Guest Speaker: Lesa Roe



Lesa B. Roe is the Director of the nation's first civilian aeronautical research facility, NASA's Langley Research Center in Hampton, Virginia, which was founded in 1917. She holds a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from the University of Florida at Gainesville and a master's degree in electrical engineering from the University of Central Florida in Orlando. She has held numerous positions in engineering and management from her early days as a Space Shuttle Communications Engineer at Kennedy Space Center, FL, to Director of Research on the International Space Station at Johnson Space Center, TX.

Ms. Roe will discuss the exciting challenges as NASA moves forward from Space Shuttle return to flight and International Space Station completion to embarking on a new mission returning humans to the moon and beyond. Additionally, Ms. Roe will describe NASA's pioneering work in the areas of Space Science and Fundamental Aeronautics. Ms. Roe looks forward to answering questions about NASA and her career.
