Wednesday, 23, 2008, West Palm Beach – The Palm Beach Zoo will open its new Florida Reptile House on Thursday, January 31. Media representatives are invited for a preview showing at 10 a.m. The 1,000 square foot Reptile House is located in the Zoo's Florida Wetlands exhibit near the Wildlife Carousel. The facility will display a variety of venomous and non-venomous reptiles and amphibians found in the State of Florida. An adjacent outdoor area will exhibit three female White-tailed deer (*Odocoileus v. virginianus*), and two female Florida sandhill cranes (*Grus canadensis pratensis*).

Dr. Terry L. Maple, President and CEO of the Zoo said, "We are very pleased to be opening this exciting new exhibit. Reptiles and amphibians play an important role in our Florida ecosystems, and we think this Reptile House will really help children and adults learn more about them. We also know that for many of our visitors, these creatures are among the most exciting and fascinating animals in the zoo."

Keith Lovett, Director of Living Collections said, "The opening of the new Reptile House allows the Zoo the opportunity to educate guests on the diversity of reptiles, amphibians and fish indigenous to the State of Florida. Observing and learning about both venomous and non-venomous species in a safe, naturalistic environment will help to garner a better appreciation of animals found in our backyards and neighborhoods."

The Reptile House contains exhibits themed after the different Ecosystems of Florida:

#### **Tropical Hardwood Hammock**

Pygmy rattlesnake, Sistrurus miliarius barbouri Squirrel tree frog, Hyla squirella Everglades rat snake, Elaphe obsolete rossalleni Yellow rat snake, Elaphe obsolete quadrivittata Green anole, Anolis carolinensis

#### **Temperate Hardwood Forest**

Timber Rattlesnake, *Crotalus horridus*Corn snake, *Elaphe guttata*Green anole, *Anolis carolinensis*Green tree frog, *Hyla cinerea* 

## White Water River Swamp

American alligator, *Alligator mississippiensis*American crocodile, *Crocodylus acutus*Chicken turtle, *Deirochelys reticularia*Red-belly turtle, *Pseudemys nelsoni*Florida cooter, *Pseudemys floridana* 

### **Pine Flatwoods**

Eastern diamondback rattlesnake, *Crotalus adamanteus* Southern toad, *Bufo terrestris* Green tree frog, *Hyla cinerea* 

## **Cypress Swamp**
