Take Interstate 75 South to the Mercer University Drive exit. Take a left on to Mercer University Drive. Take a left on to Stadium Drive which will take you to the North Entrance of Mercer University. Take a right onto Adams Street and the University Center will be at the top of the hill.

Coming From Valdosta, Ga.

Take Interstate 75 North to the Mercer University Drive exit. Take a right on to Mercer University Drive. Take a left on to Stadium Drive which will take you to the North Entrance of Mercer University. Take a right onto Adams Street and the University Center will be at the top of the hill.

Coming From Columbus, Ga.

Stay on Hwy. 80 until it meets Interstate 475. Take Interstate 475 North and take the Thomaston/Macon exit (there will be a sign that says exit for Mercer University Drive). Tony Foti

Head Softball Coach - Fourth Season

Everywhere Tony Foti has been, success has followed. In his first three seasons at Mercer, he has resurrected a struggling program and all indicators point to continued success while he is at the helm of the Bears.

After leading Mercer to its first back-to-back conference tournament appearances since 1994, Foti begins his fourth season as the head coach of the Mercer softball program.

Following a 21-35 record in his head coaching debut in 2002, Foti led the 2003 Bears to the best season in school history as the Bears finished with a 35-23 record. Last year Foti stepped-up the non-conference competition and still finished with a 34-30 record for the season.

In 2003, Foti guided Mercer to its first Atlantic Sun tournament berth since 1997. The Bears finished third in the tournament after falling to eventual champion Florida Atlantic, 5-4.

For his efforts, Foti was named 2003 A-Sun "Coach of the Year."

While some coaches may take pride in winning coaching awards, Foti chooses to take a different approach.

"The award should be 'Staff of the Year' and not 'Coach of the Year'," Foti said. "I was very fortunate to have such a quality staff in Debbie (Sonnenberg) and Sarah (Madden). They made my job so much easier and they deserve to be recognized for the jobs they did."

Though Mercer is Foti's first Division I head coaching job, he has been involved with softball in some capacity for the past 24 years. Prior to arriving at Mercer, he served as an assistant coach at the University of California-Santa Barbara from 1995-2001.

Throughout his career, Foti's coaching has not been confined strictly to the United States. Softball has also taken him all over the world.

The 1995 graduate of LaSalle has coached the game in Italy, Belgium, Australia, New Zealand, Guatemala and most notably, Canada.

Foti got in to the coaching profession in 1980 as a youth softball coach and landed his first collegiate job in 1983 at Red River Community College in Winnipeg, Manitoba of Canada.

Following a brief tenure as a volunteer coach at Jamestown College in North Dakota, Foti had an impressive run from 1987-1995 as a coach with the Canadian National Women's and Junior Girls' Teams.

During this time, he coached in the 1989 Junior Girls' World Championships, 1994 World Championships, the 1994 Pan-Am Games, the 1995 Junior Girls' World Championships, the 1995 Pan Pacific Cup and he was an alternate coach at the 1996 Olympic Games.

He also coached in the Canada Cup for four consecutive seasons from 1992-1995.

From 1987-1991, he served as the Manitoba Provincial Softball Team coach. He also helped guide a women's open team to four consecutive Canadian National Championships from 1993-1996.

For his efforts as coach of those national championship teams, Foti was inducted into the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame in October of 2004.

Tony and his wife Mindy have two children; daughter Devyn (15) and son Dayne (12).

Assistant Coach - First Season

Kristin Siget begins her first season as an assistant coach for the Mercer softball program.

Siget, a former Division II All-America honoree, comes to Mercer from California University of Pennsylvania where she was a standout shortstop.

She left California owning numerous school records including single-season RBIs, on base percentage and walks. Siget is also the career leader at California for home runs, RBIs and is third all-time in both career slugging percentage and career total bases.

Siget's successful college career led to an invite to participate in the 2002 USA Olympic fall training camp in Chula Vista, Ca. As a

participant she got the opportunity to play with the top 50 softball players in the country as they battled for a spot on the 2004 Olympic Team. During her time at the camp, she was instructed by Olympic gold medalist Dot Richardson and USA head coach Mike Candrea.

As a coach, Siget has experience working with young players in various developmental camps in both the United States and Canada. She was a camp coach and instructor at the Nike softball camp, Brampton softball camp and the California University camp. As an instructor, she worked with young people teaching the fundamentals of hitting, fielding and strategies of the game.

"Kristin will be a great addition to our program," said Mercer head coach Tony Foti. "She brings a lot of energy and knowledge to the team and the players will respond to that."



Debbie Sonnenberg

Assistant Coach - Third Season

Debbie Sonnenberg begins her third season as an assistant to Tony Foti, but the two go back much further.

Foti coached the 1996 Olympian for several years and the two won four Canadian National Championships together and competed at the World Pan-Am Championships and the 1996 Olympics. In honor of her achievements as a player, Sonnenberg was inducted into the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame in October of 2004.

Sonnenberg's primary responsibilities are working with the pitchers and catchers.

Before arriving at Mercer, Sonnenberg spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Kennesaw State.

