# Students 'walk the talk'

Te Awamutu Intermediate School students are used to being part of the tangata whenua (hosts) at powhiri, but last week they experienced being among the manuhiri (visitors).

All 450 Intermediate School students and their teachers visited Otawhao Marae at Te Awamutu College and Te Wananga o Aotearoa for Te Wiki o Te Reo (Maori Language Week).

For many of them it was their first time being part of the visiting party to a marae.

They experienced the full protocol of a powhiri — karanga (calling on), karakia (prayer) waiata (song) — by hosts and visitors, whaikorero (speeches) by hosts and visitors' representatives and formal greeting (handshake or hongi).

They learned about Otawhao Marae history and Maori tikanga (customs).

Intermediate School Maori curriculum teacher Tracey Paekau says many of the European as well as Maori taura (students) call Otawhao their home marae when they do their mihi (background), so the visit was especially relevant for them.

Intermediate principal Dale McCabe says Maori language is a major focus every week at his school, but there was a special focus during Te Wiki o Te Reo.

"For every student in the school this week has presented an opportunity to learn first hand about Otawhao Marae and about the journey of the Wananga and how it was built."

Tony Biddick, senior teacher in charge of Te Reo at the Intermediate, says the visits provided great interaction between the school, the College and Otawhao Marae and the Wananga.

"A big thankyou to Mike Graham and Hokai Rangatahi Kapahaka Roopu.

"The Wananga staff, both head office and Apakura, had really 'come on board' and this enabled the Intermediate students to learn history not only of the Wananga, but

Otawhao and also around Te Awamutu area.

"A big thankyou to Bodie Taylor and Arlene Paki for making the Te Wananga visit possible and awesome for our school and to all the staff at the Wananga for their help."

Mr Biddick says each year during Te Wiki o Te Reo there is a Maori focus at the Intermediate — last year they had a 'big boil up'.

Intermediate kaumatua, Abe Newton, says the visits were a good learning experience for teachers too.

Mr McCabe says they received a warm greeting and great hospitality from Otawhao Marae and Te Wananga o Aotearoa staff. He says the country has moved a long way towards recognising that 'things Maori' are not separate, but a part of everyday life for all New Zealanders. "When today's students get their turn to be leaders, they will be able to help influence even more development in this area."

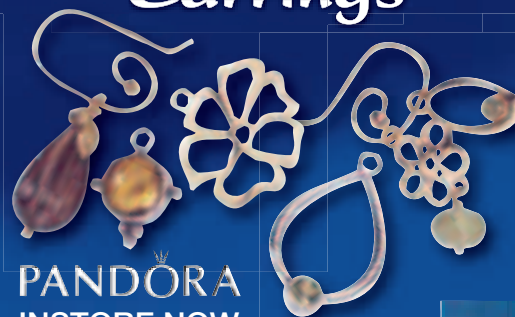

# Anti-smacking misses mark

Data published by the Quit Group recently showed that smokers using the telephone Quitline are five times more likely to successfully quit than those without support.

The study showed that a record 53,170 people signed up for help from The Quit Group in 2008/9.

cess and it also demonstrates the importance of sharing the difficult challenge of quitting smoking with others who can show support.

For some people the support may come in the form of calling the Quitline or the Aukati Kai Paipa smoking cessation services, however for others the support of families is paramount.

Family and whanau who want

to give a loved one a 'push start' can by buying a 'Give a Quit!' card from Amcal and Unichem pharmacies and Pharmacy@thewarehouse.

The cards contain one month's free supply of nicotine patches, gum or lozenges to support a quit attempt.

# Waipa has plenty to be proud of: Dyet

I wasn't quite right announcing new Waipa District Council chief executive Garry Dyet was Te Awamutu 'born and bred' in last Tuesday's *Courier* — but I was close.

The Southlander came to town when his Prison Officer father Wattie transferred to Waikeria in the early 1960s.

Young Garry briefly attended Waikeria School before the family shifted into town, and he continued his education at Te Awamutu Primary, Intermediate and College.

And if he has been loyal to his new town, he has been just as loyal to his employer.

In April next year Mr Dyet will celebrate 30 years with the local body — Waipa County, then Waipa District, Councils.

Mr Dyet says he hasn't been sitting around waiting to inherit the top job, any choices to stay with the one employer and not chase promotions via other local authorities being based on his pride in the district and satisfaction with the opportunities on offer.

His career actually started as a health inspector trainee with the Department of Health in 1977.

As a newly qualified inspector he joined Waipa County Council as assistant to Fred Amess.

But Mr Dyet decided it wasn't his preferred role and utilising the Council's willingness and generosity to help people upskill, undertook his New Zealand Certificate of Town and Country Planning from 1985.

The decision paid dividends when in 1989 the new merged Waipa District Council appointed him to the role of district planner.

