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OCTOBER 2008 COMPOSER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM GRANTS ANNOUNCED

\$25,000 Awarded for Support for Production of Performance Materials

NEW YORK – The American Music Center (AMC) is pleased to announce grant awards totaling \$25,000 to 30 composers through the October 2008 round of the Composer Assistance Program (CAP). The awardees are American composers ranging in age from 29 to 70 residing in 10 states and abroad.

AMC awards more than \$100,000 annually to composers to assist in the production of performance materials for premiere performances. This round's ensembles and organizations premiering or featuring public readings of CAP-supported works include: Antares, American Virtuosi Opera Theater, ArcoVoce Ensemble, Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, Cleveland Orchestra, El Paso Symphony Orchestra, JACK Quartet, Minnesota Orchestra, and Zeitgeist. A complete list of awardees and performers is attached.

"Generations of composers have received a small but critical boost from the Composer Assistance Program," said Joanne Hubbard Cossa, Chief Executive Officer of the American Music Center. "AMC's aim is to help composers at a critical point in their career advancement, and the number of artists receiving this direct support and the breadth of the performing ensembles performing the new works vividly demonstrate how vital CAP remains."

Since 1962, the Composer Assistance Program has provided over \$2 million in support to American composers. Over 1,400 composers have received a CAP award at some point in their career, including Gordon Beeferman, Eve Beglarian, David Del Tredici, Gabriela Lena Frank, Anne LeBaron, Steve Reich, and Elliott Sharp. Composers must be members of the American Music Center to apply for an award. The Composer Assistance Program has been endowed by The Helen F. Whitaker Fund and The Aaron Copland Fund for Music. Current funding for CAP is provided by the Mary Flagler Cary Charitable Trust, The Edward T. Cone Foundation and the Reed Foundation. For more information, contact Jennifer Clarke, Grants Manager.

AMC supports the community by making grants to composers and ensembles each year, and by offering professional development programs for artists. AMC connects the community with an array of information services designed to facilitate performances, including the AMC Online Library, a vast, searchable database of 45,000 works by American composers; publications compiling opportunities in new music and other information useful to industry professionals (at Explore American Music at www.amc.net); and benefits and services for nearly 2,500 members in all fifty states and around the world.
