#### New Heights Reached by Class of 2009

Burnt Mill School is once again celebrating excellent GCSE results this year with 65% of Year 11 students achieving 5+ A\*-C grades, even higher than last year's overall results. We are particularly pleased that students have also met the targets set for 5+ A\*-C including English and Maths based on their prior attainment and very good results in English Literature, Maths, Science and ICT with students meeting or exceeding challenging targets.

The three girls, along with Jim McClelland from last year's Year 11, developed their understanding of Mandarin Chinese, visited local museums, Nanjing University and the Olympic stadium! They stayed with Chinese families and so experienced 'real life' in a Chinese household. This once in a lifetime opportunity further cemented the county's strong relationship with Jiangsu province and underlined our commitment as a school to bringing young people from different cultural backgrounds together. Maddie and Emma said: 'The visit was a wonderful experience for all of us and gave us the chance to visit a very exciting area of the world. The fact that we were able to learn alongside young people from across our own county, from different schools and backgrounds, was just as interesting in a way as meeting new friends from thousands of miles away'.

### A Healthy Start To Our New Diploma

This week Burnt Mill began the teaching of the 'Society, Health and Development' Diploma, with students being taught from across the town on our site. To celebrate this new and important step in students' learning journey, they donned newly created uniforms in order to show that they are part of a town wide initiative. Over the course of the months to come staff and students will be working alongside colleagues from Anglia Ruskin University and The Princess Alexandra Hospital, our partners in the development of the programme.

The involvement of these partners stresses how seriously the 'real world' of work and employers takes the diploma as a valuable route for preparing students for adult life. Initial feedback has been very encouraging as students work not only with friends but new people from a different school. This in itself is a very valuable skill to develop.
