Waipa has plenty to be proud of: Dyet

I wasn't quite right announcing new Waipa District Council chief executive Garry Dyet was Te Awamutu 'born and bred' in last Tuesday's *Courier* — but I was

The Southlander came to town when his Prison Officer father Wattie transferred to Waikeria in the early 1960s.

Young Garry briefly attended Waikeria School before the family shifted into town, and he continued his education at Te Awamutu Primary, Intermediate and

And if he has been loyal to his new town, he has been just as loyal to his employer.

In April next year Mr Dyet will celebrate 30 years with the local body — Waipa County, then Waipa District, Councils.

Mr Dyet says he hasn't been sitting around waiting to inherit the top job, any choices to stay with the one employer and not chase promotions via other local authorities being based on his pride in the district and satisfaction with the opportunities on

His career actually started as a health inspector trainee with the Department of Health in 1977.

As a newly qualified inspector he joined Waipa County Council as assistant to Fred Amess.

But Mr Dvet decided it wasn't his preferred role and utilising the Council's willingness and generosity to help people upskill, undertook his New Zealand Certificate of Town and Country Planning

The decision paid dividends when in 1989 the new merged Waipa District Council appointed him to the role of district planner.

His first job, which he is still proud of, was to take the work of six local authorities and formulate Waipa's first District Plan.

He says he discovered Waipa had an enviable number of strong features that needed protection under a good plan.

Not content to rest on his laurels, in the mid 1990s, Mr Dyet completed his Master's degree in Public Policy through Victoria University.

He says it was the hardest three years of his life, but he was rewarded with a group manager's role in 1997 and then in 2002 won the deputy chief executive role when Jim Mylchreest moved to a new venture with the fledgling Maungatautari Ecological Island

Mr Dyet is quick to credit his employer with encouraging staff to upskill and move in new direc-



Arohena twins Sarah and Kate Bryant have an advantage over their Karate rivals — they have each grown up with a ready-made training

The pair, who have just kicked and punched their way into the Karate New Zealand national team, say they fight harder against each other

The 14-year-olds made their international debut at last year's Wado-kai Karate World Championships in Vancouver — Kate winning bronze in the 13-14 year girls' kumite (sparring).

The pair already have five international medals each among their collective career haul of 30 medals and 20 trophies.

Kerry Bryant says it is a great privilege to be asked any time to wear the silver fern but it will come down to finance whether Sarah can make

this trip.
"It's always difficult for twins, too, when one has to miss out — only one New Zealander can represent each age/weight section in Morocco."

The Bryants are club-mates of Morgana whose karate feats were highlighted by the *Courier* in last Tuesday's publication — and also train under 6th dan black dojo in Dey Street, Hamilton.

It has been a stellar year to date for them.

At the Australian Open Karate Championships in Melbourne, during the last school holidays, Kate won gold and two silver medals and Sarah three bronze.

Their medal haul continued at the recent national championships in Wellington.

Kate won bronze in the cadets (14-15 years) over 54kg kumite, while Sarah collected gold in the cadet under 54kg kumite, silver in open weight kumite and gold in team kumite, with Larissa Smith (daughter of Sensai Smith) and Alison Oliver.

A day later, Sarah won gold in kumite and silver in kata at the national schools' championships at the same venue in

Kate was hamstrung in Wellington by a foot injury.

The twins, students at Hamilton Girls High School, have been martial artists since they were six year olds.

They train three to six hours a week, stepping it up for the international competition, as well as helping teach young students.