She guided that pitching staff to four consecutive appearances in

the NCAA Division II National Tournament, including a National Championship in 1998.

Prior to Kennesaw, she was an assistant for the first three years in the history of the Auburn softball program.

Her other coaching stints include Delta State in Mississippi and Burnside High School in New Zealand.

Sonnenberg had a stellar playing career. She was a four-time NAIA All-America honoree at Huntingdon College and still holds the NAIA record for most wins and strikeouts for a season and a career.

A product of Leduc, Alberta, she was a six-time All-Canadian performer and pitched back-to-back perfect games en route to the 1994 National Championship. Most recently, she won a silver medal at the 2001 Canadian Nationals.

"Debbie is really like my right-hand woman," Foti said. "She has such compassion for our players and her pitching expertise is unmatched. Her past softball experiences bring such credibility to our program."



2005 Preview

Many programs would be satisfied with the accomplishments of the 2004 Mercer softball team. Mercer finished their conference schedule with a 12-8 mark and qualified for the conference tournament for the second consecutive season and for only the seventh time in school history.

While head coach Tony Foti is pleased with what his teams have been able to accomplish in his short time at Mercer, he is far from satisfied.

"Every year your primary goal has got to be to improve on previous years," said Foti. "This year we have some new and different challenges and we want to meet those challenges head-on and strive to reach new levels of success."

In order for the 2005 season to be a success for the Mercer program, the squad will have to blend veteran leadership with young and inexperienced talent.

Of the 16 girls on the 2005 roster, 11 are underclassmen. However, Foti does not look at his youth as a hindrance, but a strength of this year's team.

"I am very excited to get this season started because I truly believe that this is the best team that we've had here at Mercer," Foti said. "With this last recruiting class, we have improved our speed, power and depth at nearly every position. And since we have such a young, talented group of players returning from last year's team, we have the luxury of allowing these freshmen a smoother transition into college ball rather than just throwing them into the line of fire."

Since Foti has been the head man at Mercer, he has stepped up the level of non-conference competition considerably. That tradition will be continued in 2005. The Bears will play at least 20 games against schools that advanced to their regional tournaments in 2004 or are traditionally known for being collegiate softball powers.

Mercer's non-conference slate will pit them against the likes of Florida International, Tennessee, Illinois-Chicago, Southern Miss, Purdue, Georgia Tech, Winthrop and Georgia.

On top of that, the Bears play in the Atlantic Sun, one of the premier conferences in all of college softball with a number of successful programs such as Florida Atlantic, UCF, Stetson and Troy.

"This is going to be the toughest schedule

that a Mercer team has ever played," said Foti. "I've always believed that the only way to get better is to play the best competition. That's what we are going to do this year."

Infield

The leader of the 2005 infield unit is without question two-time all-conference performer Meghan Clark. Clark found out in June that a new NCAA rule would allow her a fifth year of eligibility because of a misdiagnosed injury during her freshman year at Florida Community College. Foti knows how much of an asset Clark will be to this young team and how much better his offense will be with



her in the clean-up spot.

"Meghan is the anchor of our lineup and gives us that big power threat that we need," Foti said. "She is very disciplined in her approach to the game, and her skill changes the way that teams approach facing not only her, but our entire lineup."

If Clark is asked to be the designated player, then Foti will look to Jamie Madruga to fill in at first base. Madruga has impressed the coaches during fall practice and will see the field regularly once the season starts.

At second base, freshman Gigi Eykamp will be the starter to open the season.

"Gigi is a very athletic player that will give our offense and defense an added dimension," said Foti. "She has tremendous quickness and her ability to bunt and steal will be an asset to this team."

When called upon, C.J. Martin will also see time at second base for the Bears.

Entering the 2004 season, the shortstop position was an area of concern for Foti, but that certainly is not the case this year. Returning is A-Sun All-Freshman team member Kelley Bretscher who played every inning of the 2004 season at shortstop for Mercer.

"Kelley is the heart and soul of this year's team," Foti said. "In my opinion, she is the best shortstop in the Atlantic Sun."

Third base duties will be handled by another new face, freshman Ashley Anderson. Anderson has impressed coaches with her maturity and ability to handle the transition from high school to college ball.

"Ashley is another player that has great athleticism," said Foti. "She has a strong arm and good speed that will help our lineup."

Junior Amanda Cosson will see playing time at third base, as well as at first and second.

Foti has a pair of sophomores that will handle catching duties for the Bears in 2005. A-Sun All-Freshman team member Kristin Talamantes returns as well as C.J. Martin.

"Kristin and C.J. are both very good players that help this team in different ways," Foti said. "Kristin has emerged as a team leader and handles all of our pitchers very well. C.J. had a solid freshman year and really came on strong at the end of 2004. She has come back this year stronger and we are looking for big things from her."

Outfield

The outfield will be captained by all-conference performer Kerri Ryskamp. Ryskamp enters 2005 as the starter in left field after a "dream season" in 2004.

"Kerri is a big-time Division I college player," said Foti. "She has the ability to hit the ball hard, but she also hits for average. She's a complete player that's one of the best in the conference."

