## The Bulls on the Radio

A total of 10 UB women's basketball games during the 200405 regular season will be heard on the Bulls' flagship radio station, WLVL-AM 1340. Jim Rosenhaus, long-time UB men's basketball play-by-play announcer and the play-by-play voice for the Buffalo Bisons, will call all the women's action in 200405, with UB Assistant Athletic Director for Communications Paul Vecchio handling the color commentary. In addition to the 10 regular-season games, any Mid-American Conference Tournament games the Bulls play in will also be broadcast on WLVL-AM 1340. In addition, all radio broadcasts of UB women's basketball on WLVL can be heard for free via the internet by going to www.buffalobulls.com/womensbasketball and clicking on the Teamline logo.

## Quick Bits

-Today's game can be heard on WLVL-AM 1340 out of Lockport and on the internet on www.buffalobulls.com on a tape-delayed basis at 5 pm .

- The Bulls have a bit of an inside scoop on the Crusaders thanks to Kim Coon who joined the UB staff as an administrative assistant over the summer after serving as an assistant coach at Patriot League member Colgate for three seasons.
- Buffalo's 107-40 loss to the defending national champion and fourth-ranked Connecticut Huskies in Friday night's season opener is the worst loss the Bulls have endured in their Division I era and the worst in school history since an 80-11 loss at Cortland on December 11, 1978 at the Division III level. The 107 points are the most the Bulls have ever given up in a game in their women's basketball history.
- All six of the Bulls' newcomers saw action in Friday's season-opener at Connecticut, and they combined for 30 of the Bulls' 40 points in the game. Most impressive among the group making their collegiate debuts was freshman Stephanie Bennett who had a team-high 10 points and a team-high five assists in 34 minutes. Freshman Heather Turner scored the Bulls'first bucket in the game and finished with six points and a team-high five rebounds in 12 minutes of action. Sophomore transfer Viorica Badinici, in her first game at the Division I level after transferring from Central Florida Community College, finished with nine points and two blocks.
- Only three players who played in the 2003-04 season opener versus Canisius (Allison Bennett, Talia Merlino and Brooke Meunier) and four players who played in the 2003-04 season finale against Marshall (Bennett,Merlino, Meunier and Belinda Gibb) saw action in this season's opener at Connecticut on Friday night.
- Buffalo has a sister combo that made its debut at Connecticut in Allison and Stephanie Bennett. Allison, a senior, has been a three-year starter for the Bulls, while her younger sister Stephanie suited up for the first game of her collegiate career.
- Senior Allison Bennett made her 57th consecutive start in the Blue and White on Friday night at UConn. Bennett has started every game each of the past two seasons (27 in 2003-04 and 29 in 2002-03). She started 23 of 28 games during her freshman campaign, the first 17 of the season and six of the final 11.
-The Bulls are facing six teams in 2004-05 that advanced to the postseason last year: Connecticut (NCAA), Maine (NCAA), Eastern Michigan (NCAA), Kent State (WNIT), Miami (OH) (WNIT) and Western Michigan (WNIT).
- With six international student-athletes on its roster, the Bulls unofficially have the second-highest number of international players out of all Division I schools, trailing only Florida International which has seven. The information was compiled by the Utah Sports Information Office. Buffalo's roster includes players from Australia (Belinda Gibb), Canada (Dina Atanas, Amy Kucheran), the Czech Republic (Barbora Homolová), Finland (Viorica Badinici) and Mexico (Diana Orozco Gollaz).
-The Bulls'2004-05 roster is down to 11 active players, minus sophomore Dina Atanas, junior Erin Lawrenson and senior Tahcahrah Owens. Atanas will redshirt the 2004-05 season as she is still recovering from off-season surgery on her shins, and Lawrenson has chosen to end her career after battling chronic ankle problems for the past two years. Owens is currently academically ineligible.
-The Bulls next game against Lafayette on Saturday, November 27, originally scheduled to be played at Alumni Arena, will be played at HSBC Arena in Buffalo, NY as part of a tripleheader. The women's game will tip off at 4 pm ,followed by a UB men's basketball game against Indiana State at 6 pm . The final game of the night will be a Canisius-St. Bonaventure men's game at 8 pm .


## The Series

Today's game is only the second meeting of all-time between these two schools. The series began last year with Holy Cross taking a 71-59 decision from the Bulls in Alumni Arena on January 19, 2004. Sarah Placek led the Crusaders with 20 points. Junior Brooke Meunier had 17 points for the Bulls on 7 -of-15 shooting from the floor.

## Scouting the Crusaders

The Crusaders opened the season on Friday night with a 60-48 home victory over Providence. Three player scored in double digits for Holy Cross, led by sophomore Brittany Keil with game highs of 15 points and seven rebounds. Senior Lisa Andrews added 12 points and five rebounds, and junior Shannon Bush chipped in 11 points off the bench. Freshman Laura Aloisi dished a game-high 10 assists in her collegiate debut. The Crusaders shot 44.8 percent from the floor in the game ( 26 -for- 58 ) and outrebounded the Friars by a 31-21 margin while forcing them into 26 turnovers.