His first job, which he is still proud of, was to take the work of six local authorities and formulate Waipa's first District Plan.

He says he discovered Waipa had an enviable number of strong features that needed protection under a good plan.

Not content to rest on his laurels, in the mid 1990s, Mr Dyet completed his Master's degree in Public Policy through Victoria University.

He says it was the hardest three years of his life, but he was rewarded with a group manager's role in 1997 and then in 2002 won the deputy chief executive role when Jim Mylchreest moved to a new venture with the fledgling Maungatautari Ecological Island Trust project.

Mr Dyet is quick to credit his employer with encouraging staff to upskill and move in new directions where appropriate.

He says he has managed almost all areas of Council's operations except finance, operational engineering and IT — so has a good grasp of the organisation, what is required and what is possible.

He also pays credit to retiring chief executive John Inglis, saying he was strong on the concept of succession planning.

"I haven't been pursuing the chief executive job, but thanks to John I have been well prepared for the opportunity when it arose," he says.

Mr Dyet says Waipa is in a strong economic position, lead by the dairying and equine industries, but cannot take anything for granted.

He says the biggest challenge is planning for growth, funding infrastructure while being mindful of keeping rates at an acceptable level.

Mr Dyet says councils do lots of good work for their communities,

but that is not usually how they are remembered.

He uses the example that the average annual residential household rate bill is about the same as the annual power bill and invites residents to compare what they receive for that money.

Another challenge is to engage younger families and youth in the local body process.

His wife Donna, who is at the forefront of the local schools SPLICE Project, has reminded him of the importance of social networking to engage younger people — he says he'll have to take notice.

Mr Dyet takes over the chief executive role on Thursday, August 20.

"Who better to nominate the teachers who are making a difference in classrooms around the

country than parents and those in the school community.

"This is a ten to fifteen minute assignment that acknowledges the valuable role teachers and leaders play in the development of children and young people."

The NEiTA awards are jointly supported by ASG Education Programmes New Zealand, a not-for-profit organisation which operates trans-Tasman assisting parents to plan for their children's future education and Cognition Education1, a leading provider of consulting and infrastructural services in all areas of the education sector in New Zealand and internationally.

All teachers/leaders nominated receive a Certificate of Nomina-

tion, with 20 area representatives selected to go forward to receive Regional Awards for Excellence in Teaching and Leadership in Wellington next May. From these, ten teachers/leaders will receive National Awards at their schools or centres later next year.

National awardees will receive professional development grants from a pool totalling \$35,000.



Their arrival was a relaxed, low key occasion with members of the Tauroa and Papa families on hand to release the two pairs of juvenile siblings who will stay in the aviary until they settle and 'key-into' their new surroundings.

It is hoped that they will eventually breed with the previously released kaka.

To commemorate the day Maureen Tauroa named the birds Orion, Tao, Mauku and Ata after the people who had opened the small crates which had transported the birds on their commercial flight from Wellington.

"It has been a really special day, particularly being able to share it with the Tauroa and Papa families," says kaka carer Marilyn Mackinder.

Helping to make the newcomers feel at home are the kaka pair — Wild-one and Mia — in an adjoining flight, along with the kaka who regularly visit the aviary area, especially during the supplementary feeding times.

"Orion, Tao, Mauku and Ata will also certainly get to know two of the recently released kaka chicks. I'm sure it won't be long before Billy T is saying hello through the mesh — he and Puku will be very curious," says Mrs Mackinder.

"Over the next few months I'll be bringing the new kaka a range of fruit and vegetables and special home-made biscuits every day. It's like making school lunches again!"

# Giant hihi sighted at Hamilton Airport

## Fabulous Phil Brown photo of Maungatautari dweller to greet travellers

The nationally endangered hihi (stitchbirds) will get a profile boost over the next few months with a giant photograph of a male hihi featured at a prime spot at Hamilton Airport.

In March this year 79 hihi were released into Maungatautari's southern enclosure, following a century's absence from the mountain, and now regularly visit a series of specially built feeders close to the walking tracks.

Maungatautari is the only place in the Waikato where hihi have been reintroduced.

The wall space at Hamilton Airport is shared by the local councils and the production of the large poster (4.1m wide by 2.3m high) was paid for by Waipa District Council.

"Waipa is a proud supporter of Maungatautari," says Waipa's Mayor Alan Livingston.

"We saw this as one way we could help promote this internationally significant restoration project, and do our bit to highlight the plight of our endangered wildlife."

Maungatautari Trust's chief executive Jim Mylchreest says it is a fabulous opportunity to show the public what a hihi looks like.

"Hihi are rare and need everyone's help to get them off the endangered list. It will be great if visitors to the Airport fall in love with this cute little bird and then come out to Maungatautari's southern enclosure to see them in their natural habitat."