Also expected to see time in left field this season is freshman Crystal Condra. Condra is a speedy player that plays great defense and is working on improving her offensive game.

Sophomore Tiffany Abbott will be the Bears' starter in center field after making the move from right field in the off-season. Foti has been impressed by Abbott's approach to the game following her freshman campaign.

"Tiffany came back this year with a renewed motivation," said Foti. "She is in great shape and her speed and left handed bat will be a valuable asset to this team."

Earning the starting job in right field will be junior college transfer Sarah Harding. Harding was recognized as an all-region performer at Midland Junior College.

"If you look at what Sarah has been able to accomplish at one of the best junior colleges in the country, it's pretty impressive," said the Mercer coach. "She has great power numbers and plays sound, fundamental defense. She is an impact player that we expect to do big things in a Mercer uniform."



Pitching

The pitching staff was undeniably the strength of the 2004 squad. As good as the hurlers were a season ago, Foti believes that this year's unit will be even better.

Returning is ace pitcher Katie Rosentreter. Rosentreter finished 2004 second in the A-Sun in ERA (1.19), third in strikeouts (215) and third in wins (21). Her K/BB ratio of 8.6 led the conference. Rosentreter's exploits led to a list of postseason accolades. She was selected as a first team all-conference performer, named to the A-Sun all-tournament team, selected A-Sun Pitcher of the Week on three occasions and was invited to play for Team Canada in the World University Softball Championship.

"Katie had a phenomenal season a year ago," said Foti. "This may sound scary, but she's even better this year. She has faced some of the top competition in the world in the last year, and those opportunities have increased her confidence level and her control of the game."

The remainder of the rotation will be made up of newcomers. Junior college transfer Jenny Holland and freshman Meredith Weare will see time in the circle on a regular basis for the Bears.

Holland, a sophomore from Bethlehem, Ga., is a hard thrower that is far from being just a power pitcher.

"Jenny can dominate hitters with her power but she also has great movement on her pitches and throws off-speed as well," Foti said. "I think her having a year of junior college experience will really help her at this level."

Weare will round out the pitching staff and give Mercer another option to throw at their opponents.

"Meredith is a hard thrower that can throw in the mid-60s," said Foti. "She will be a great pitcher for us."

Outlook

When talking with coach Foti about his 2005 squad, he is confident that this can be the best team that he has coached since he has been at Mercer.

"This is a very exciting group of girls that have the potential to do great things," said the coach. "We've had talented individual players here in the past, but this is the best collective group that I've ever coached. We are faster, more powerful, better defensively and have more depth than in any other year that I've been here."

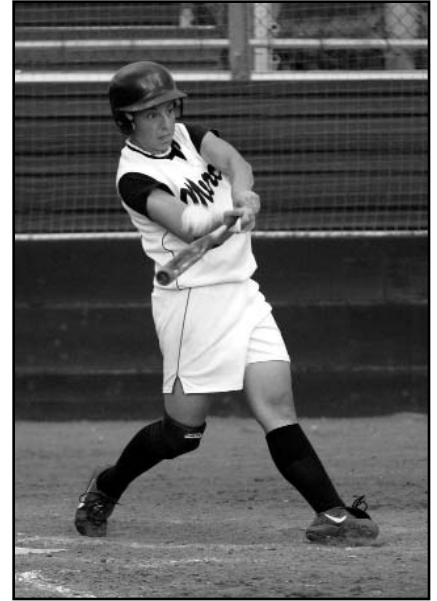

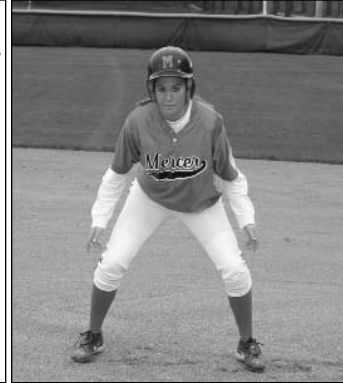

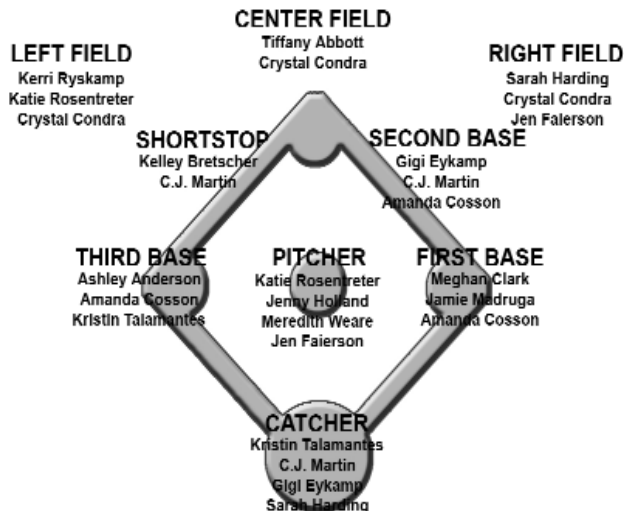
