BCC offers several methods of payment for tuition and fees which include cash, check, VISA, MasterCard, or a tuition payment plan through Facts Tuition Management. Payment can be made in combination with financial aid, veteran deferrals, and third party (company) billings.

Financial Aid

BCC students receive approximately \$20 million in direct financial aid including scholarships, grants, loans, and employment income from federal and state governments, private agencies, and the BCC Foundation. Over 64% of all degree seeking students receive some form of financial aid. Of those receiving financial aid, 66% receive enough financial aid to cover the cost of full tuition and fees.

Information Technology Services

BCC's campus network supports Academic and Administrative computing. Student labs with over 600 desktop computers provide high-speed laser printing, email, MS Office, and access to the Internet. Wireless access to the Internet is also available in a variety of convenient locations. In addition, a student portal, available at <http://bcctoday.sunybroome.edu>, provides on-line college information, registration, and access to a variety of student records.

Teaching Resource Center

The Teaching Resource Center provides professional development opportunities and resources to assist faculty and staff with pedagogical issues, teaching methodologies, and instructional technologies. The Center coordinates online courses offered through the SUNY Learning Network and WebCT and provides instructional design support to faculty teaching these courses.

BCC received over \$2.1M in grants and contracts from various federal agencies (84%), state agencies (8%), and local & private sponsors (8%) in 2007-08. Recipients included education and training programs (26%), student service programs (25%), and community service programs (49%).

The Campus Setting

Binghamton is centrally located in the State of New York, 45 miles from Ithaca, 70 miles from Syracuse, and about 200 miles from both New York City and Philadelphia. Routes I-81, I-88 and NY 17 (I-86) pass through the city.

Greater Binghamton is an urban metropolitan area that offers a sophisticated cultural life along with easily accessible outdoor recreational opportunities. Employers include Binghamton University (one of SUNY's 4 University Centers, which is located a few miles from BCC), and numerous small companies and businesses.

Broome Community College's campus is located three miles north of Binghamton on Upper Front Street, which is Route 11 alongside Interstate 81. The campus is landscaped with a variety of trees and open green spaces and has a hillside backdrop; four of its 17 buildings face a major quadrangle.

Student Life

The principle behind the Student Activities Program at Broome is that education is not restricted to scheduled classes. Student Life at BCC supplements and enhances the academic environment through intercollegiate athletics, intramurals, and a diverse offering of activities, clubs, and organizations.

BCC is one of more than 500 member schools of the National Junior College Athletic Association. For Intercollegiate competition, BCC fields men's teams in eight varsity sports - basketball, baseball, cross-country, golf, ice hockey, lacrosse, soccer, tennis, as well as women's varsity teams in basketball, cross-country, softball, soccer, tennis and volleyball. The program also features a variety of intramural activities.

The Student Activities Program provides an added dimension to the educational program at BCC. It provides additional academic as well as recreational events for all students. Students at BCC are involved in more than 50 clubs ranging from Student Assembly and professional affiliates to honor societies and social organizations.