The Maungatautari Trust hopes to translocate more hihi from Tiritiri Matangi and Little Barrier Island in 2010 as funding allows.

The hihi photograph was taken on Maungatautari by Te Awamutu wildlife photographer Phil Brown and was gifted to the Trust to help

promote Maungatautari and hihi.

Hihi facts Hihi were once found throughout the North Island, but numbers declined due to loss of forest habitat, introduction of mammalian predators and arrival of new avian diseases. Prior to their recent releases at a number of

mainland sites including Maungatautari, the Karori Wildlife Sanctuary and the Waitakere Ranges, the last recorded sighting on the mainland was in the Tararua Ranges in 1883.

The hihi is classified as nationally endangered — the total

population across all known sites is estimated to be in the low thousands.

Genetic research has revealed hihi belong to a new family of birds found only in New Zealand. Previously it was thought they belonged to the honeyeater family

along with tui and bellbird.

Hihi nest in holes in trees and are the only bird known to also mate face to face.

Beside the male with the distinctive yellow band across the chest and a black head the female is brownish and comparatively dull.

# E-Day offers computer disposal

Waipa District e-waste will contribute to an estimated 100 tonnes that is expected to be collected for recycling from Waikato households, schools and community groups at this year's Hamilton E-Day on Saturday, September 12.

Computer Access New Zealand (CANZ) has announced another national E-Day (free computer recycling day) aimed at diverting over 1,000 tonnes of electronic waste (e-waste) from landfills in up to 40 regions, an increase from the 31 regions (including Hamilton) that participated in 2008.

Waipa District Council will provide a free collection from Waipa Racecourse carpark of old computers, printers and other related equipment and games consoles for households, schools and community groups, to transport to Hamilton's 2009 E-Day (one day only) drop-off venue, Habitat for Humanity, Bryant Road Te Rapa.

The Waikato 2020 Communications Trust event is again being planned and funded in partnership with Hamilton City Council, Habitat for Humanity Central North Island, Velocity Networks Ltd and councils around the region, who are making a financial contribution toward costs.

Hamilton E-Day co-ordinator, Janet Leggett, says more cash and in-kind sponsorship is needed to support the local event. Businesses and organisations who want to show their green colours can donate equipment and manpower in return for their own drop off bay and recognition as an event supporter.

E-waste is the fastest growing waste problem globally and New Zealand is no exception; over 87,000 computer related items were diverted from landfills at last year's E-Day, including 90 tonnes collected from around the Waikato region and dropped

to the Hamilton E-Day site.

Now in its third year, the annual E-Day event is the only nationwide community e-waste recycling event for disposing of computer items and mobile phones in an environmentally sustainable way, at no cost to the public.

"The passing into legislation of the Waste Minimisation Act in September 2008 was an important step forward in developing a long-term sustainable solution but it could take another three years before e-waste schemes are fully operational. We are pleased to announce another E-Day to ensure that hazardous and scarce materials are not buried in our landfills in the interim," says Laurence Zwimpfer, Chairperson of CANZ and organiser of the E-Day event.

Securing funding for E-Day is the biggest challenge for CANZ, and Waikato 2020 Communications Trust, both not-for-profit

trusts, in the current economic climate. The programme relies on support from a wide range of partners including computer manufacturers and distributors, businesses, community trusts, local authorities and central Government.

Mr Zwimpfer says we all have a responsibility to help protect our environment and welcomes further support.

"There are real costs involved in collecting and safely recycling e-waste and we rely 100% on sponsorship and volunteers, hence we'd welcome support from anyone willing to help us ensure that our old computers are properly recycled. This means that scarce and valuable materials can be reused rather than buried in our landfills," he says.

National transport operator KiwiRail and international e-waste recycler, CRTNZ, are again confirmed as national partners for 2009.

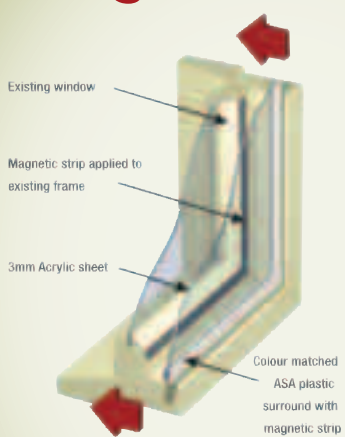

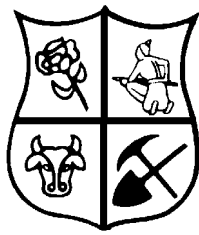

# Karate world twins' oyster

## Bryant siblings making mark on international scene

Arohena twins Sarah and Kate Bryant have an advantage over their Karate rivals — they have each grown up with a ready-made training opponent.

