the broad range of circumstances of the people wishing to adopt and has been filmed across the whole of Scotland.

Adoption can be a lengthy process for both prospective adopters and children waiting to be adopted. The series shows the reality of this highlighting the importance of the process of matching the children with families. Adoption, after all, is about finding families for children and not finding children for families – the best interests of the child must always come first.

In this, the first in a series of six, looks at how children come into care. Children in care are often fostered before they are put forward to be adopted. We meet the Woodrows and their foster daughter Samantha as they celebrate a family birthday. Birth mum Lynne talks about her problems with drugs which led to her having her own children taken from her and then adopted. Mabel, a foster carer who has looked after 183 children, introduces us to Billy who has been waiting to be adopted for over three years. We also meet some prospective adopters at the very start of the adoption process in their first session at Scottish Adoption – they must consider the difficult backgrounds of many children awaiting adoption.