Ten-time regular season champion Holy Cross is picked to win the Patriot League's regular season crown once again this season. Three-time AllLeague selection senior Maggie Fontana was a Preseason All-League pick. She led the Crusaders with 14.0 points per game and 6.1 rebounds per game last season. Andrews was a Second Team All-League selection and Keil was an All-Rookie Team honoree in 2003-04.

Head coach Bill Gibbons is in his 20th season at Holy Cross, where he has compiled a 394-172 overall record. He has led the Crusaders to 10 Patriot League regular season titles, nine Patriot League Tournament titles, nine NCAA Tournament appearances, most recently in 2002-03, and one WNIT appearance. He is a six-time Patriot League Coach of the Year honoree.

## The Last Meeting

The University at Buffalo women's basketball team saw a two-game winning streak come to an end, dropping a 71-59 decision to the visiting Holy Cross Crusaders in its final non-conference game of the season in Alumni Arena on January 19, 2004. The Crusaders (7-9 overall) won the game on the glass, outrebounding the Bulls by a 48-27 margin, including 24 offensive boards. The Bulls were led by senior Jessica Kochendorfer, who had a game-high 20 points, five rebounds, four assists and six blocks. Sophomore Brooke Meunier reached double figures for the fourth straight game, finishing with 17 points on 7 -of-15 shooting from the floor, including 3-of-5 from three-point range. With the loss, Buffalo fell to 3-10 overall on the season.

The Crusaders opened the scoring on a jumper by Lisa Andrews, and they never gave up the lead for the remainder of the game. Holy Cross drained seven three-point shots in the first 20 minutes of play, and it led by as many as 12 points on two occasions in the first half. A three-pointer by Meunier and a late jumper by Kochendorfer cut the Crusaders' lead to seven at halftime, 33-26.

Andrews scored Holy Cross' first 10 points in the second half to get the Crusaders out to a 13-point lead, 43-30, with 15:23 left to play. The Bulls later used a 14-7 run to get within six, 53-47, with 5:59 on the clock, but that was as close as Holy Cross would allow. The Crusaders led by as many as 14 points down the stretch of the 12-point victory.

Sarah Placek led Holy Cross with 20 points, five assists and three steals, while Andrews finished with 18 points, 14 in the second half. The Crusaders shot 40.0 percent from the floor (26-for-65) and 29.4 percent from three-point range (10-for-34) in the game.

The Bulls shot 41.8 percent from the floor (23-for-55) in the game, but Kochendorfer and Meunier were the only two players to reach double figures in scoring. Senior Kim Kilpela added eight points, junior Allison Bennett finished with seven and freshman Belinda Gibb added six.
"You can't expect to win games when you give up 24 offensive rebounds," said Buffalo head coach Cheryl Dozier."I thought Jessica and Brooke did a nice job offensively again, which we need, but rebounding really cost us the game. We know that, and now we have to make sure it doesn't happen again from here on out."

## The Last Time Out:

## No. 4 Connecticut Too Much For Bulls

The defending national champion Connecticut Huskies shot 64.2 percent from the floor in the game and scored 58 points in the paint to easily defeat the University at Buffalo women's basketball team, 107-40, in the season opener for both teams on Friday night in a sold-out Gampel Pavilion.

Preseason Naismith Trophy candidate Ann Strother scored seven of her game-high 20 points in the first five minutes of the game to get the Huskies out to a 9-0 lead, much to the delight of the 10,167 fans in attendance. The Bulls then got a spark off the bench from a couple of freshman as Stephanie Bennett dished the ball under the basket to Heather Turner for an easy layup that finally got the Bulls on the board at the 15:59 mark. Turner then grabbed a defensive rebound on the Huskies' next possession, and Bennett knocked down a three-pointer on the other end of the floor to get the Bulls within four, 9-5. Connecticut then embarked on a 19-0 run, and a later 14-0 run helped get the Huskies out to a commanding 51-15 halftime lead.

UConn shot 62.5 percent from the floor in the first half (20-for-32), including 5-for-11 from three-point range ( 45.5 percent), led by 17 points from Strother and 12 points from Charde Houston. Bennett had eight of her team-high 10 points for the Bulls, who shot just 17.2 percent from the floor in the first half (5-for-29).

Connecticut didn't slow down in the second half as it opened with a 20-4 run and shot even better from the floor ( 65.7 percent, 23 -for- 35 ) to run away with the 67 -point victory. The Bulls kept battling, however, and they shot an improved 28.0 percent from the floor in the final 20 minutes of the game ( 7 -for- 25 ).

The Huskies had five players in double figures in scoring and they shot a combined 64.2 percent from the floor (43-for-67) while the Bulls shot 22.2 percent in the game (12-for-54). Connecticut outrebounded the Bulls by a 43-26 margin, led by seven boards from Ashley Battle. UConn scored 27 second-chance points and 33 points off of turnovers.

