Sneak Peek:

The No. 7-seeded St. Lawrence University women's hockey team looks to advance to the ECAC Hockey Tournament semifinals for the seventh straight season when it heads to No. 2-seed Clarkson for a best-of-three series this weekend. It is the third time in four years that the North Country rivals will meet in the ECAC Hockey Quarterfinals, but the series is the first on the road for the Saints since the conference adopted the current format.

Be Kind. Please Rewind:

The Saints hope to find the same success against Clarkson that they've had in previous post-season showdowns.

St. Lawrence is 4-0 against the Golden Knights in the ECAC Hockey Quarters, though each of those games have been decided by two or fewer goals. SLU is also coming off of a 4-2 win against Clarkson on Feb. 2, which sent their rivals on a tough 1-4-2 stretch to close the regular season.

Saintly Showdown:

Despite St. Lawrence and Clarkson being rivals, all three head coaches behind the bench in this weekend attended and played hockey for SLU.

Chris Wells, the SLU head coach, graduated in '92, while Clarkson head coaches Matt Desrosiers and

Shannon Smith Desrosiers graduated in '01 and '03, respectively. Wells holds a 4-2-0 edge against his coaching counterparts entering this weekend.

2010 ECAC Hockey Tourney:

This year's ECAC Hockey Tournament offers four intriguing quarterfinal series including two pairs of rivals squaring off.

The regular season title winner, Cornell, hosts CNY travel partner Colgate, the No. 8 seed. No. 2 Clarkson then hosts No. 7 St. Lawrence in a battle for North Country bragging rights.

The No. 3 vs. No. 6 match-up is an All-Ivy showdown between Harvard and Princeton. Finally, Quinnipiac, the league's most-improved team, will host the 2009 runner-up, Rensselaer, in a best-of-three series.

Three = Victory:

The Saints' magic number over the last two seasons was undoubtedly 3; when the team scored 3 or more goals, they were an impressive 46-0-2.

St. Lawrence has kept that impressive mark in tact this season, as they are 15-1-3 when scoring three or more goals. Conversely, the Saints are 0-11-4 when scoring two or fewer goals in 2009-10.

Wellsy's World:

After Paul Flanagan announced that he'd be heading to Syracuse University to help start its women's hockey program in the spring of 2008, the St. Lawrence athletic department announced the hiring of Chris Wells. A Canton, NY native and 1992 graduate of St. Lawrence, Wells took over after serving five years as the Associate Head Coach of the men's hockey program.

Under Coach Wells, St. Lawrence has worked to bring intensity to both ends of the ice, as he consistently preaches back-checking by his forwards and sound special teams play.

Coach Wells posted an impressive first season behind the bench, as his team has climbed as high as No. 3 in the polls and finished second in the regular season standings. The Saints also earned their sixth straight NCAA Tournament bid and finished 24-11-3 under Wells' guidance.

Wells enters this weekend's Quarterfinal series with a career record of 39-23-10 (.611) with the women's hockey team and a 2-2-0 mark in the postseason.

Blown to "Smith"ereens:

Despite having three solid seasons heading into her senior campaign, assistant captain Britni Smith has exploded offensively this year for the Scarlet and Brown.

The Port Perry, ON native has already set a new career-high with 25 points this season behind 8 goals and 17 assists.

Smith has already climbed to No. 2 on the all-time defenseman scoring list in St. Lawrence University history with 74 career points, behind only Annie Guay '08 who finished with 103. However, Smith is only five goals shy of Guay's career record (25).

Most recently, Smith was named one of 45 nominees for the 2010 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, which recognizes the nation's top women's hockey player. She also earned ECAC Hockey Second Team All-League honors for the second straight year.

Knotted Up:

The St. Lawrence women's hockey team needed only 22 games to break the University record for most ties in a season set back in 2004-05.

The Saints broke the previous record of 5 ties back with a 3-3 draw against Boston College on January 14, 2010. They now have seven ties this season in 27 games with an 0-0-7 mark in overtime.

50/50:

Since arriving back to campus after the holiday break, Head Coach Chris Wells has opted to split time in goal between seniors Brittony Chartier and Maxie Weisz.

Chartier, one of four assistant captains, played nearly every minute in net in 2008-09 and was spectacular in the playoffs. Weisz, though, has shown great improvement after missing last season due to injury. She currently has a lower goals against average (1.85) and a higher save percentage (.920) and owns a career record of 13-3-1.

Whether Coach Wells is looking to give Weisz some quality experience for next season or is looking to find a hot goaltender come playoff time, the splits seem to be working. Since the Holiday Break, the Saints goaltenders have a 1.64 GAA, allowed only 25 goals in 15 games and combined for two shutouts.