The pair, who have just kicked and punched their way into the Karate New Zealand national team, say they fight harder against each other than anyone.

The 14-year-olds made their international debut at last year's Wado-kai Karate World Championships in Vancouver — Kate winning bronze in the 13-14 year girls' kumite (sparring).

The pair already have five international medals each among their collective career haul of 30 medals and 20 trophies.

A day after arriving back in New Zealand — from an extended holiday in Canada with their parents Jeff and Kerry after the world championships — the twins represented New Zealand at the Oceania championships in Auckland.

Kate, Sarah and Charlotte Dumble (Hamilton) won gold in team kata (set sequences in unison), and Sarah silver in the 14 year girls' kumite.

The Whangarei teenager has been chosen to represent the country in the junior world karate championships in Morocco in November.

Having made a good fist of competing at international level, the teenage twins are strong candidates to make the national team for next year's Wado Kai Karate World Championships in Japan and Oceania Championships in Tahiti.

In the meantime, Sarah has been named to represent her country at the Junior World Karate Championships in Morocco in November.

Kerry Bryant says it is a great privilege to be asked any time to wear the silver fern but it will come down to finance whether Sarah can make this trip.

"It's always difficult for twins, too, when one has to miss out — only one New Zealander can represent each age/weight section in Morocco."

The Bryants are club-mates of Morgana Chapman — whose karate feats were highlighted by the *Courier* in last Tuesday's publication — and also train under 6th dan black belt Sensai Robbie Smith at the Wado-kai Karate dojo in Dey Street, Hamilton.

It has been a stellar year to date for them.

Their medal haul continued at the recent national championships in Wellington.

Kate won bronze in the cadets (14-15 years) over 54kg kumite, while Sarah collected gold in the cadet under 54kg kumite, silver in open weight kumite and gold in team kumite, with Larissa Smith (daughter of Sensai Smith) and Alison Oliver.

A day later, Sarah won gold in kumite and silver in kata at the national secondary schools' championships at the same venue in Wellington.

Kate was hamstrung in Wellington by a foot injury.

The injury occurred playing representative netball for Eastern Wai-kato. Both Sarah and Kate occupy the midcourt for the reps.

The twins, students at Hamilton Girls High School, have been martial artists since they were six year olds.

They train three to six hours a week, stepping it up for the international competition, as well as helping teach young students.

Their next major competition is the Sugihara Cup International Karate Championships in Auckland from August 28-30.

The event will serve as an ideal lead-up to the Junior Worlds in Morocco for Sarah.

# Tyson strikes U23 gold

By winning gold at the U23 World Rowing Championships Tyson Williams has booked himself a ticket to the senior World Championships in Poznan, Poland later this month.

The Te Pahu rower was stroke of the men's four that won gold at Racice in the Czech Republic.

Rowing NZ communications manager Richard Gee says the crew looked exceptionally tight on paper and so it proved in the final.

"At the first 500 metre mark all six crews remained within a second and a half of each other with the New Zealand crew in second position.

"By the 1000 metre mark, three crews had broken away and it was New Zealand followed by Canada and Germany.

"At 1500 metres the Kiwi crew's impressive mid-race pace took them out to a one length lead and from that point on they were untouchable, racing home to gold

in 5 minutes 54 seconds."

As the New Zealand crew crossed the line they were able to hear the start of the medal ceremony for their fellow team mates Robby Manson and Joseph Sullivan as they picked up gold for winning the double.

The men's four then got to enjoy their own ceremony.

"We came with the intention to do well. With this medal we will race in Poznan and hopefully also be part of the team next year for the champs in New Zealand."

The men's coxed four (David Eade, Tobias Wehr-Candler, Ian Seymour, John Storey, cox Matt Cameron) in a new hull after their boat was destroyed in a storm) also won gold, while the women's four (Jessica Loe, Regan Barkla, Kate Reymer and Alex Burnside) picked up a bronze medal.

## GRANT INCREASES

All of the rowers have welcomed the announcement by SPARC that the country's top athletes will receive increased

payments as part of a revised Performance Enhancement Grants (PEGs) programme.

The revisions to the PEGs programme will mean increased payments across the board for Rowing New Zealand's athletes if they perform well at the World Rowing Championships in Poland.

"After the great performance by our Under 23's, this is great news and adds another dimension to the significant support we receive from SPARC," says Rowing NZ CEO Simon Peterson.

"The athlete-focussed approach will definitely help us retain our champions, our up-and-coming athletes, as well as the established members of our successful elite team. It's a positive message that if they perform well, they will be rewarded."

Under the revised PEGs programme, World Champions will receive a pre-tax payment of \$60,000, medallists \$55,000, 4th - 6th placed athletes \$47,500, 7th - 8th \$40,000 and 9th- 12th \$25,000.
