# Conservatives Lead by Seven Points in Canada; Bloc Québécois Gains

Party leaders get little traction after the Helena Guergis resignation and the Speaker's decision on Afghanistan detainees.

[TORONTO – May 3, 2010] – The Conservative Party maintains the upper hand in Canada's federal political scene, but has lost some ground in Ontario, a new Angus Reid Public Opinion poll has found.

## **Voting Intention**

Across the country, 35 per cent of decided voters (unchanged since late March) would cast a ballot for the Conservative candidate in their riding if a new federal election took place today.

The Liberal Party is second with 28 per cent (-1), two points ahead of the proportion of the vote that the party received in the October 2008 federal election.

The New Democratic Party (NDP) is third with 19 per cent (-1), followed by the Bloc Québécois with 11 per cent (+2), and the Green Party with seven per cent (=).

### **KEY FINDINGS**

- Approval Rating: Layton 31%, Harper 29%, Ignatieff 14%.
- Momentum: Layton -2, Harper -21, Ignatieff -25.

From April 28 to April 29, 2010, Angus Reid Public Opinion conducted an online survey among 1,014 randomly selected Canadian adults who are Angus Reid Forum panelists. The margin of error—which measures sampling variability—is +/-3.1%, 19 times out of 20. The results have been statistically weighted according to the most current education, age, gender and region Census data to ensure a sample representative of the entire adult population of Canada. Discrepancies in or between totals are due to rounding.

# **Regional Breakdowns**

The Tories remain the most popular party in Alberta (62%) and Manitoba and Saskatchewan (47%), and have greatly improved their standing in British Columbia (going from 40% in late March to 51% in late April). In Ontario, the Liberals are now three points ahead of the Tories (37% to 34%).

In Quebec, the Bloc is at 41 per cent and has extended its advantage over the Liberals (24%). The Tories and the NDP are tied for third place with 15 per cent.

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# **Approval**

The approval rating for Prime Minister and Conservative leader Stephen Harper remains at 29 per cent, while NDP leader Jack Layton is still the best rated leader at 31 per cent (-1). Liberal Party and Official Opposition leader Michael Ignatieff is at 14 per cent (-2).

### Momentum

Ignatieff posted the worst momentum score in April at -25 (31% of respondents say their opinion of the Liberal leader has worsened, while six per cent report an improvement). Harper was not far behind at -21, while Layton is still the best leader in this category at -2.

## **Analysis**

In a month that featured the resignation of Minister of State for Status of Women Helena Guergis, increased attention into the activities of former Conservative MP Rahim Jaffer, and the ruling made by Speaker of the House Peter Milliken on the Afghan detainee issue, the three main parties did not go through any significant shift.

While the Tories dropped back in Ontario, they remain particularly dominant in Western Canada, and had very good numbers in British Columbia. Still, the big winner of the month was the Bloc, reaching the 11 per cent mark for the first time since December.