Rookie Rebels:

The St. Lawrence University women's hockey team's Class of 2013 is proving to be one of the best and deepest in the nation.

The quintet of Kelly Sabatine, Michelle Ng, Kayla Sullivan, Jamie Goldsmith and Brooke Fernandez have combined for 75 points and seven game-winning goals thus far this season, more than any other class on the SLU roster.

Sabatine and Ng lead the way, as they are both ranked in the top-21 nationally in points per game by a rookie. Sabatine has 23 points on 9 goals and 14 assists, while Ng has added speed and spark to the offense with 9 goals and 11 assists for 20 points. Ng also scored the Saints' lone goal against Clarkson at Cheel Arena earlier this season.

Sullivan has chipped in 17 points (12g,5a), while Goldsmith and Fernandez have added eight and seven points each, respectively.

Captain Ak-Attack:

St. Lawrence University senior captain Tara Akstull finished with 32 points on 13 goals and 19 assists. Her leadership and offensive capabilities made her a sound choice to serve as the captain for 2009-10.

Akstull, the team's lone "C", recently became the newest member to St. Lawrence's "Century Club," marking the 100+ career point scorers. Akstull reached the mark on January 22, 2010 with a goal and an assist against Brown.

Akstull is the 16th member of the "Century Club" in SLU women's hockey history.

"Emo"tional Leader:

Sophomore Vanessa Emond has come to the forefront as one of the premier players in ECAC Hockey. After finishing her rookie season with 21 points, the Levis, QC native has already registered 32 this season on 16 goals and 16 assists to lead the Scarlet and Brown in scoring.

Emond, who provides a hard slap shot on the power play and a quick skater on the penalty kill, has shown her explosiveness with a team-high three short-handed goals this season. She is tied for 3rd in the country in that category.

Power PK:

The Saints' penalty killing unit, ranked 8th in the country, has been outstanding in 2010.

Since the start of the new year, St. Lawrence has allowed only three power play goals (3-for-41) and have killed 93% of their opponent's power plays chances. This stat is key, as SLU is a mere 1-4-4 when allowing a power play goal this season.

Selling "Short":

Opponents best not sell the Saints' penalty killing unit short, as the Scarlet and Brown are second in the nation in short-handed goals this season.

The Saints have registered seven "shorties" in 2009-10, and are 2-1-3 when scoring one. Only No. 1 Mercyhurst has more short-handed goals this season, as they set a new NCAA record with an incredible 20.

The Sin Bin:

St. Lawrence was one of the least-penalized teams in the country throughout last season, and Coach Wells has seen his team's discipline continue in 2009-10.

St. Lawrence's average of 6.5 minutes of penalties per game is the lowest in all of Division I women's hockey. Meanwhile, Clarkson's average of 9.2 minutes per game is 27th of 35 teams.

Fabulous Finishes:

If there is one thing you can count on when it comes to the SLU vs. Clarkson games, it is that it will be an exciting finish!

Of the prior 16 meetings, 14 of them have been decided by two or fewer goals including eight of the last nine games. Though the scoreboard showed 4-1 after Clarkson's win back in October of this season, the Saints trailed 2-1 with under 4:00 minutes to play but gave up two empty-net goals to lose by three.

Last season, the Saints won three games by one goal including an overtime come-from-behind win in the ECAC Hockey Quarterfinals. Clarkson also held on to a narrow 2-1 win in their victory at Cheel last season.

Firing Squad:

One key statistic in determining Tuesday's game may very well be shots on goal.

The Saints have a solid 13-4-3 record this season when they take more shots on goal than their opponents.

On the flip side, when they're outshot, the Scarlet and Brown are a meager 2-8-3 in 2009-10 including last weekend's 4-3 win over Dartmouth.

Chilly at Cheel:

Cheel Arena has become one of the most difficult venues for teams to visit in all of women's ice hockey.

The Saints are 2-3-1 all-time against Clarkson at Cheel including two consecutive losses in Potsdam, NY.

The Century Club:

The Saints welcomed one player into the "Century Club" last season, as forward Marianna Locke reached the 100+ point plateau. The Brasher Falls, NY native tallied a short-handed goal against Ohio State on Nov. 28 to reach the mark.

Three players earned spots in the 100+ point club in 2007-08, including Carson Duggan, Alison Domenico and Annie Guay. Duggan became the 12th player to join the exclusive "Century Club" after racking up four goals against Brown and Yale, including a hat trick against the Bears. Meanwhile, Guay was the first defenseman to earn a slot with 103 career points.

St. Lawrence welcomed the 16th member to its exclusive list a few weeks ago, as senior Tara Akstull used a two-point outing against Brown to reach 100 collegiate points.