Bennett had a team-high five assists in addition to her team-high 10 points, and sophomore transfer Viorica Badinici had nine points and two blocks. Turner finished with six points and a team-high five rebounds.
"This was a great opportunity for our basketball program," said Buffalo head coach Cheryl Dozier. "We knew it was going to be a tall task going in, but I told our team that afterward, we'd be able to look at what things we still need to work on. UConn just knocks shots down - that was the most impressive thing to me. I think our future looks bright though. We're young and we had three or four new players out on the floor at a time tonight. We're going to do some good things this year if we just stay our course, and we'll start again at Holy Cross on Sunday."

## The WBCA/Summerville RPI

In the preseason WBCA/Summerville RPI report released on November 3, Buffalo had the 93rd-ranked strength of schedule in Division I, which is the second-highest in the Mid-American Conference (behind 88th Western Michigan). When looking at only nonconference games, the Bulls were ranked 119th, also second highest in the MAC behind Western Michigan (50th).

## Meunier Coming Off Solid Sophomore Campaign

Junior Brooke Meunier had a breakout season in 2003-04, averaging 11.9 points and 5.2 rebounds per game after averaging just 4.4 points and 2.4 boards as a freshman in 2002-03. Meunier was second on the team and 18th in the Mid-American Conference in scoring, and she scored in double figures in a team-high 17 games during the 2003-04 season. Meunier set career highs in seven statistical categories during the year, including points with 23 at Colgate on November 25. She also posted her first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 10 rebounds at Kent State on February 11.

## Dozier Adds Alum to Staff

Over the summer, head coach Cheryl Dozier added one of her former players, Kim Coon, to her staff as an administrative assistant/video coordinator for the 2004-05 season. Coon spent the past three seasons as an assistant coach at Colgate, where she helped lead the Raiders to their first-ever NCAA appearance in 2004 where they lost to eventual national finalist Tennessee in the opening round. Coon was a four-year letterwinner at UB, with her senior season (1998-99) being Dozier's first season with the Bulls. Coon currently ranks 12th on UB's all-time scoring list ( 1,038 career points), second in both career three-point field goals made (140) and career three-point field goals attempted (348), third in career three-point field goal percentage (40.2) and fourth in career free throw percentage (74.3).

## Head Coach Cheryl Dozier

Head coach Cheryl Dozier is in her seventh season at Buffalo with an overall record of 85-84 entering today's game at Holy Cross. She earned her 80th career win on December 3,2003 against Youngstown State (68-58), giving her the second-most wins of all coaches in UB women's basketball history, trailing only Sal Buscaglia who compiled 155 wins in eight seasons with the Bulls (1990-98). Dozier has guided the Bulls to four winning seasons, to two record-setting starts and to national rankings in both offensive and defensive statistical categories during her tenure. Prior to taking over the reins as the 10th head coach in UB women's basketball history, Dozier served as an assistant coach at Michigan State (1993-98), Ohio (1991-93) and Lake Superior State (1989-91). She is a 1989 graduate of Aquinas College where she was a four-year letterwinner.

## 2003-04 Recap

The Bulls struggled through an obstacle-filled 2003-04 season, finally finishing with a 6-21 overall record following a 69-45 first-round MAC Tournament loss at Marshall. The year was largely a tale of two halves, with Buffalo averaging 25.0 points in the first half (676) and 33.6 points in the second half (908) of games. Additionally, Buffalo shot 37.0 percent from the floor in the first half (262-for-708) and 42.4 percent from the floor in the second half (329-for-776) of games in 2003-04. Buffalo's inconsistent offense averaged 58.7 points per game with three players in double figures, while the defense uncharacteristically gave up 72.5 points per game. Highlighting the year was a 65-61 win overToledo on February 3, Buffalo's first-ever win over the Rockets in seven matchups. Senior Jessica Kochendorfer was an All-MAC Honorable Mention selection for the second time in her career after leading the Bulls in both scoring (13.8 points per game, sixth in the MAC) and rebounding (8.5 points per game, fourth in the MAC). Kochendorfer also averaged 2.24 blocks per game, second in the MAC, helping the Bulls to rank second in the conference as a team with 3.96 blocks per game.

The defending national champion Connecticut Huskies shot 64.2 percent from the floor in the game and scored 58 points in the paint to easily defeat the University at Buffalo women's basketball team, 10740, in the season opener for both teams in a sold-out Gampel Pavilion. The Huskies had five players in double figures in scoring, led by preseason Naismith Trophy candidate Ann Strother with 20, including four three-pointers. The Huskies used first-half runs of $19-0$ and $14-0$ to take a $51-15$ halftime lead, and they opened the second half with a 20-4 run en route to the 67-point victory. The Bulls got a spark off the bench from two freshmen in the first half when Stephanie Bennett dished the ball under the basket to Heather Turner for an easy layup for the Bulls' first bucket of the game. Turner then grabbed a defensive rebound and Bennett knocked down a three-pointer to make the score 9-5 just over four minutes into the game. Bennett finished with team highs of 10 points and five assists while Turner grabbed a team-high five rebounds in her collegiate debut.
