Blenheim Riverside Railway Society.

Kaikohe Pioneer Village

Stratford Pioneer Village

From Auckland City, take North Western Motorway, exit at Lincoln Road, travel towards Henderson, turn right at Universal drive, through to Swanson Road, towards Swanson, to O'Niels Road, through to Christian Road, to car park at entrance to Filter Station. Park outside of gates, otherwise car could be locked inside. A short walk past filter station, on well formed gravel path, will bring you to two sheds, some rails and pointwork and tunnel mouth. The Rainforest Express

Although this railway is a new enterprise, the Author walked this track in the late 1940s, and rail were in place from Filters, on Scenic Drive, Exhibition Drive, to vicinity of Upper Nihotupu Dam. The Lower Nihotupu Dam, New Zealand's first Earth Dam was at that time, about to be constructed, so a lot of railway on valley floor was removed and loco tipped into tidal mud.

Ngongotaha Old Railway Yard

Aotea Lagoon Railway, Porirua.
